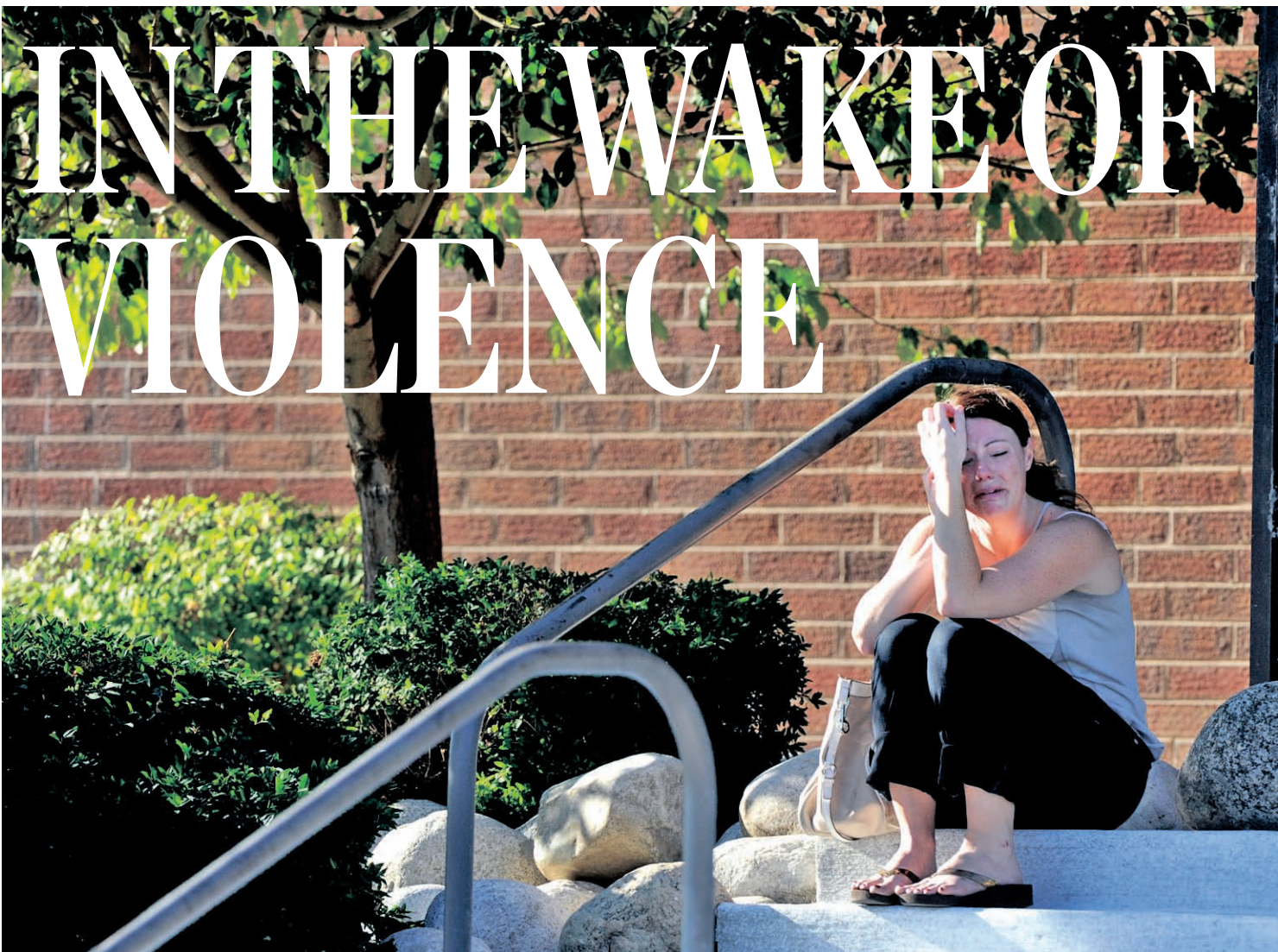

IN THE WAKE OF VIOLENCE

Security is increased at movie theaters following the deadly shooting in Colorado that left at least 12 people dead and 58 wounded — 11 critically — in one of the deadliest mass shootings in U.S. history.

New York police posted officers at dozens of theaters around the city. Ticket-takers at a multiplex in Washington searched moviegoers' bags and purses. And one of the nation's biggest theater chains barred patrons from wearing masks or costumes.

Security was stepped up in places around the U.S. during showings of the new Batman movie Friday after the massacre in Colorado where at least 12 people were killed and 58 wounded — 11 critically — in one of the deadliest mass shootings in recent U.S. history. And while some people said they were afraid to go to the movies in the wake of the shooting rampage, many others were undeterred by the tragedy and eager to see "The Dark Knight Rises."

Jimmy Baker, 40, waited outside the AMC theater in New York's Time Square for almost three hours to see an early matinee, as a police cruiser sat nearby. "I just felt bad for the people that had to be traumatized by this entire event," he said. But "I didn't feel like it had any kind of effect on me. ... I'm just here to enjoy a good movie."

Key Questions About the Shooting

Here's a guide to some key questions in the wake of the mass shooting at a Colorado movie theater during a showing of "The Dark Knight Rises?"

Q: WHAT HAPPENED?

