TWIN FALLS • Erica De La Rosa is in court nearly every day, but she never speaks for herself.
"We're not supposed to exist," she said. De La Rosa is a court certified Spanish inter preter for Twin Falls County 5 th District Court. don't give legal advice or even oxplain to defendants possible outcomes in their case.
"You say what they say", she said, no matter how shocking or strange it might be.
Ioall people requires that courts ensure acces lish proficiency or those who are deaf or hard of-hearing. The courts meet these requirements by developing programs that improve the quality of interpretation and increase the number of qualified interpreters in the courts,
according to the Idaho Supreme Court according to the Idaho Supreme Court
website.
Interp and accurately translate what is said in court to the best of their ability, said Mary Jo Palma, the coordinator for translators in Twin Falls County, and a certified Spanish interpreter.

"If an interpreter becomes aware they've made a mistake they're under obligation to correct it," Palma said. "If an interpreter is challenged, the judge will rule accordingly", One case where an interpreter was quescourt in Twin Falls County.

Video Shows Success of Idaho Wildlife Underpass

To reduce collisions between To reduce colisions
wildlife and vehicles, officials created a passage under Idaho 21 - Idaho's first wildlife underpass.

BOISE • An average of 2,600 vehicles travel to and from the Boise area on Idaho 21 each day.
Anestimated 90 percent of a herd of 5,000 to 8,000 mule deer and aherd of 300 to 1,800 elk cross the highway each fall, when they come down from
the mountains to the Boise Front and the mountains to the
the Lucky Peak area.
Some deer dart across the highway, dodging traffic. Others linger on and near theroad.
Ed Bottum, a wildlife habitat biologist who has worked for Idaho Fish and Game for 25 years, recalled seeing a
huge amount of blood on the highway huge amount of blood on the highway
after a crash a couple of years ago. It was the result of a motorcycle colliding with a deer - the pregnant doe was split in half. The motorcyclist spent the night at a Boise hospital but didn't suffer any life-threatening injuries. "I found little pieces of that motorcycle 100 feet away", said Bottum, who
urges motorists to slow down and drive cautiously when the deer are migrating, generally October through April. To reduce such collisions, Fish and Game biologists worked with Idaho Transportation Department officials to create a safe passage under the

BOISE (AP) • Idaho ranks to 38th by that measure second-worst in the nation for the amount of money it spends per pupil, the Census Bureau said.
Information from the shows the state ranked only head of Utah. It's the second consecutive year the

"Funding is a factor in "Funding is a factor in
education but it's not the education but it's not the
most important factor,' daho State Department of Education spokeswoman
Melissa McGrath told The Spokesman-Review. "And it is not the factor that determines the quality of an education system."
The U.S. Department of Education's National Assessment of Educational Progress said Idaho eighthgraders scored above average in reading, math and science in 2011 . "In Idaho, our state spends less per student states, but our students continually outperform students across the United States in reading, math and in science," McGrath said.
"It's clear that Idaho is do"It's clear that Idaho is doing well spending its re-
sources effectively and effisources effectively and efficiently to
students."
States are also ranked for school spending per $\$ 1,000$ in per-capita income for
each state, with Idaho imeach state, with Idaho im-
proving slightly from 41st
to 38 th by that measure.
Idaho peaked in 2001 at Idaho p
17th.
Mike Mike Ferguson, Idaho's ormer chief state economist who served under five the head of the Idaho Center for Fiscal Policy, said the numbers parallel a reporthe released in April that found the amount of Idaho's personal income that goes to schools dropped 23 percent
between 2000 to 2013 . "The fact is that we' been essentially disinvesting in children,' Ferguson said, noting Idaho has very low personal income compared to other states to begin with.
"We've always been on
the low end of the scale" in per-pupil spending, he per-pupil spending, he
said. "It's just that we're basically, in these relative terms, getting even worse compared to what we have been able to muster previously",

The Census numbers also show that Idaho in
2009-2010 received 20.4 percent of its school funding from the federal government, the third highest of the states. "That's the first year we did receive (federal) stimu-
lus funding - that could definitely be the cause of it," McGrath said. "School districts this year are struggling because that one-

## BLMWild-horse Roundup to Resume

RENO, Nev. • The U.S. Bureau of LandManagementresumed the roundup of wild
horses about 150 miles northeast of Reno on Sunday, nearly two weeks after a federal judge temporarily halted it due to foaling season. With the end of foaling season Saturday, BLM officials
said, they began removing said, they began removing
about 200 horses from the northern portion of the Jackson Mountains Herd Management Area.
U.S. District Judge Howard McKibben on June 20 granted part of a temporary restraining order sought by horse pro-
tection advocates who say the tection advocates who say the
BLM's own rules prohibit helicopter roundups during foaling season.

