## The Last Day of SKIING

Skiers, snowboarders celebrate at Soldier Mountain

**FAIRFIELD** • As she stood at the base of Soldier Mountain with St. Patrick’s Day stickers in her hair, lodge manager Kristi Schiermeier waved and shouted greetings to familiar skiers and snowboarders. Beneath her sandals, the snow was starting to melt. Saturday marked the last day of the ski and snowboard season at Soldier Mountain.

To celebrate, dozens of skiers and snowboarders came up for the \$5 lift tickets, corned beef and live entertainment. A few were decked out in their goofiest St. Patrick’s Day accessories — green wigs and oversized fake glasses — as they hit the slopes. Schiermeier said the loyal skiers come to Soldier Mountain regularly. “This is their mountain,” she said. A lot of regulars are over

the age of 70, Schiermeier said, since they get a free lift ticket. Some are retired outdoor enthusiasts from Sun Valley. Soldier Mountain draws visitors mostly from the Magic Valley, Wood River Valley and Treasure Valley, she said. On Saturday, Ryan Schnuerle and his sons were taking a break from skiing to eat lunch in the lodge. It’s the third time the family from Caldwell came

## Hansen District to Discuss Next Steps after Levy Failure

**HANSEN** • The Hansen School District remains undecided about how to proceed after a proposed supplemental levy failed to pass last week. “I’m not ready to talk about

it,” Superintendent Susan Scherz told the *Times-News* on Friday. She’s hoping board members will have a better grasp of the situation after they meet tonight, March 18. The district asked voters to pass a two-year, \$190,000 supplemental levy that would help main-

tain its staff, salaries and benefits. But feelings were mixed in the community, she said. The levy would have cost taxpayers \$17.60 per year for every \$10,000 in home value. Voters rejected the proposed levy 51 percent to 49 percent. Staffing cuts are a possibility,

Scherz told the *Times-News* after the ballots were counted March 12. But, she continued, she wants to do everything she can to avoid such measures. The district has 29 teachers and around 370 students. Hopefully, she said, today will provide some answers.

# Enlarge Your World by Enriching Your Thoughts

A quick way to enhance my life is to change my thinking. It is my choice to become a good thinker. Embrace the bigger picture. Here's how that works for me:

- Hear someone out without interruption. This hasn't always been easy, but it enlarges my understanding of others.
- Become especially eager to learn new things in my field of interest. I find available teachers for mentoring.
- To accomplish something, I have to prioritize and follow through.
- Serving others is the most important thing I do.
- Unless I think things through, I cannot improve my thinking.

Here is how I go about the process:

1. Prime the pump by reading, studying and cultivating ideas into fruitful projects.
2. Hang out with good thinkers and bounce my ideas off them. I will accept their challenges to grow and learn. The proverb tells us, "As iron sharpens iron, so one man sharpens another."
3. Choose to think good thoughts. Set aside time to think. Become intentional about the thinking process by putting myself in the right place to think, shape, stretch and land my thoughts. I see this as an important discipline.
4. Act on my good thoughts. Schedule time to do it. "Think things through — then follow through," (Eddie Rickenbacker).
5. Allow my emotions to create another good thought. I cannot wait until I feel like thinking. I have to create mental momentum.
6. Keep repeating the process of good thinking. Regularly schedule thinking time. This requires finding a place to think. For me it might be the food



court in the mall, Barnes & Noble cafe or the mountains. I first put my thoughts down on paper, and then I begin to shape them. They have to stand the test of clarity and questioning.

S. I. Hayakawa said, "Learning to write is learning to think. You don't know clearly until you can state it in writing."

It is not until I shape my thoughts that I see their potential. Taking time to shape them helps me learn what I have. A little comic relief may come from a silly idea or something profound with clarity. Where will an idea take me in the future? I give myself creative space to explore and discover the invisible unknown. The process brings enjoyment and fulfillment. I discover my true motives. As I shape a thought, I find out whether it really matters or not.