A: Shortly after midnight Friday, a gunman wearing a gas

mask and black SWAT gear set off a gas canister and then opened fire inside a crowded theater in the Denver suburb of Aurora, Colo., killing 12 people and wounding nearly 60 others, authorities said. The suspect was

arrested near a car behind the theater and identified as 24-year-old James Holmes.

Area Pastors Plan Prayers, Sermons in Remembrance of Colorado Shooting

TWIN FALLS • Around the Magic Valley, some pastors plan to incorporate moments of prayer and remembrance into Sunday church services following Friday's shooting in Colorado.

Phil Price, pastor at First Presbyterian Church in Twin Falls, said he plans to talk about the tragedy in his sermon.

Price's sermon will focus on Paul's letter to the Ephesians about "what peace means for us as Christians."

"It kind of goes along with my message already," he said, and will touch on how Christians should react to horrific events.

Price said Christians can be angry and upset about what happened, but "we are to continue to live our faith as people who trust in peace that Jesus shows us."

At Amazing Grace Fellowship in Twin Falls, associate pastor Rex Barker said the Colorado incident will be remembered through a time of prayer during Sunday services.

Twin Falls Man Claims Self-Defense

Police wrap up their investigation into a Hoops Street shotgun shooting that left a man injured.

TWIN FALLS • The man whom police say shot 27-year-old Joseph Cossette early Monday says he did so in self-defense.

Twin Falls police detectives will wrap up their investigation of a shooting on Hoops Street early Monday morning, Capt. Matt Hicks said.

Hicks said self-defense may be considered as a factor in the case. The detectives will soon approach city and county prosecutors to discuss whether charges are appropriate, he said.

Joseph Cossette was injured after being shot with a shotgun slug while outside a home in the 1000 block of Hoops Street. It wasn't clear Friday evening if Cossette was still hospitalized; a St. Luke's Magic Valley Medical Center spokeswoman could not be reached for comment and hospital staff would not speak otherwise.

Where Best to Recharge the Aquifer?

BURLEY • The best way to recharge Idaho's Lake Erie-sized aquifer begins with stopping all efforts on its northern stretch, argues one state water official.

Idaho pushed to improve the rapidly depleting Eastern Snake Plain Aquifer for much of the last decade. Many are concerned more water is being pulled

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CSI shows interest in Pristine Springs

BURLEY • Pristine Springs' unique geothermal resource has captured the attention of the College of Southern Idaho.

The fish farm operation north of Twin Falls — known in recent years for its key role in a game-changing water rights sale — has a geothermal well with a water flow of 4.5 cubic feet per second. It's an artesian well, meaning pressure pushes the water up from underground through

porous rock and doesn't require the use of a pump.

With several programs focused on power generation, CSI is interested in exploring if it should expand to a facility with such a rare well, said college President Jerry Beck.

"Pristine Springs is of interest to us," Beck said, while speaking in front of the Idaho Water Resource Board on Friday in Burley. "It has very good opportunities for an education program. We would like to explore those options."

Currently, the water board owns the facility. The board

took over the facility in 2008 as part of a \$26 million deal with the city of Twin Falls and the North Snake and Magic Valley ground water districts. The purchase was designed to address a series of water conflicts between the region's users of spring water and groundwater, as well as to ensure Twin Falls had a large enough supply of fresh water for future growth.

SeaPac of Idaho leases the property but has expressed interest in renegotiating its rental agreement, said Jeff Raybould, a water board

member. The board received close to \$300,000 in rental income since taking over Pristine Springs.

Beck didn't mention if CSI's interest requires the college to purchase part of the facility or develop some sort of partnership with the water board. However, both the board and Beck agreed they wanted to pursue the issue.

"Our campus is heated by almost all geothermal," Beck said. "So we're interested in pursuing this conversation with the board."

In a Monday interview, Lt. Craig Stotts said dispatchers were originally called about a male subject at the door who was refusing to leave. Police were soon told the man had been shot, Stotts said.

A man identifying himself as the shooter contacted the *Times-News* Thursday to explain his side of the story. The *Times-News* is not using his name because the man has not been charged with a crime and he requested anonymity for fear he and his family are in danger of retaliation.

The man said he was called to Filer Avenue East and Ash Street late Sunday night to check on Serena Cossette, Joseph's wife. When he and his fiancée arrived, the man claimed another man who was with Joseph Cossette hit him with a brick.

While Serena and Joseph Cossette later became involved, the original police call was not about them as earlier reported.

Police were dispatched at 11:56 p.m. Sunday to the area for a call about a battery from the man who later said he shot Joseph, Hicks said. According to Hicks, officers arrived at about 12:08 a.m. Monday.

A woman identifying herself as Serena Cossette wrote an email to the *Times-News* on Tuesday saying the call was not about her and her husband.

"That was 2 male people and neighbor called cops about noise," she wrote. The woman also wrote that she went to her friend's house to avoid other issues until the men cooled off.

Repeated attempts to reach Serena and Joseph Cossette for further comment were unsuccessful.

According to the man who identified himself as the shooter, after he left the scene at Filer Avenue, police called him to ask him to pick up Serena and her children and take them to his home for the night.

Hicks said there were no notations in the reports he had indicating police asked for Serena and the children to be taken to the home, but said he didn't doubt that it happened.

The man said he has known Serena for about four years, his fiancée had known her for about 15 and she's "like family" to them.

