Idaho Death RowInmateto Be Executed Tuesday

BOISE • More than a quarter century after Danette Elg's mutilated body was found on a punctured waterbed in her bedroom, her family still declines to publicly talk about her and what happened.
The southeastern Idaho woman was a licensed private pillot who loved
the outdoors, fishing and hang-gliding. At the time of her death, she had been the only female to graduate from the Idaho State Aeronautical School, according to her obituary. Her convicted killer, Richard Leav-
itt, 53 , is scheduled to be put to death itt, 53 , is scheduled to be put to death
by lethal injection June 12 , barring any last-minute court intervention. In the days before the scheduled execution, Elg's family kept their grief private. She was raised by her mother, Thelma, who died in 2006 and her stepfather, Richard Bross, who currently resides in Boise. Bross
declined comment and other relatives didn't return phones calls from The Associated Pres
Leavitt's immediate family, including his parents and son, still reside in the small southeastern Idaho town of Blackfoot, where Elg was murdered.

## T.F.Council, URA Both Plan to Discuss Parking

TWIN FALLS • Parking is on the minds of Twin Falls decision makers. Today, the Urban Renewal Agency considers the future of a former cityowned parking lot, located at Third Street and Gooding Avenue. Later in
the evening, the Twin Falls City Council will reconsider adopting proposals from the 2011 parking commission.
The parking commission formed last year to discuss potential solutions to downtown.
One of their recommendations: If the city disposes of any parking lots
downtown, they should replace that lost parking.
But when the city council approved sale of the parking lot at Third Street and Gooding to the URA, it made no moves to replace that parking, raising objections from Sarah
Taylor, parking commission particiTaylor, parking commission partici-
pant and co-owner of the Historic Ballroom in downtown Twin Falls. At a May 29 council meeting, Taylor testified that she was "extremely disheartened" to hear about the city's plans to shed more parking spaces, adding that her business had submitted proposals to use the park-
ing lot for their customers. Taylor may soon have chance at use of the parking lot. If the URA approves the $\$ 57,800$ purchase of the parking lot, URA Executive Director Melinda Anderson will work with the board to develop a request for proposals on utilizing the property.
The agency will look at how appli-

The closest anyone come to describing Swisher in a single senence may be this, from a 1979 profile of him in the Lewiston Tribune upon paper: ator, gardener publisher guru, crusader, advisor to the mighty and the molested, critic, bard, counselor wondrous, adminispundit laureate and consummate pain in the posterior - to place the adjective 'former' in front of those titles is not to know the man - Perry Swisher has been handing down ever since he presided over his Owyhee County birth 55 years ago." He was 88 when he died, and the description still fit. And still leaves out so much.
Swisher made his mark
at Pocatello, as a reporter, political activist and candidate (not mutually exclusive then). He became a businessman, running a bookstore and a weekly newspaper. That paper, the Intermountain, cov reditics, with other sub politics, with other subnearly all of it for more than a decade. His range was tremendous, from detailed commentary on government to "Madame
Fifi", an Ann Landers parody. (Great reading parouy. (Great reading even now.) The only business he ran that made money, he once said, was a restaurant - nicely located across the street from a movie theatre, tohaust was directed. But his sense of public service was strong enough that he won legislative office regularly as a Republican in Democratic Bannock County. In
1966, after more than two decades of intense political and governmental work, he threw away his livelihood and his stand-

ing in his political party to mount a hopeless run

In C pheavy ado, the fire sent up heavy smoke, obscuring the sun and creating an eerie, orange dusk in the middle of the day. The smell of smoke drifted into the Denver area and smoke spread as far away Kansas and Texas. The latest New Mexico fire is smaller than the Whitewa-ter-Baldy fire - the largest in the state's history - but it's
more concerning to authori-
ties because it started closer to homes, said Dan Ware, a spokesman for the New Mexico State Forestry Division. He said the number of Ruidoso evacuees was in the hundreds, but he didn't have an exact figure.
Gladden said preliminary evacuations could be issued
for some areas closer to town for some areas close
due to wind shifts.
Kue to wind Takai, a
woman for the Ruidoso fire crews, said smoke is heavily impactingthe community of Capitan, about 5 miles to the northeast. She said Capitan
and others could also face and others

"Any communities around this fire have the potential of being evacuated,' she said. "If I lived in Capitan, I definitely would be prepared.
Don't wait until the sheriff's
ffice comes knocking at your door and tells you to evacuate."
Elsewhere Sunday, firefighters were battling a wildfire that blackened 6 square miles in Wyoming's Guernsey state Park and forced the evacuation of between 500 and 1,000 campers and visitors. Cooler weather was
helping firefighters in their battle against two other wildfires in southern Utah. In Colorado, authorities sent nearly 1,800 evacuation notices to phone numbers but it wasn't clear how many
residents had toleave. About residents had to leave. About
500 people had checked in at Red Cross shelters. Larimer Red Cross shelters. Larimer
County Sheriff Justin Smith said there was an unconfirmed report of a person unaccounted for, but he wouldn't elaborate.

Accordingly, you come to a Vulnerable: Neither Accordingly, you come to a Dealer: East top in spades. When West leads the club queen, you ruff, then cash the spade ace, getting news of the 4-0 break.

With three possible diamond losers, you cannot afford to play ace and another diamond or a 4-1 break onside would doom you immediately. So you cross to the spade jack and finesse the diamond queen, the best safety play against a 4-1 diamond break. If the finesse holds, you'd draw trump and play on diamonds for 10 or 11 tricks.
When the finesse loses, you ruff the next club and play the diamond ace, crossing your fingers. When both opponents follow suit, you can play a third diamond. West wins and plays a third club, but now you discard the heart four. If the defenders lead a fourth round of clubs, then dummy's spade six would still be in place to take care of the ruff, and the hearts would provide the entry back to hand to draw the rest of the trumps

If West exits with a heart, you can simply draw trumps and claim the rest.