John Maxwell says, "The formula for stretching a thought begins with the right thought plus the right people in the right environment at the right time for the right reason to produce the right result."

Every thought has the potential to become something great. The real power of an idea comes when we take it from abstraction to application. We have to land our thoughts with others so they will someday be implemented.

People are measured by the size of their thinking and their respect for the value of other people's thoughts.

# Bills Would End Animal Abuse Videos

SACRAMENTO, Calif. (AP)

• An undercover video that showed California cows struggling to stand as they were prodded to slaughter by forklifts led to the largest meat recall in U.S. history. In Vermont, a video of veal calves skinned alive and tossed like sacks of potatoes ended with the plant's closure and criminal convictions.

Now in a pushback led by

the meat and poultry industries, state legislators across the country are introducing laws making it harder for animal welfare advocates to investigate cruelty and food safety cases.

Some bills make it illegal to take photographs at a farming operation. Others make it a crime for someone such as an animal welfare advocate to lie on an applica-

tion to get a job at a plant.

Bills pending in California, Nebraska and Tennessee require that anyone collecting evidence of abuse turn it over to law enforcement within 24 to 48 hours — which advocates say does not allow enough time to document illegal activity under federal humane handling and food safety laws.

"We believe that folks in

the agriculture community and folks from some of the humane organizations share the same concerns about animal cruelty," said Mike Zimmerman, chief of staff for Assembly Member Jim Patterson, R-Fresno, whose bill was unveiled this week. "If there's abuse taking place, there is no sense in letting it continue so you can make a video."

## Elko County Hopes Plan Will Prevent Sage Grouse Listing

RENO, Nev. (AP) • Officials in a rural northeastern Nevada county have approved a pilot project designed to keep sage grouse off the endangered species list by killing ravens with poisoned eggs and by reducing wildfire threats through grazing.

Elko County commissioners say the program set to begin on the 15,000-acre Devils Gate Ranch is needed because wildfires and ravens pose the biggest threat to the imperiled chicken-sized bird. They say fires destroy sagebrush the birds rely on, while ravens are by far its most common predator.

It's the first such private-local government agreement to stave off a federal listing, commissioners said, and was prompted by concern that listing the large ground-dwelling bird could result in federal restrictions on grazing, mining, oil and gas drilling, and other activities on public land.

The U.S. Fish and Wildlife Service announced in 2010 that sage grouse across the West deserved protection under the Endangered Species Act. The agency pledged to make a final listing decision by late 2015.

Sage grouse populations have fallen 90 percent in the past century, and habitat has declined 50 percent.

"We think it's a program that will sweep the West, but we don't think the federal government will support it. They've bought into the claims of environmentalists," Commissioner Grant Gerber said. "We think it's mainly going to be a private initiative and local-county initiative."

Commissioners attribute the bird's decline to dramatic increases in wildfires and ravens. Livestock reduce cheat grass and other fuels on the range that feed fires, they say, and some of the worst fire seasons on record occurred after the government sharply reduced grazing on public lands in recent decades.

"If we don't control the ravens and don't stop the fires, the sage grouse are in real trouble," Gerber said.

The Idaho-based Western Watersheds Project criti-

cized the plan, saying it will destroy sage grouse habitat. The organization called for the removal of livestock, the closure of two-track roads and a ban on new oil and gas drilling to conserve the bird's habitat.

"Their fixation on killing and poisoning native wildlife and turning lands back into a dustbowl is really twisted," said Katie Fite, the group's biodiversity director. "It's a big distraction from ranchers having to be held accountable for limiting their cattle and sheep

herd impacts to sagebrush habitats on public lands."

Ted Koch, state supervisor of the Fish and Wildlife Service in Reno, agreed with the county that wildfires and ravens are factors in the bird's decline.