At about 3 a.m., the man said Joseph called asking to speak to Serena. He said he told Joseph to calm down, get

some rest and he could talk to Serena tomorrow.

Joseph allegedly then told the man he was going to come to his house.

When Joseph later arrived, the man said he tried to diffuse the situation without letting Joseph in the house. Eventually, the man claimed Joseph began banging on the door and started trying to break it down.

"He was volatile," the man said.

The man said at one point his brother fired a warning shot into the wall to try to scare Joseph away.

Not all details of the man's account could be corroborated with official police reports. Hicks said detectives are still sorting through reports from the scene to determine the facts of the night's events. Many of the details of the incident could be released depending on whether charges are filed, he said.

After the shot, the man said Joseph began laughing.

"I never saw someone laugh like that," the man said. "He laughed and hit the door harder saying 'shoot me, shoot me!'"

Things continued to get worse. The man said he felt he and his family were in danger, so he shot through the door.

"When we were trying to hold him until (police) got there the door was buckling and he was almost through it," the man said.

The man said the shotgun slug traveled through the door. A piece of the slug hit Joseph, who was knocked to the ground, the man said.

"I didn't want this to happen," the man said.

According to Hicks, police got the first call from Hoops Street at 4:25 a.m. and the first officer arrived at 4:28. Shortly after, most of the on-duty officers arrived at the scene, Hicks said.

"At least five within the next five minutes," Hicks said.

Hicks said there were no reports of Joseph being armed with a firearm, but police were trying to sort out where several items left on the front porch of the Hoops Street home came from, including several rocks and a hammer.

"That's one of the things (detectives) are looking at," Hicks said. "They're trying to analyze who things belong to."

The *Times-News* requested access to the 911 call placed from the Hoops Street residence and access to police reports regarding the incident. The requests were denied due to the ongoing investigation.

the same theater, said her mother was slightly concerned about her going to see the film. But "I'm not nervous at all because I really want to see that movie."

Still, just to be safe, she said, "I'm going to sit in the back."

Theaters took the precautions after a gunman wearing a gas mask opened fire at a midnight showing of "The Dark Knight Rises" in Aurora, Colo., killing at least 12 people.

In Washington, the Homeland Security Depart-

ment held a conference call with officials from the commercial, entertainment and shopping mall industries to discuss what security measures they could take to prevent something like this from happening again.

The National Association of Theater Owners said it was working closely with law enforcement authorities and reviewing security procedures, but gave no details of any precautions taken.

AMC Theatres, the nation's second-largest theater chain, with more than 300 movie houses, said it will not allow people to wear costumes or face-covering masks into its theaters.

Authorities did not release a motive. The FBI said there was no indication of ties to any terrorist groups.

Q: WHO IS THE SUSPECT?

A: Holmes was studying neuroscience in a Ph.D. program at the University of Colorado-Denver but was about to drop out. He enrolled in June 2011 but left a year later, though it wasn't immediately clear why.

Q: WHAT IS GOING ON AT HOLMES' APARTMENT?

A: Police said the third-floor apartment was booby trapped, so they've evacuated five surround-

ing buildings and bomb technicians were determining how to disarm flammable or explosive material.

The apartment is about four miles from the theater.

Q: ARE MOVIE THEATERS STILL SHOWING THE FILM?

A: Yes, though theaters and police increased security and AMC Theaters, the nation's second-largest chain, barred customers from wearing masks or costumes.

Some fans were nervous about going to see the film, but many were undeterred.

Two police officers were stationed outside the AMC theater in New York's Times Square, which had showings beginning every 20 minutes Friday.

from the aquifer than is being put back. If so, the drain could imperil the region's agriculture that relies on the the underground body of water.

Over the past three years, water users stepped up the amount of water they dump into the ground to let it seep into the aquifer. However, in order to build up the aquifer's water supply, state officials should prioritize funding projects in southern areas of the aquifer, said Mathew Weavers, senior water resource engineer for the Idaho Department of Water Resources.

"I recommend only recharging areas in the lower valley," he told members of the Idaho Water Resource Board during a Friday meeting in Burley. "It'll have the largest long-term benefits to the overall aquifer."

Water used for recharge above American Falls tends to drain into the Snake River before it can reach the aquifer, Weavers said. And over time, it doesn't expand to other areas of the aquifer. Instead, it just reaches the river faster, essentially putting the water to waste, he said.

The water board determines the amount of money that can be allotted for ESPA recharge efforts. Last fall, it approved \$132,700 to fund 44,245 acre-feet of recharge. But even with a commitment to improving the aquifer's water supply, the board remained hesi-

tant to agree Friday with Weaver's recommendations.

"If we stop recharging in the upper area, what do we lose?" asked board vice chairman Roger Chase ofocatello. "If we have the money for recharge, then I would hate to not give it to someone in the northern valley."

Board member Jeff Raybould, of St. Anthony, agreed.

"I'm reluctant to exclude anyone right now," he said.

Between 2007 and 2011, almost 80 percent of the 168,000 acre-feet of water designated for recharge made it back to the aquifer, said Mike McVay, hydrologist with IDWR. In the northern half, close to 40 percent of 220,000 acre-feet of water returned to the ESPA. An acre-foot is enough water to cover one acre, one foot deep.