He allowed the roundup to
continuein the southernportion of the Jackson Mountains because BLM had proven an
emergency due to drought emergency due to drought.
An emergency roundup there Anemergency roundup there 22 with the removal of 424 horses.
But he said that emergency didn't stretch to the northern half of the target area covering
a total of more than 400 a total of more than 400
square miles east of the Black square miles east of the Black Rock Desert. He said no heli-
copters could be used there at least until foaling seasonended Saturday.

"We put them down in the field at the trap site or tempoadding another three horse died after being transported to the Palomino Valley facility. Anne Novak, executive director of California-based Protect Mustangs, said the
animals probably would be alive today had they not been roundedup.
Curiously, these wild horses were surviving on the range and only died at the hands of the BLM after being captured," she said. "We want

Republicans say they be lieve last week's ruling by the high court gives them Obama - and the Democrats who support him the upcoming election because of the health care bill's connection to jobs. The GOP says the law puts onerous mandates on industry that could stifle job creation.

House Minority Leader Nancy Pelosi said Sunday that Republicans, including Mitt Romney, are "being
the mouthpiece of the the mouthpiece of the
health care industry" and that the bill will actually improve the economy. "The costs were unsustainable,"' she said of the current health care system. "It's a competitiveness issue for business and for our economy. So we had to

Connell said he would support using budget reconcilport using budget reconcil-

## Veterans Respond to Court Overturning Lying Law

FAYETTEVILLE, NC. $\cdot$ Jack Jacobs can proudly - and
truthfully - say he was awarded the Medal of Hone for his valor in Vietnam. After ing, anyone else is free under the First Amendment to make the same claim, whether it's true or not.
Some military veterans say they consider the ruling a slap in the face. For Jacobs, though,
it was the right decision. He said he wore the uniform to said ne wore the units - even

"I'm a free speech guy," he
said. The high court ruled 6-3 on Thursday to toss out the con viction of Xavier Alvarez, who lied about being a decorated military veteran. He had been charged under the 2006 Stolen Valor Act, which made it a crime to lie about receiving the Medal of Honor and other prestigious military recogni-
tions. The decision invalidated the law, as the justices ruled Alvarez's fabricated story was constitutionally protected speech.
For 87-year-old Mure Winans, lies about service can cause real harm and lead neo ple to doubt the veracity of actually served during wartime. He said he didn't buy the free speech argument. "You feel like you never earned it, because when yo ell someone what you'v done, they'll say, 'you're lying just ike those other guys,' said himself as a "fresh young hillbilly from West Virginia" when he landed on Normandy' Omaha Beach on June 6, 194 - his 19th birthday.

The law was inspired by the B.G." Jug" Burkett, a Vietnam veteran. The government had argued the law was a needed tool to protect the integrity of military medals. Police officials say they are having success with a computer algorithm model that helps determine where to send officers to prevent or possibily interrupt a crime, which may serve as a model for other cash-strapped law enforcement agencies.

## THE ACES ON BRIDGE <br> Bobby Wolff

The European Championships, which take place every year, just wrapped up last week in Dublin. The championships run on an al-ternate-year cycle, and the events that have just finished decided who will get to represent Europe in next year's world championships. However, last year's events were open to everyone, and players from all over the world participated.

England's Gunnar Hallberg is a Swedish expatriate who has won two world titles since moving 20 years or so ago. He participated in the senior events with a Swedish partner of his from a few decades ago, Hans Gothe, and was full of praise for the defense his partner had encountered in today's deal.

Against Gothe's contract of three no-trump, Wlodzimierz Ilnicki led the club three, and partner Stefan Cabaj smoothly inserted the jack.
When Gothe took the trick, the contract could no longer be made. Declarer had six diamonds, one club and one heart, but when South crossed to the diamond 10 to lead a spade toward his king, Cabaj went up with the ace and ran the club suit.

In the other room, three norump made nine tricks on a spade lead. But note that if East wins the club ace at the first trick and continues with the jack, declarer can duck and needs simply to guess the spades to make his game. Of course, in a perfect world, jack at the first trick - far easier with all four hands on view!