But his agency views habitat loss and fragmentation as the most serious threat to sage grouse in the West, he said, and considers the spread of invasive species such as cheat grass as its biggest threat in the Great Basin.

Palestinians unenthusiastic about Obama visit.

**RAMALLAH, West Bank (AP)** • President Barack Obama will find a disillusioned Palestinian public, skeptical about his commitment to promoting Mideast peace, when he visits the region.

Obama's trip, beginning Wednesday, appears aimed primarily at resetting the sometimes troubled relationship with Israel. But

winning the trust of the Palestinians, who accuse him of unfairly favoring Israel, could be a far more difficult task.

After suffering disappointments during the first Obama administration, Palestinians see little reason for optimism in his new term. The White House announcement that Obama will not present any new

peace initiatives strengthened their conviction that the U.S. leader isn't prepared to put the pressure on Israel that they think is necessary to end four years of deadlock in negotiations.

"Obama is coming for Israel, not for us," said Mohammed Albouz, a 55-year-

old Palestinian farmer. While Israel is preparing to give Obama the red-carpet treatment, there are few signs of excitement in the West Bank. Large posters of Obama hung in Ramallah last week were quickly defaced, and a small group of activists called "The Campaign for Dignity" plans on releasing black balloons into the air in a sign of mourning when Obama arrives.

## Pope Surprises Onlookers by Wading into Crowds

**VATICAN CITY (AP)** • Walking up to crowds, shaking hands with surprised bystanders in the street, mixing his formal speeches with off-the-cuff remarks, Pope Francis stamped his own style on the papacy Sunday.

His humor and down-to-earth manner captivated those filling St. Peter's Square in Rome to overflowing, and he worked the crowd in a way that had to give his security staff palpitations. Rome Mayor Gianni Alemanno, in the

square himself, estimated the crowd's size at 300,000.

"Brothers and sisters, 'Buon giorno,'" Francis said in Italian in his first welcome from the window of the papal residence, setting an informal tone that has become the defining spirit of his young papacy.

Earlier Sunday, he made an impromptu appearance before the public from a side gate of the Vatican that startled passers-by and prompted cheers as he shook hands

and kissed babies. Francis had just finished celebrating Mass and delivering a six-minute homily — brief by church standards — in the Vatican's tiny parish church, St. Anna, when he walked outside to greet parishioners one by one, just as an ordinary pastor does after weekly services.

Francis started speaking at the window even before the stroke of noon — the appointed time for the weekly papal address. The windows

of the papal study in the Apostolic Palace were opened for the first time since Francis' predecessor, Benedict XVI, gave his last Sunday blessing on Feb. 24.

Four days later, Benedict went into retirement, the first pontiff to do so in nearly 600 years.

Francis, the first pope from Latin America, was elected Wednesday and has been staying in a hotel on the Vatican's premises until the papal apartment is ready.



## Supreme Court to Mull Law Requiring Documents to Vote

**WASHINGTON (AP)** • The Supreme Court will struggle this week with the validity of an Arizona law that tries to keep illegal immigrants from voting by demanding all state residents show documents proving their U.S. citizenship before registering to vote in national elections.

The high court will hear arguments today over the legality of Arizona's voter-approved requirement that prospective voters document their U.S. citizenship in order to use a registration form produced under the federal "Motor Voter" voter registration law that doesn't require such documentation.

This case focuses on voter registration in Arizona, which has tangled frequently with the federal government over immigration issues involving the Mexican border. But it has broader implications because four other states — Alabama, Georgia, Kansas and Tennessee —

have similar requirements, and 12 other states are contemplating similar legislation, officials say.

The Obama administration is supporting challengers to the law.

If Arizona can add citizenship requirements, then "each state could impose all manner of its own supplemental requirements be-

yond the federal form," Solicitor General Donald B. Verrilli Jr. said in court papers. "Those requirements could encompass voluminous documentary or informational demands, and could extend to any eligibility criteria beyond citizenship, such as age, residency, mental competence, or felony history."