Based on the current IDWR water budget model, the northern valley's recharge return rate will drop to less than 30 percent by 2017 if the same amount of water is released back into the aquifer over the next five years.

"Continuous recharge is important but it comes at a cost," McVay said. "There are lots of reasons to recharge and none of this is bad, it's just surprising."

Idaho Power Touts Positive Results from Cloud Seeding

BURLEY • After spending almost a decade researching if they can manipulate the weather, Idaho Power officials are coming back with positive results.

By using a method called "cloud seeding," meteorologists and researchers are seeing an increase in snowfall in the Payette River Basin.

How do they do it? Generators shoot silver iodide into the sky in a gas form. The silver iodide then latches onto water particles and crystallizes them before they evaporate when approaching high elevation.

Besides increasing snowpack, cloud seeding is also used by airports to help clear heavy fog and by farmers hoping to reduce the amount of hail damage on crops.

"Over a longer period of time, we're seeing a positive effect in the Payette Basin," said Derek

Blestrud, meteorologist with Idaho Power, during Friday's Idaho Water Resource Board meeting. The utility company currently has 10 generators in the Payette area.

"We're in the 5-15 percent increase in snowfall right now from when we first began," he said.

Critics of cloud seeding say it diverts precious precipitation from other parts of the state. Blestrud said that can happen but only if the project is poorly executed.

"When done correctly, the downwind effects are either neutral or positive," Blestrud said.

Idaho Power also has 16 cloud-seeding generators in the Upper Snake River Basin. However, they've only applied the weather method since 2009 and don't have as much data to compare for concrete results.

"This is something we would love to expand to other areas of the state."

Understanding Ultrasounds

I've heard a lot about endoscopic ultrasounds. What are they and can they assist in cancer detection or treatment?

— Lori, Gooding

Answered by Dr. Judith Csanky, M.D., DPM, St. Luke's Clinic, Gastroenterology:

Endoscopic ultrasound combines endoscopy and ultrasound to obtain images and information about the digestive tract, (which includes the esophagus, stomach, small and large intestines and rectum) and the surrounding tissues and organs.

Endoscopy refers to the procedure of inserting a long flexible tube through the mouth or the rectum to visualize the digestive tract. The ultrasound uses high-frequency sound waves to produce images of the organs and structures inside the body such as ovaries, uterus, liver, gall bladder, pancreas and aorta.

Endoscopic ultrasound is a new technique where the endoscope is equipped with an ultrasound probe that

enables the gastroenterologist to see through the wall of the digestive tract to other organs — up to two inches outside of the digestive tract. With the ultrasound view, the biggest advantage is the ability to take tissue samples from outside of the digestive tract to determine if there is cancerous growth in that area. This is a safe outpatient procedure and a much less invasive procedure for detection of cancer than surgery or an outside biopsy done through the skin by a radiologist.

With this new technique, it is much easier to detect cancer and to sample suspicious growth close to the gastrointestinal tract at an earlier stage, thereby increasing the probability of a

cure. While the main purpose of endoscopic ultrasound is to detect cancer and to determine the stage of cancer, it is also used to study bile duct abnormalities, including stones. It can also evaluate chronic pancreatic issues.

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Attack on Israeli Tourists Prompts Fears of Shadow War

The suicide bombing of a Bulgarian bus packed with Israeli tourists has stoked fears of a deadly new phase in the long-running "shadow war" between Iran and Israel, with ordinary civilians now apparently replacing diplomats as primary targets.

U.S. and Israeli officials on Thursday pointed to similarities between the Bulgarian attack and three recently foiled plots also aimed at civilians, including a nearly identical plan to kill vacationing Israelis in Cyprus. While the identity of the bomber in Wednesday's attack remained unclear, the earlier attempts have been tied to Iran or Hezbollah, the Lebanon-based militia movement closely aligned with the Islamic republic.

Even before the blast in Bulgaria, intelligence officials were seeing signs of an escalation in what had until recently been a campaign of covert, tit-for-tat strikes targeting diplomats and inside Iran nuclear scientists.

Earlier this month, Kenyan authorities arrested two Iranian men in connection with a plot to bomb several Western and Israeli businesses in that East African country. The suspects, identified by Kenya as members of an elite Iranian military unit, brought with them more than 220 pounds of RDX, a powerful military explosive strong enough to destroy a large hotel.

As far back as January, the Israeli government has sounded warnings about a growing terrorist threat in Bulgaria, a country whose Black Sea beaches have become a popular destination for thousands of Israelis each year.

After Wednesday's attack, Israeli officials were quick to blame Iran, but Israel did not release evidence linking Iran or Hezbollah to the incident. U.S. intelligence officials said they have not seen proof, though they did not dispute the link.

A series of Iran-linked plots in the fall and winter had mostly targeted diplomats and embassies. Iranian nationals and Hezbollah operatives had been implicated in attempted assassinations of Israeli, U.S. and Saudi figures in five countries. In one incident, Iranian operatives allegedly sought to hire Mexican gang members in a foiled plan to kill Saudi Arabia's ambassador to Washington.

ACLU: Emails Show Bias in Immigration Law

PHOENIX (AP) • Opponents of Arizona's hardline immigration enforcement law contend that emails sent, received and forwarded by a former legislator who championed the law support allegations it was racially motivated.

