Monsanto Sued by Idaho Farmers over GMO Wheat

BOISE • Farmers in Idaho have filed a potentially class-action lawsuit against seed giant Monsanto after genetically engineered wheat was found in an eastern Oregon field.

The farmers, represented by a Boise law firm, filed the federal lawsuit Friday, contending that Monsanto's development of Roundup Ready wheat resulted in increased production costs and lowered prices because the genetically engineered wheat is likely to infiltrate the non-genetically engineered wheat supply.

No genetically engineered wheat has been approved for U.S. farming, and the discovery of the Roundup Ready wheat growing in Oregon in May prompted Japan to suspend some wheat imports.

Monsanto didn't immediately respond to a request for comment, but the company has said a similar lawsuit filed in Kansas was done so prematurely and without any evidence of fault, and that it plans to present a vigorous defense.

Already a handful of lawsuits have been filed in other courts around the country over the same issue. The lawsuit in Boise's U.S. District Court was filed Friday by Behrend, Behrend & Knittel Farms and CoMa Farms, both in Aberdeen, and County Line Farms in American Falls. The Idaho farmers are asking for class-action status on behalf of thousands of farmers of soft white wheat in Idaho, Oregon, Washington and other states.

Monsanto began in 1997 to develop a strain of wheat that is resistant to the company's popular pesticide, Roundup. The result, dubbed Roundup Ready wheat, was field tested in 16 states between 1998 and 2005, including fields owned by CoMa Farms in Aberdeen, according to the lawsuit. At the time Monsanto had applied to USDA for permission to develop the engineered wheat, but the company later pulled its application.

Cooler Weather, Rain Ease Hagerman Water Crisis

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HAGERMAN • The darkened, overcast skies couldn't come soon enough for Hagerman.

With two domestic water pumps down — one needing replacement and the other repairs — city officials are pleading with residents to conserve water for the next nine days.

With lower temperatures and intermittent rain, the need to water lawns or wash cars has waned.

Yet even with the drop in temperatures, city officials are asking for citizen cooperation.

The city uses 450 gallons a minute on average, said City Superintendent Justin Hulme. That number jumps to 700 gallons around late afternoon.

The only working domestic water pump in the city has a capacity to distribute 750 gallons a minute, but it's considered a backup pump, Hulme said.

"We're hoping all the (repair) parts come together Friday night," Hulme said. "But you never know."

While officials are asking residents to conserve water, Mayor Noel Weir said they aren't turning off water at homes or asking businesses to stop using large amounts.

Because the city already is meeting the demand on one pump, there isn't a need to restrict water, Weir said.

The two pumps that broke were installed almost 30 years ago, he said. The city put in a backup pump almost two years ago. Repairs will cost more than \$6,000, he said.

Restaurants such as the Snake River Grill haven't been asked to stop handing out glasses of water, but sprinklers in the city park remain off for most of the afternoon.

"We can't enforce anything," Weir said. "We're looking for people to cooperate."

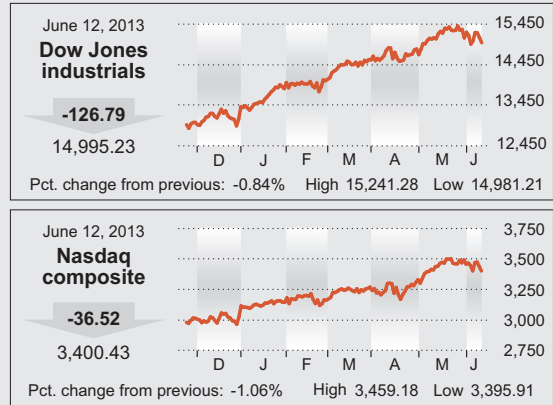
THE MARKET AT A GLANCE

Stocks Slide; Dow below 15,000

NEW YORK (AP) • The stock market ended lower Wednesday as traders looked ahead to a critical Federal Reserve meeting next week.

Without any major economic news, traders grappled with the question hanging over financial markets: When will the Fed and other central banks pull back their economic stimulus programs?

The Dow Jones industrial average fell 126 points, or 0.8 percent, to 14,995. The Dow had its first three-day loss of the year and its second close below 15,000 in the past month.