#### Football Players Convicted of Raping Girl

**STEUBENVILLE, Ohio** • Two members of Steubenville's celebrated high school football team were found guilty Sunday of raping a drunken 16-year-old girl, and Ohio's attorney general warned the case isn't over, saying he is investigating whether coaches, parents and other students broke the law, too.

Trent Mays, 17, and Ma'lik Richmond, 16, were sentenced to at least a year in juvenile prison in a case that has rocked this Rust Belt city of 18,000 and led to allegations of a cover-up to protect the Steubenville High team, which has won nine state championships. Mays was ordered to serve an additional year for photographing the underage girl naked. They can be held until they turn 21.

The two broke down in tears after a juvenile court judge delivered his verdict. They later apologized to the victim and the community, Richmond struggling to speak through his sobs.

"My life is over," he said as he collapsed in the arms

of his lawyer.

The crime, which took place after a party last summer, shocked many in Steubenville because of the seeming callousness with which other students took out their cellphones to record the attack and gossiped about it online. In fact, the case came to light via a barrage of morning-after text messages, social media posts and online photos and video.

"Many of the things we

learned during this trial that our children were saying and doing were profane, were ugly," Judge Thomas Lipps said.

#### Lawmaker Questions Leader's Stability

**WASHINGTON** • The chairman of the House Intelligence Committee says the U.S. just doesn't know about "the stability" of North Korea's young leader, who has threatened preemptive nuclear attacks on Washington. Republican Rep. Mike Rogers of Michigan says Kim Jong Un is trying to "prove himself" to his military and the military is eager for "saber-rattling" for its own self-interest.

North Korea also has said recently that it no longer will recognize the armistice that ended the 1953 Korean War.

The Pentagon said Friday that it will spend \$1 billion to add 14 interceptors to an Alaska-based missile defense system, responding to what it called faster-than-anticipated North Korean progress on nuclear weapons and missiles.

to Soldier Mountain. Saturday's skiing was great, he said, even though there's a lack of snow. Outside on the patio, Shoshone resident Kasey Barney sat in the sunshine. The teenager frequents Soldier Mountain. He came about 30 times this year. On Saturday, Barney said the conditions were "sloppy, wet and gross," but that's typical for springtime skiing. "You can't help it," he said. "You just live with it." So what's the plan now? Barney plans to "to shred it up at Tahoe" soon. By late Saturday morning, temperatures hovered in the mid-40s with plenty of sunshine. Schiermeier said snow conditions were good at the top of the mountain, but not all of the runs were open. The season started Dec. 26. Since then, more than 9,000 skiers and snowboarder visited the mountain.

**A New Nonprofit Organization** Kristi and Don Schiermeier ran the ski area for two seasons before Bruce Willis bought the property in 1997. In October 2012, Willis donated it to a new non-

profit organization. Solider Mountain Ski Area has nonprofit status in Idaho, but is still waiting on federal status. Soldier Mountain is a special place for the Schiermeiers. "We revamped the whole layout in the lodge," Jamon Frostenson, a board member, said. They also made changes to the kitchen, and buildings at Soldier Mountain also got new paint. "It looks like a new place up here," he said.

On the slopes, there's a new magic carpet that's beginner-friendly. "That's been a big hit," Frostenson said. Kristi Schiermeier said there also were upgrades to the chairlift, allowing employees to slow it down for people who need extra time to get on and off. Over the past year, upgrading the ski area has been accomplished through 6,800 hours of volunteer time, she said. They're working to build services back up again and are reaching out to schools again to rebuild programs for children. Will Varin, board member, said the first year operating Soldier Mountain was a team

effort with many people helping out. He said the small-town vibe is unique to Soldier Mountain and it's a great place to teach children how to ski. But at the same time, Varin said, there's advanced terrain hidden away on the back of the mountains. "We can offer a lot on both ends of the spectrum," he said.