Dozens of emails are cited in a new legal effort by the American Civil Liberties Union and other civil rights groups to block police from enforcing the Arizona law's so-called show me your papers provision recently upheld by the U.S. Supreme Court.

The groups said the emails and other material reveal that ex-Sen. Russell Pearce and other supporters embraced discriminatory views and bent the truth about immigration-related matters, setting the stage for enactment of a law that the groups contend will lead to racial profiling if enforced.

The use of the emails in the court filing later Tuesday was reported Friday by *The Arizona Republic*.

Pearce on Friday denied discriminatory intent in championing the law, telling *The Associated Press* the civil rights groups falsely portray him as a racist and that the law includes protections against profiling.

"Nobody wants to talk about that," he said. "I've been attacked for years. I don't expect it to stop."

N. Korea Cracks Down on Defectors. With tighter border security and harsher punishments for those who cross into China, North Korea has forced a swift and drastic drop-off in defections this year, according to aid groups and South Korean officials.

The crack-down, they say, coincides with the rise of new leader Kim Jong Eun, and suggests his authoritarian police state is not only worried about people leaving the country, but also strong enough to stop them.

GSA Spent \$270,000 to Entertain Employees. Four weeks after an \$823,000 spending spree at a Las Vegas hotel, the General Services Administration spent more than \$270,000 on a one-day, taxpayer-funded ceremony.

The Federal Acquisition Service entertained about 1,000 employees at two Virginia hotels, with an additional 2,600 participating by webcast, officials said. Forty-nine attendees were flown in from offices around the country.

Thousands Flee Syrian Guerrilla War. Rebels pressed their guerrilla fight to top-ple Syria's regime deeper into the capital on Friday, ambushing troops and attacking police stations as thousands of terrified civilians fled to Lebanon and Iraq to escape some of the worst violence of the 16-month conflict.

The two-day death toll was more than 470 people.

Iowa Missing Considered Abuduction

EVANSDALE, Iowa (AP) • Law enforcement officials in Iowa reclassified the disappearance of two missing cousins as an abduction Friday after an FBI dive team failed to find their bodies in an Iowa lake.

Ten-year-old Lyric Cook-Morrissey and 8-year-old Elizabeth Collins disappeared a week ago while riding bikes near Meyers Lake in Evansdale. Their bikes were later found on a path near the lake.

A special 10-member FBI dive team used sonar equipment on a boat for hours Friday to search the 26-acre lake. Divers waded through the water looking for evidence but did not appear to go beneath the surface. By mid-afternoon, an FBI truck and many other police officers had left and little search activity was going on.

Black Hawk County Chief Deputy Rick Abben told reporters later Friday the divers were confident the girls' bodies were not in the lake. He also said investigators do not believe the girls got lost because they would have been found by now.

Abben said some evidence in the case has been sent to a state crime lab for analysis, but he would not elaborate on that.

The reclassification came as Iowa authorities took steps to keep a closer watch on Lyric's father, a man with a lengthy criminal history who stopped

cooperating with police in the week-old investigation.

Court records showed Friday that a judge ordered Daniel Morrissey, 36, placed in a pretrial supervision program of the Iowa Department of Corrections while he faces September trials in two separate drug cases. The change means Morrissey, who has been free on bond,

will be supervised by parole officers who will make sure he shows up in court and does not violate the terms of his release.

Black Hawk County prosecutor Brad Walz petitioned to place Morrissey under supervision Thursday, the day authorities said he and his wife had stopped cooperating with investigators.

Obama, Romney Remain Silent on Gun Control After Colorado Shooting

CHICAGO • President Barack Obama and Republican challenger Mitt Romney have spoken little about gun control in their campaigns for the White House and showed no sign of shifting course after one of the deadliest mass shootings in recent U.S. history.

"It's not one of the issues that either candidate has shown much inclination to discuss," said Don Kettl, dean of the school of public policy at the University of Maryland. "There are more downside risks than upside gains in talking about it."

At least 12 people were killed and dozens were injured when a gunman in a gas mask opened fire Friday in a movie theater near Denver.

In remarks Friday in Fort Myers, Fla., Obama made no mention of gun control as he called for a moment of silence for the shooting's victims. The president canceled later campaign events and returned to Washington. Romney also sidestepped the gun issue in a speech in Bow, N.H., calling the killings a "hateful act."

Obama called on Americans to choose compassion over conflict following a January 2011 shooting rampage

in Arizona that killed six people, including a 9-year-old girl, and critically wounded Rep. Gabrielle Giffords, who later stepped down from her House seat. He didn't push for any additional gun measures in the wake of that shooting.

Gun-control advocates have expressed disappointment in Obama's administration and said they hope he will be more aggressive on the issue, should he win re-election. New York Mayor Michael Bloomberg Friday called on both Obama and Romney to tell Americans "specifically what are they going to do about guns?"

Andrea Saul, a Romney spokeswoman, said in a statement that the campaign planned to pull all ads in Colorado, a battleground state, "until further notice." Jen Psaki, a spokeswoman for Obama's re-election campaign, told reporters the president's operation won't run ads in Colorado that contrast the president with Romney.

In an April speech, Romney said he didn't want to see any new gun laws.

"We need a president who will enforce current laws, not create new ones that only serve to burden lawful gun owners," the Republican nominee said.