Your Guess Is as Good as Mine

TWIN FALLS • It has been said that a picture is worth a thousand words.

Unfortunately, pictures are mute. When they have no inscriptions, all we can do is marvel at the details in the photo as we allow our thoughts to drift off into someone else's lifetime.

Take, for example, an undated photograph of homesteaders in Twin Falls County. While their prove-up shack seems to be lacking the ordinary comforts of home, it is obvious that the family came from a more prosperous past.

A fancy parlor table stands at the far left. A bird cage — complete with resident — hangs from the front eave of the shack. A wooden rocking chair sits at the front door, and a state-of-the-art buggy stands in contrast to the ramshackle barn in the background.

The photo was taken on a good day; everyone is eating watermelon.

What Are Scattered and Isolated Chances of Rain?

In yesterday's weather column, I discussed why I choose not to use "percent chance of rain." Today I want to talk about what we use instead of percentages.

Living in a high desert, we have more dry, sunny days than wet, rainy ones, but we do get those occasional threats of rain. Instead of saying we have a 10- or 30-percent chance of showers, I like to use descriptive words or phrases like "scattered chance," "isolated chance," or occasionally "slight chance." If I think showers are almost certain, then I will say "widespread," "occasional" or "off and on" showers and storms. What do all of these mean?

When I describe our rain showers as scattered or isolated, I am talking about how they look on the map. An example of isolated showers: Drop five marbles on the floor and try to forecast where they will stop. You just don't know. These marbles, like showers, only cover small, isolated areas.

For scattered showers, it's like dropping a bag of marbles on to the floor and

forecasting where they will land. You still don't know where they will stop, but you know there will be more than just five. The same can be said with showers. Both isolated and scattered chances mean someone will see rain while many others will not.

If you hear us say, "widespread," "occasional" or "off and on," then we expect most everyone will see rain or showers during the day or night. The lower threats of rain are what we describe as a slight chance. If you are still confused and like to ask more questions, just send me an email or give me a call. I love talking weather and getting to know our viewers.

ONLINE: Close-up Photography of Ants

At "Between the Frames," Times-News photographers blog about how they got the shot. The latest entry is by Drew Nash. Here's an excerpt:



"Something was off as I looked down to see thousands of ants at my feet. Yep, it was time for a macro photo. I stepped away so I wouldn't get eaten and shifted the focus setting on my Nikon P7100 to macro mode (little flower icon). "I left the camera at its widest angle ... and waited for my AF to lock. If you can, use a tripod for your macro shots. The depth of field is usually so shallow that if the camera moves even 1/8 of an inch it could throw your subject out of focus. I of course didn't have a tripod during this hike so I just winged it as usual. ...

"Most P&S cameras these days have a macro setting allowing you to get close. If you shoot a DSLR there are a number of things you can try: 1. Use a zoom lens and max out its closest focusing distance. 2. Buy close-up filters for

your lens. Edge-to-edge sharpness will suffer, but it's a small price to pay. 3. Buy a macro lens. These are usually expensive. They also come in a number of focal lengths and are often prime or fixed, meaning they don't zoom. We have a 100mm here at the paper. Not only does it allow for close-up photography, it makes for a great portrait lens. ..."



Boise Residents Sue Berry Company

BOISE • A Boise couple worried that their unborn baby may have contracted hepatitis A from a tainted frozen berry and pomegranate seed mix filed a class action lawsuit this week against the Oregon company that produced the product.

In the lawsuit filed Monday in Fourth District Court in Boise, Marisa and Michael Berndt claim that Townsend Farms of Fairview, east of Portland, was negligent in failing to ensure that its organic berry mix was safe to eat.

The Berndts said they bought a three-pound bag of the berry mixture at the Boise Costco store on May 14. They received vaccinations June 5, after learning about the possible link to hepatitis A illnesses. Although they have not shown symptoms of the illnesses, they fear their unborn child may have contracted hepatitis.

Townsend Farms referred a

reporter to the company's attorney, Bill Garr. He was not immediately available for comment. Last week, he told the *Oregonian* newspaper in Portland that the "public's safety is Townsend Farms' primary concern right now."