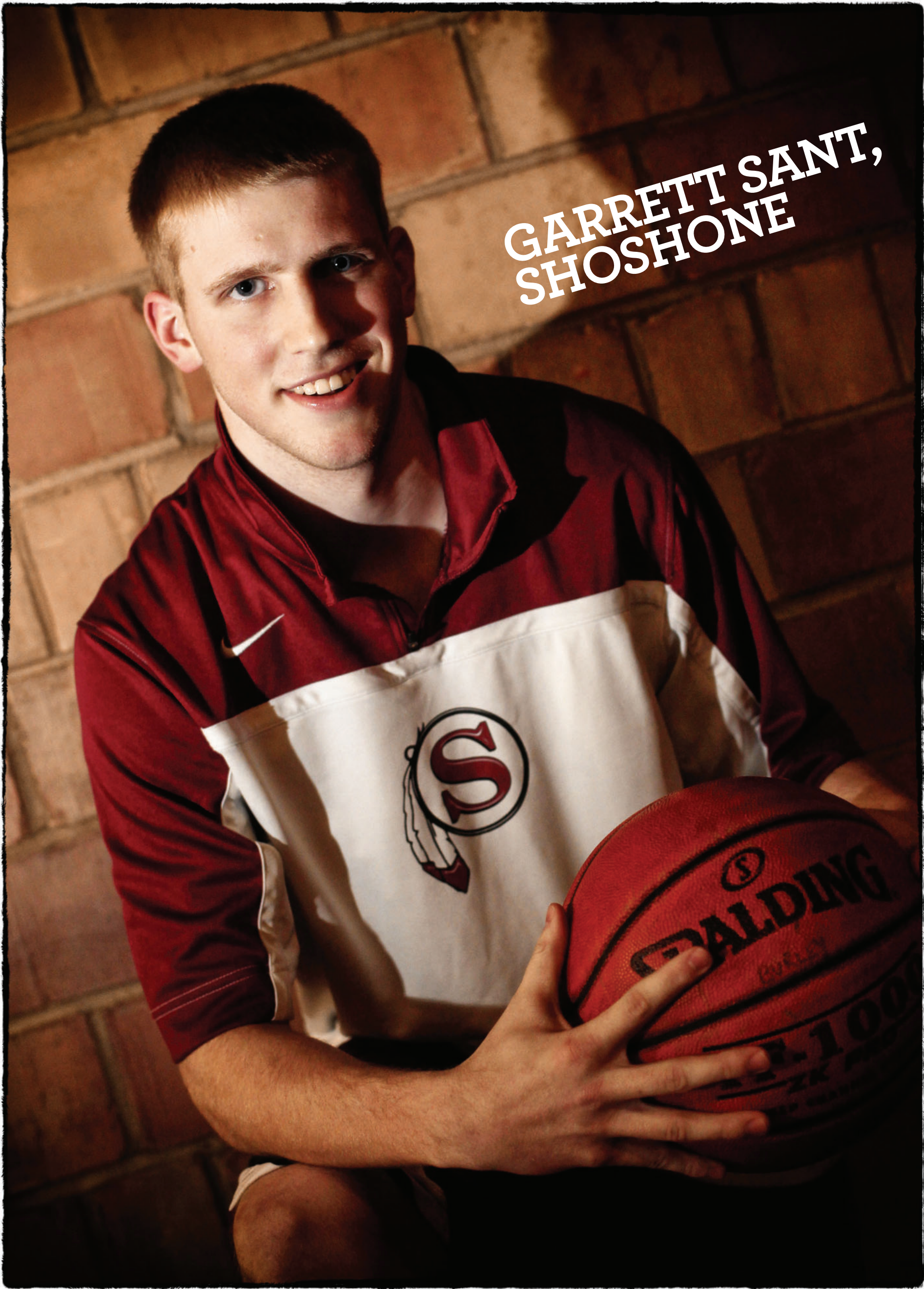

For the second straight year, the selection committee chose 11 teams from outside the big six conferences, the highest number since 12 were chosen in 2004.