DirecTV Gets Channels Restored

LOS ANGELES (AP) • Viacom and DirecTV fought a bruising fight over fees to a draw Friday and agreed to a long-term deal that ended a 10-day channel blackout.

Their new deal restored MTV, Comedy Central, Nickelodeon and other channels to 20 million DirecTV customers and ensured those channels will be available to subscribers on computers and mobile devices in the coming months.

Fans on Twitter expressed relief. According to terms shared by both sides on Friday, DirecTV Group Inc. will pay about 20 percent more to carry Viacom Inc. channels on satellite TV lineups.

That works out to about \$600 million in the first year of a seven-year deal.

DirecTV was able to save itself about \$500 million over the entire term by not taking the premium pay TV channel Epix.

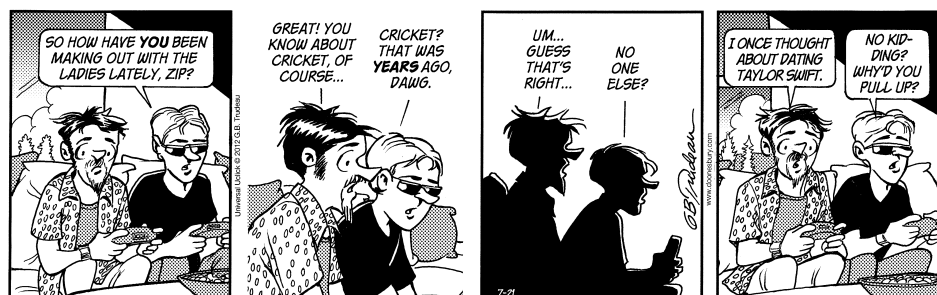

Judge Slaps \$2M Fine on Mining Company

BOISE (AP) • A federal judge has ordered a Canadian mining company to pay a hefty \$2 million penalty for its chronic failure to follow clean water laws and not doing enough to staunch the flow of arsenic and iron into a tributary of the Boise River system.

The order and penalty is the latest setback for Atlanta Gold Corp., which has been exploring gold deposits in the mountains around the historic mining town of Atlanta for more than 25 years.

Earlier this year, U.S. Magistrate Judge Mikel H. Williams ruled the company is legally responsible for high concentrations of pollutants flowing from an old mine shaft.

His order, given Thursday, wraps up the penalty phase of a lawsuit brought by two environmental groups.

The Idaho Conservation League and the National Environmental Defense Center sued the Toronto-based company last year, accusing the company of violating its federal discharge permit and failing to reduce the levels of pollutants flowing daily into Montezuma Creek, a tributary of the Middle Fork of the Boise River.

"We are hopeful that this strong ruling will cause Atlanta Gold to come into compliance with the permit and allow for the restoration of Montezuma Creek and the Boise River," said Kristin Ruether, an attorney for Advocates of the West and the plaintiffs.

STUDY CHALLENGES VIEWS ABOUT WESTERN FOREST FIRES

RENO, Nev. • Scientists using field notes from surveys first conducted by the government before the Civil War believe they've gained a better understanding of how Western wild-fires behaved historically.

Researchers at the University of Wyoming studied historical fire patterns across millions of acres of dry Western forests. Their findings challenge the current operating protocol of the U.S. Forest Service and other agencies that today's fires are burning hotter and more frequently than in the past.

Combing through 13,000 firsthand descriptions of forests and retracing steps covering more than 250

miles in three states, where teams of government land surveyors first set out in the mid-1800s to map the nation's wild lands, the researchers said they found evidence forests then were much denser than previously believed.

"More highly intense fire is not occurring now than historically in dry forests," said William Baker, who teaches fire ecology and landscape ecology in Laramie, Wyo., where he's been doing research more than 20 years. "These forests were much more diverse and experienced a much wider mixture of fire than we thought in the past, including substantial amounts of high-severity fire."

If he's right, he and others say it means fuel-reduction

programs aimed at removing trees and shrubs in the name of easing fire threats are creating artificial conditions that likely make dry forests less resilient.

"It means we need to rethink our management of Western dry forests," said Baker, a member of a U.S. Fish and Wildlife Service working group that is developing plans to help bolster northern spotted owl populations in dry forests.

Baker's conclusions have drawn sharp criticism from other longtime researchers who believe that decades of fire suppression have led to more densely tangled forests and more intense fires, the position advanced by the Forest Service.

"I have yet to hear any knowledgeable forest or fire ecologist or forest manager

say they are convinced by the main interpretations in that (Wyoming) paper," said Thomas Swetnam, a professor of dendrochronology and director of the Laboratory of Tree Ring Research at the University of Arizona. "I doubt it will gain much traction in the scientific or management communities."

The Forest Service did not immediately respond to a request for comment.

The studies conducted by Baker and others over the past two years focused on parts of Colorado, Oregon and Arizona, but were indicative of dry forest types stretching from the Rockies to the Sierra Nevada previously thought to be "open and park-like" and typically enduring only cycles of frequent, low-severity fire.

Golf Ball-sized Hail Falls on Panhandle

A severe thunderstorm warning has been issued for Spokane and areas to the west as a round of thunderstorms pounds the Inland Northwest this afternoon, bringing a risk of flash flooding and golf ball-sized hail beneath the strongest storms.

The National Weather Service issued a series of severe thunderstorm warnings across the region, including one about 3:20 p.m. from Post Falls westward to Coulee City, including Spokane and Airway Heights.