The Centers for Disease Control and Prevention in Atlanta is investigating 99 reported illnesses in eight states — none in Idaho — linked to the Townsend Farms mix, which includes strawberries, raspberries, cherries and pomegranate seeds. Illnesses have been reported in Washington, Utah, Colorado, California, Arizona, Nevada, Hawaii and New Mexico.

The Townsend Farms mix was sold by Costco stores throughout the West and by Harris Teeter Supermarkets in eight eastern states between February and May.

"Costco did an excellent job

of notifying customers of their potential exposure to hepatitis A and encouraging them to receive proper treatment to prevent infection," said the couple's Seattle-based attorney William Marler.

Man Gets 3 Years after Pot Bust in Idaho

BOISE (AP) • An Arkansas man who said he was promised just over \$11,000 to bring 25 pounds of marijuana from Oregon to another state has been sentenced to at least three years in an Idaho prison for trafficking the drug.

Fourth District Judge Richard Greenwood sentenced Jeffrey Boyd Ash, 54, of Fayetteville, Ark., on Tuesday to up to four years in prison. He will be eligible for parole after serving three years, *The Idaho Statesman* reported.

Ash was arrested in November after a Boise motel clerk called police saying a guest had shown her a picture of his genitals on his cellphone and she wanted officers to kick him out of the motel.

In court on Tuesday, Ash acknowledged he was holding an unlit joint when he answered the door. Officers smelled marijuana and searched the room, finding just over 25 pounds of the drug in the shower.

Ash pleaded guilty in April. Prosecutors recommended a 10-year prison sentence with the possibility of parole after three years, while the defense sought a three-year sentence, noting his lack of criminal record and the fact that he is the only parent to his 15-year-old son.

Elko County Pays \$30K to Settle Jail Suicide Suit

ELKO, Nev. (AP) • Elko County has agreed to a \$30,000 settlement with the estate of a 49-year-old Colorado man who hanged himself at the county jail while being held on drug charges in June 2010.

James Duhon told jail employees he was a heroin addict and suffering with withdrawals, his lawyers said in a lawsuit. But they say he didn't receive the necessary constant monitoring despite jail records showing he was allowed medical treatment and placed in an isolation cell "for observation purposes due to a risk of further health and psychiatric problems, including risk of suicide."

Duhon was attending the Elko Motorcycle Jam-boree when he was stopped for having his handlebars set too high. In addition to drug possession, officers learned that Duhon was wanted on multiple felony

warrants in El Paso County, Colo.

Four days after he was jailed, he hanged himself with strips he tore from a bed sheet in part of his cell not visible to a surveillance camera, then-Sheriff Dale Lotspeich said.

Duhon's estate originally filed a lawsuit seeking more than \$75,000 in damages.

County prosecutors cleared the sheriff's office of any criminal wrongdoing related to the suicide in September 2010, but the incident prompted changes in surveillance policies at the jail.

Sheriff Jim Pitts said deputies now check on inmates more frequently. He said the jail also is working to upgrade its camera security system.



"We're doing the best we can for everyone's safety in and out of the jail," Pitts said.

THREE WILDFIRES START IN COLORADO

COLORADO SPRINGS, Colo. (AP) • A trio of Colorado wildfires fueled by hot temperatures, gusty winds and thick, bone-dry forests has burned dozens of homes and forced the evacuation of more than 7,000 residents and nearly 1,000 inmates at a medium-security prison.

Wildfires also were burning in New Mexico, Oregon and California, where a smokejumper was killed fighting one of dozens of lightning-sparked fires.

Crews were so busy battling wildfires across the West that the U.S. Forest Service announced Wednesday it is mobilizing a pair of Defense Department cargo planes to drop slurry on the blazes. Such action can't be taken unless all of the Forest Service's contracted tankers already are in use.

Near Colorado Springs, authorities fear that a 12-square-mile wildfire in a heavily-wooded residential area might have already destroyed around 100 homes — even as it continued to send up puffs of black smoke and likely consumed more buildings.

