## Idaho's Jeff D. lawsuit revived

when a little boy known only as Jeff D. brought a class-action lawsuit against the state for institutionalizing mentally ill children instead of providing care for them.
Jeff D. won, and severa years ago the court settled on

## Idaho's system of choosing school trustees isn't working

Amid great fanfare, the last Legislature consolidated Idaho elections and limit ed voting to four dates each year.
The current Legislature needs to The current Legislature needs to make This month, Idahoans went to the polls to choose school trustees and, in 36 districts, to vote on supplemental levy requests. Statewide, turnout was less than 20 percent; in Pocatello's District 25 , it was
l percent, despite a contested trustee race on the l percent, despite a contested trustee race on the
ballot.
And in the 1,114-student Gooding School District only 31 voters went to the polls.

Something has to change about how Idaho picks school boards.
For starters, the Legislature should scrap the re-

sen from each zone can only be elected by residents of that zone. There isn't one Idahoan in 10,000 who knows in which school zone he or she lives, where to vote or even if there's an election in a given year (by state law, uncontested school board elections are canceled). The present system discourages not only voters but to challenge an incumbent school trustee? That's hard if you can't even vote against him or her.
There's no reason why school board members couldn't be chosen by allthe voters in the school district, just as county commissioners - who must live in the district they repre sent - are elected by all voters in the county. Secondly, school board elections shouldn't be held in May of odd-numbered years. They could be consolidated either with city elections staged in November of odd-numbered years or paired with the May primary elections held in even-numbered years.
With the Legislature cutting state support for public schools, the balance of responsibility for edu cation in Idaho is shifting back to local districts. This year, 65 of the state's districts asked patrons to approve supplemental levies, and voters said yes in more than four-fifths of them.
Idaho needs the best and the brightest serving on our school boards - and an electorate engaged and informed enough to put them there

## Five myths about fixing schools

T
 vear andide leayof fis of tens of thousands of teachers are bringing
more attention to reforme calls to remake public schools. Today's school re-
form movement conflates form movement conflates
the motivations and agendas the motivations and agenda
of politicians seeking reof politicians seeking re-
election, religious figures election, religious figures
looking to spread the faith looking to spread the faith
and bureaucrats trying to and bureaucrats trying
save a dime. Despite an of-
ten earnest desire to help save earnest desire to help
our nation's children, reformers have spread some fundamental misunderstandings about public education.

1. Our schools are failing.
It's true that schools with large numbers of low-income and English-as-a-second-language students
don't performan don't perform as well as those with lots of middle-
and upper-middle-class and upper-middle-class
students who speak only students who speak only
English. But the demoniza tion of some schools as "dropout factories" masks an important achievement: The percentage of Americans earning a high school diploma has been rising for 30 years. According to the the percentage of 16 - to 24 year-olds who were not enrolled in school and hadn't earned a diploma or its equivalent fell to 8 percent in 2008.
Average SAT and ACT scores are also up. On inter-
national exams such as th Trends in International Mathematics and Science Study, U.S. elementary and middle school students have improved since 199 and rank near the top tries. months of my life the never be returned You will have to be held responsible for those actions, whether it's in this life or the next, and I hope you are ready for when that time comes." was declared mentally ill and was declared mentally ill and

court. A federal jury in December unanimously convicted the 57 -year-old of kidnapping and unlawful transportation of a minor across state lines for sex.

## How the shepherd's club constellation went to the dogs

R
oughly half the con-
stellations trace the tellations trace the
roots to the Greek astronomer Ptolemy's great ten in the second century. Most of the rest were invented in the 17th and 18 th century to fill in the spaces left blank by the ancients. One, however, owes exs very existence to
translations.
Follow the curve of the Big Dipper's handle to the bright orange star Arcturus at the feet of Boötes the Shepherd. Ptolemy described Boötes as wielding a club (Greek: "kolloro-
bos"), but when the ninth century Baghdad translator Hunayn ibn Ishaq found himself at a loss to understand the word, he chose a similar-looking Arabic phrase "al asa dhat al-kullab"" "the spear shaft with
a hook"). For a shepherd, a shaft with a hook at the end is a plausible substitute for a club.
During the Dark Ages, the Almagest was lost in Europe, and only reap-
peared when the Arabic peared when the Arabic into Latin in the 12th century. Among the Latin translators was Gerard of Cremona, Italy, whomisread Ishaq's "kullab" as "kilab" (Arabic for "dogs" thus rendering Ishaq's "spear shaft having dogs." And with that, Boötes gained two canine companions. In the 16th century, when star atlases began to transi-

skunks around my kunks around my them away?" Answer: Spring is the time when many wild animals begin looking for places to make their summer home, find easy foraging for food, and raise their young. Warm temperature
also mean people start spending more time outspendin
doors.
Now is the time you should do a thorough evaluation of your property for things that attract nuisance garbage or refuse pet food, and bird feeders should be cleaned up and put away for the summer. Holes in foundations of buildings or in the skirting of trailers are inviting places for wild anima to take up residence. Now is also the time to repair woodpecker up other inviting openings in your eaves for squirrels, starlings and bats. Homeowners must also be vigilant to prevent swallows from packing mud into the eaves of a house. Con-
tinuous removal of the mud and providing an alternate nesting site usually results in the swallows moving to the alternate. For plans for an alternate nest area for swallows, contact your local Idaho Fisce. Most wild animals

June 16,2008 . One of the grandparents' neighbors, Brian Burner, testified that Anthony asked him two days later if she could borrow a shovel to "dig up a bamboo root." She re-
turned the shovel about an hour later, he said. Burner also said he remembered seeing Anthony's white car backed into the garage on the night of June 16
About a month before that, Anthony met Tony
Lazzaro during a party They soon became romantically involved and she moved into an apartment he was sharing with four other people. Lazzaro and his ex-
roommates testified that roommates testified that
they met Anthony's they met Anthony's
daughter several times and then at some point in early June, they never saw her again.
When they asked about Caylee, her mother told nanny at a theme park or going to the beach. Lazzaro and the room mates said Anthony's demeanor never suggested anything was wrong. She would cook, clean and help out around the apartment, they said. year-old girl,' said Cameron Campana, a club promoter who was college student at the time. "Peppy. She seemed normal."