In addition, an area near Walla Walla was seeing a severe storm threat.

The Idaho portion of the storm moved into eastern Kootenai County by 2:50 p.m.

The storm that crossed Walla Walla was bearing down on Whitman County, including La-Crosse, on a trajectory toward Spokane.

Forecasters said golf ball-sized hail had reportedly fallen near Julianna, located northeast of Lewiston.

Power outages were starting to occur across the region.

Large hail up to two inches in diameter and damaging winds to 50 or 60 mph were possible.

The threat of a tornado in rotating super cells is minimal, forecasters said.

A wave of thunderstorms moved across the area early this morning, arriving in Spokane around 5 a.m. and bringing a bright orange sunrise against the darkening clouds.

Goat Man Spotted in Utah Mountains

SALT LAKE CITY (AP) • A man spotted dressed in a goat suit among a herd of wild goats in the mountains of northern Utah has wildlife officials worried he could be in danger as hunting season approaches.

Phil Douglass of the Utah Division of Wildlife Resources said Friday the person is doing nothing illegal, but he worries the so-called "goat man" is unaware of the dangers.

"My very first concern is the person doesn't understand the risks," Douglass said. "Who's to say what could happen?"

Douglass said a man hiking Sunday along Ben Lomond peak in the mountains above Ogden spotted the person dressed like a goat among a herd of real goats. The person provided some blurry photographs to Douglass, who said they did not appear to have been altered.

Wildlife officials now just want to talk to the man so he is aware of the dangers. There's no telling what his intentions are, Douglass said, but it is believed he could be a wildlife enthusiast.

"People do some pretty out there things in the name of enjoying wildlife. But I've never had a report like this," Douglass said. "There's a saying we have among biol-

ogists: You don't go far enough, you don't get the data. You go too far, you don't go home. The same is true with some wildlife enthusiasts."

Douglass said 60 permits will be issued for goat hunting season in that area, which begins in September. He worries the goat man might be accidentally shot or could be attacked by a real goat.

"They may get agitated.

They're territorial. They are, after all, wild animals," he said. "This person puts on a goat suit, he changes the game. But as long as he accepts responsibility, it's not illegal."

Douglass said wildlife of-

ficials received an anonymous call Thursday from an "agitated man" after the sighting was reported in local media. The caller simply said, "Leave goat man alone. He's done nothing wrong."

Deputy Calls Sink Hole Fatality 'Freak Accident'

MELBA (AP) • Authorities say a southwestern Idaho woman who died when her car fell into a sinkhole was the victim of very unusual circumstances.

Canyon County deputy Kieran Donahue said go-pher tunnels allowed irrigation water from nearby farm fields to flow underneath the roadway near Melba and weaken a 40-foot-section, causing it to

collapse. The sinkhole went undetected until early Saturday.

Authorities say 32-year-old Sonia Lopez of Melba was driving to work around 4 a.m. that morning when her car fell into the 3-foot-deep hole. Lopez was found more than an hour later and pronounced dead at the scene of what authorities are calling a freak accident.

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EPA Reviews Power Plant Rules

WASHINGTON (AP) • The Environmental Protection Agency is reviewing part of a controversial rule that sets the first federal standards to reduce toxic air pollution from power plants.

The rule, issued in December, is aimed at curbing mercury and other toxic pollutants from coal and oil-fired power plants. The Obama administration calls the rule a sensible step to reduce pollution, but Republicans have denounced it as a part of a "war on coal." The rule could force hundreds of the nation's oldest and dirtiest power plants to clean up or shut down.

EPA officials called the review a routine step that will have no impact on standards already set for existing power plants. Those rules will protect millions of families from air pollution, the agency said.

A spokesman for the American Lung Association, which pushed for the power plant rule, called the review "narrowly crafted." While the group is not happy with the change, "it is not a significant deal," said spokesman Paul Billings.

Ken Anderson, executive vice president of Colorado-based Tri-State Generation and Transmission Association, said the EPA should re-

view the overall rule "and come back with a regulatory standard that has a proper timeframe and is rooted in the realities of science and

engineering." Tri-State has proposed a coal-fired power plant in Kansas.

Power plants are the largest remaining source of

manmade mercury in the environment. Mercury is a toxic metal that's known to impair brain development in children.

Ed Center Backtracks on Idaho Online Class Report

BOISE (AP) • An education research center is backtracking on how it characterized Idaho in a report about the nation's largest for-profit online education provider.

The Associated Press reported Thursday the study found K12 Inc. students in Idaho and four other states were falling behind in math and reading. But the National Education Policy Center at the University of Colorado issued a correction Friday, saying the student achievement findings

were based on national evidence and not specific to any state.

Further, researchers examined federal data on Idaho but their information on the state's K12 students was incomplete compared to what they had for Arizona, Arkansas, Ohio and Pennsylvania. Specifically, researchers lacked Idaho's state math and reading assessment results.

Researchers maintain their overall conclusion that K12 Inc. students are lagging in math and reading.

Crews Battle West Idaho Fire

HORSESHOE BEND, (AP) • Authorities say U.S. Highway 95 has been reduced to one lane near Midvale as crews battle a 600-acre wildfire in western Idaho.

The fire started early Friday and the cause has not yet been determined.