The fire, one of several that broke out Tuesday along Colorado's Front Range, has forced thousands of evacuations in an area over 47 square miles. An unknown number of Colorado Springs residents also have been warned to be ready to evacuate, mostly because of a fear of flying embers spreading the fire into the state's second-largest city. About 900 people in neighboring Elbert County, including two camps, have also been evacuated.

El Paso County Sheriff Terry Maketa said there were no reports of anyone missing

in the Black Forest Fire, but he was concerned about those who chose to ignore evacuation orders and stay behind.

"One of my worst fears is that people took their chances and it may have cost them their life," he said.

The area is not far from last summer's devastating Waldo Canyon Fire that destroyed 346 homes and killed two.

The Forest Service said it was mobilizing two specially equipped Defense Department C-130s to help with wildfires in the West after all 12 of its air tankers were deployed.

By law, the Modular Airborne Firefighting System — MAFFS — planes can be deployed only when all of the Forest Service's contracted tankers are in use. Last year at around this time, they sat on runways when massive wildfires burned in Colorado and New Mexico.

The agency didn't say where the C-130s would be used. But they are based at Peterson Air Force Base in Colorado Springs, and U.S. Rep. Doug Lamborn, R-Colo., said they would be used to fight the nearby Black

Forest Fire.

"Yesterday we had kind of an unexpected uptick in activity, especially in Colorado," said Jennifer Jones, a Forest Service spokeswoman at the National Interagency Fire Center

in Boise.

Lamborn said Congress should determine whether there are enough aerial tankers to fight wildfires.

"We should look at that. We gotta look at that. Given the fact that we're off to another tragic fire season, kind of early in the year, maybe that shows us that we do need more," he said.

In northeast California, 28-year-old Luke Sheehy was fatally injured by part of a falling tree in Modoc National Forest. The Susanville, Calif., man was a member of the Redding-based California Smokejumpers — firefighters who parachute into remote areas from airplanes.

About 60 miles southwest of the Black Forest Fire, a 6-square-mile wildfire was burning near Royal Gorge Bridge Park but winds are pushing the fire away from Canon City and structures.

The Royal Gorge Fire has destroyed three structures near Canon City, but the soaring suspension bridge spanning a canyon across the Arkansas River is intact. It's normally a tourist attraction, but firefighters are now using

it to access the fire.

More than 900 prisoners at a nearby medium-security prison, including murderers, rapists and other serious of-

fenders, were evacuated overnight, because of heavy smoke from the blaze. The prisoners were transferred by bus and van, 200 at a time, throughout the night from the Colorado Territorial Correctional Facility, built in 1871. The prison also includes an infirmary and some prisoners use wheelchairs and canes.

"This was done as a precaution because it takes a lot of time to move the prisoners," Department of Corrections spokeswoman Adrienne Jacobson said.

Another fire sparked by lightning Monday in Rocky Mountain National Park has grown to an estimated 400 acres in area with trees killed by pine beetles.

Near Colorado Springs, fire evacuees Greg and Sharon Rambo set up camp in a Walmart and Home Depot parking lot. They were living in a modular home in Black Forest as they waited to close on a larger house nearby. They believe both were burned.

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WOMAN MAD AT CHEATING BEAU SENTENCED IN ATTACK

TWIN FALLS • A 61-year-old Twin Falls woman was sentenced Tuesday to a year of unsupervised probation for an attack on her boyfriend and another woman while they slept. Jordana Brenda Bryan originally was charged with felony aggravated battery,

causing great bodily harm. The charge quickly was reduced to misdemeanor battery because she used only her hands in the Feb. 20 attack, not a bed frame as first reported, defense attorney Keith Roark said in court Tuesday. Police said the victims told them Bryan came into the bedroom at 3 a.m., yelling vulgarities, and be-

gan pulling blankets off the two, then hit them with part of a steel bed frame. The woman said her arm was numb and might be broken. Police reported seeing several severe lacerations on her legs. The man drove the woman to St. Luke's Magic Valley Medical Center. Roark said Bryan has been a community volunteer and is registered as an organ donor.