## TODAY IN HISTORY

#### On this date:

In 1766, Britain repealed the Stamp Act of 1765.

In 1837, the 22nd and 24th president of the United States, Grover Cleveland, was born in Caldwell, N.J.

In 1913, King George I of Greece was assassinated in Thessaloniki.

In 1937, some 300 people, mostly children, were killed in a gas explosion at a school in New London, Texas.

In 1938, Mexican President Lazaro Cardenas nationalized his country's petroleum reserves and took control of foreign-owned oil facilities.

In 1942, President Franklin D. Roosevelt signed an executive order authorizing the War Relocation Authority, which was put in charge of internment Japanese-Americans, with Milton S. Eisenhower (the younger brother of Dwight D. Eisenhower) as its director.

In 1959, President Dwight D. Eisenhower signed the Hawaii statehood bill. (Hawaii became a state on Aug. 21, 1959.)

In 1980, Frank Gotti, the 12-year-old youngest son of mobster John Gotti, was struck and killed by a car driven by John Favara, a neighbor in Queens, N.Y. (The following July, Favara vanished, the apparent victim of a gang hit.)

In 1990, thieves made off with 13 works of art from the Isabella Stewart Gardner Museum in Boston (the crime remains unsolved).

**Ten years ago:** A jury in Corpus Christi, Texas, cleared Bayer Corp. of liability in a \$560 million lawsuit that accused the pharmaceutical giant of ignoring research linking the cholesterol-lowering drug Baycol to dozens of deaths. In Salt Lake City, Brian Mitchell and Wanda Barzee were charged with aggravated kidnapping, sexual assault and burglary in the abduction of Elizabeth Smart, who was found with them six days earlier. (Although both were initially found incompetent to stand trial, Mitchell was eventually convicted of kidnapping and sexual assault, while Barzee pleaded guilty to kidnapping and unlawful transportation charges.) Olympic gold medal figure skater Sarah Hughes won the Sullivan Award as the nation's top amateur athlete.

**Five years ago:** Democrat Barack Obama confronted America's racial divide head-on with a speech in Philadelphia in which he urged the nation to break "a racial stalemate we've been stuck in for years." German Chancellor Angela Merkel earned a standing ovation from Israel's parliament with a speech that included a tribute to the victims of the Holocaust. Oscar-winning filmmaker Anthony Minghella ("The English Patient") died in London at age 54.

**One year ago:** Mitt Romney scored an overwhelming win in Puerto Rico's Republican presidential primary, trouncing chief rival Rick Santorum.

## THE ACES ON BRIDGE®

Bobby Wolff

With the spring national championships currently taking place in St Louis, Mo., this week's deals all come from last year's championships in Memphis, Tenn.

Sometimes you need the cards to lie just so to give yourself a chance to make your contract. And when they do, the satisfaction for you (plus the irritation caused to your opponents) is all the more. Today's deal provides just such an example.

Nobody did anything too outrageous in the bidding, but four hearts was an uncomfortable contract for North-South. When West led a low club (suggesting a five-card suit in her methods), East decided to win and shift to a trump, reasonably assuming her heart queen was a dead duck. Notice that the club spots would have allowed South to set up the club eight for an extra winner had East played either her high or low club. Declarer won the trump in hand, ruffed a club, ducked a spade around to West, then won the trump return in hand and ruffed a second club. At this point, East was out of clubs, so declarer could next play the spade king to force East to win. Since that player had no clubs to lead, she could do no better than play her low spade. This allowed declarer to ruff, then draw the last trump, and run the diamonds for four tricks.

In the end, South scored six trump tricks (four in hand and two ruffs in dummy) plus four diamond winners.