Denise Cobb with the Payette National Forest said the fire is burning on a mix of private, state and federal land within the forest's protection zone. Officials reported blaze had crossed Sage Creek and was heading northwest.

Report Blames Mining Death on Safety Lapse

COEUR D'ALENE (AP) • A worker fatally injured at a northern Idaho mine last year was wearing an inadequate safety harness, federal officials said.

Brandon Gray, 26, was buried in rubble after trying to dislodge a jammed rock bin Nov. 17 at the Lucky Friday Mine.

A report released Thursday by the federal Mine Safety and Health Adminis-

tration found the accident happened because managers failed to ensure miners were provided with the right kind of protective equipment.

Gray was employed by Utah-based Cementation USA Inc., which had been contracted by Hecla Mining Co. to do work on a shaft inside the mine. Company leaders at Cementation USA were still working on a response to the MSHA report,

said president Mike Nadon.

The accident was among three in 2011 that prompted the federal agency to order the Lucky Friday Mine closed.

Gray was injured when he was working on top of a pile of broken rock and it gave way, burying the two men.

"The accident occurred due to management's failure to ensure miners were provided with the proper per-

sonal protective equipment when required to remove blocked material in the bin," according to the report.

The two men were wearing harnesses attached to "self-retracting lifelines" that were designed for an unobstructed fall. When the material underneath the men gave way, they didn't fall rapidly enough to trigger the lifelines to lock before the miners became buried in the rubble.

Christian Retailers Use Fair-trade Items to Balance Values, Capitalism

ORLANDO, Fla. • Ralph Lauren — with his made-in-China U.S. Olympic uniforms — is learning what Christian retailers heard at their annual trade show last week in Orlando, Fla.: Where and how items are made make a difference in the global economy.

Just because it's cheaper to make American Olympic uniforms in China doesn't make it right.

At the International Christian Retail Show, store owners learned how fair-trade products reflect their religious beliefs.

"What good is your Christian retail without considering where all this stuff is made and what system am I continuing to propagate?" said Christine Caine,

founder of the A21Campaign.org, an anti-sex-trafficking ministry.

It requires thinking about — and caring about — the working conditions of men, women, boys and girls who produce those inexpensive Jesus Loves Me T-shirts, religious trinkets and Nativity scenes.

"I don't believe we value people. We value making my dollar go as far as it can at someone else's expense," said Caine, 46, an Australian author and minister. "Just so you can buy something really cheap, are you going to allow somebody else on the other side of the world to go through pain and even torture?"

The fair-trade items don't exactly fit the traditional merchandise mix of Christian bookstores and gift shops. They don't come emblazoned with Scripture or

crucifixes or images of Jesus. What they do come with is a back story of an orphaned child, a widowed woman, a girl rescued from prostitution, a boy freed from sweatshop servitude.

"Fair trade is providing a fair and living wage, good working conditions and no child or slave labor," said Cynthia Glensgard, owner of Global Handmade Hope in Park Ridge, Ill.

Five fair-trade businesses represent only a tiny fraction of the 350 businesses at the International Christian Retailers Show at the Orange County, Fla., Convention Center, but they belong to an emerging trend within the big business of Christian retail.

Beginning this year, Family Christian Stores started selling fair-trade items online and in 26 of its 282 stores nationwide. Less than 5 per-

cent of the company's sales are fair-trade items, but that number is growing, said company Vice President Steve Biondo.

Family Christian Stores became interested in fair-trade products through the company's work with orphans and widows. By working directly with the artisans, the retail chain is able to lift families out of poverty and forced labor while providing customers with unique gifts, greeting cards and clothing.

"The bottom line is the products provide a way for people to make a viable living and give them choices they haven't had in the past," Biondo said. "There are girls trafficked for their sex who now have a jewelry operation. Having a steady income prevents them from being taken advantage of."

Bishops Say Church Leader Who Resigned Failed to Remove Priest Accused of Rape

CHICAGO • More than a week after a Chicago native resigned from the helm of the Orthodox Church in America, the bishops who requested the resignation now say he failed to remove a priest accused of rape.

In a resignation letter addressed to bishops earlier this month, Metropolitan Jonah "begged forgiveness for however I have offended you, and for whatever difficulties have arisen from my

own inadequacies and mistakes in judgment."

When asked at the time whether rumors of a mishandled rape allegation were true, Archbishop Eric George Tosi, secretary for the Orthodox Church in America, referred all inquiries to the news release posted on the church's website. But this week, the church issued a revised statement.

"We have hesitated to release further details surrounding the resignation of Metropolitan Jonah as Primate of our church, this in

desire to preserve his dignity and to prevent further harm to an innocent party," the statement said.

"We also harbored some hope that Metropolitan Jonah would show a willingness to accept responsibility for his actions and failures to act," the statement added.

Elected in late 2008 to lead one of several branches of Orthodox Christianity in the United States, parishioners looked to Metropolitan Jonah for reforms after his predecessor retired amid allegations that millions of church

dollars were used to cover personal expenses.

He insisted on amplifying the church's voice in the public square, speaking up against abortion rights and same-sex marriage.

In the most recent statement, the church's bishops claimed any suggestions that the resignation had to do with a political or cultural shift inside the church were untrue. Instead, they pointed to the Metropolitan's alleged mishandling of a priest accused of raping a woman in 2010.