Because she had no criminal record, Twin Falls County Magistrate Judge Calvin Campbell granted Bryan a withheld judgment, meaning she can ask to have the case dismissed at the end of her probation. He sentenced her to 90 days in jail but suspended 89 days and gave her credit for the day already served. Her fines and fees total \$402.50.

Brother's Shooting Trial Delayed until September

TWIN FALLS • A man accused of shooting and injuring his brother won't go on trial till Sept. 17. Juan Robert Jimenez is charged with aggravated battery using a deadly weapon and unlawful possession by a convicted felon in the Feb. 9 shooting. In April, prosecutors added a persistent violator enhancement to his charges because of prior felonies. So if found guilty, Jimenez could be sen-

tenced to life in prison. Police say Jimenez shot Jorge Alvarado outside of a Twin Falls home in the 100 block of Tyler Street. Jimenez reportedly told police he "closed his eyes and shot, two to three times" after Alvarado pointed a gun at him. When Alvarado fell to the ground, Jimenez said, he went to call police, but an unknown man got out of a car and fired three more times. Alvarado was taken to St. Luke's Magic Valley Medical Center and treated for eight wounds.

Utah State Prison Could Relocate

SALT LAKE CITY (AP) • A committee studying the relocation of the Utah State Prison has kicked off a months-long process to consider moving the facility out of a bustling tech corridor south of Salt Lake City.

The Utah State Prison occupies 700 acres in Draper where companies such as eBay Inc. and Microsoft Corp. have set up operations.

Supporters of relocation say the move will let the Draper site develop as a hub for software companies and other firms.

Wednesday’s meeting of the prison relocation board marked the first gathering since lawmakers changed the board’s membership and refined its mission.

The 11-member committee of elected officials and community members will recommend whether the state should move the prison, and if so, where the

new site should be and how the current site should be developed.

The previous incarnation of the board conducted a similar but more general study of the issue last year.

That board took the temperature of development firms to see what kind of interest and approach there was in the project, and gathered updated data.

In December, the board recommended that the state pursue the project, which is estimated to cost as much as \$600 million.

State Sen. Scott Jenkins, R-Plain City, served on last year’s board, and said during this year’s legislative session that the overall cost of selling the land at the current location and constructing a more efficient prison that requires fewer guards will save the state money.

Together, the state could recoup about two-thirds of the relocation costs, he said.

Additionally, he said the state could see savings in the future since it will no longer need to pay maintenance at the current facility, which opened in 1951.

Before the prison moved to Draper about 60 years ago, the state prison was located in what is now Sugar House Park. The state also operates the Central Utah Correctional Facility in Gunnison.

Leaders studying the issue have not zeroed in on a potential new site for the prison.

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AGs from Western States Urge Opposition to Online Sales Tax

HELENA, Mont. (AP) • The attorneys general from three states without sales taxes sent letters to all 435 U.S. House representatives Wednesday urging them to oppose an Internet tax bill, saying the measure is unconstitutional and could prompt a legal challenge if it passes.

The bill, which was approved by the Senate last month, would allow states to require retailers to collect taxes on sales of products purchased by online shoppers in those states. Currently, states can only require retailers to collect sales taxes if they have a physical presence in the state.

The bill would also apply to sales made through catalogs and radio and television advertisements.

Supporters say the measure is about fairness

for the brick-and-mortar companies that must compete with online companies that don’t collect sales taxes.

Attorneys General Tim Fox of Montana, Michael Geraghty of Alaska and Ellen Rosenblum of Oregon said in their letter the proposal has legal and economic pitfalls. They claim the bill is an unconstitutional violation of due process because it allows states to collect taxes from retailers that have little or no contact with that state.

They also say it is overly burdensome to require small businesses to collect and remit taxes to what they estimated would be 9,600 cities, counties and states.

The bill’s passage would prompt years of “costly, protracted and unnecessary litigation,” the letter said.

FORMER PGA TOUR PLAYER MILLER BARBER DIES AT 82

Miller Barber, the unique-swinging golfer who made the most combined starts on the PGA and Champions tours, has died. He was 82.

The PGA Tour said Wednesday that Barber died Tuesday. The tour didn’t provide details of the death.

Barber, nicknamed “Mr. X,” played in 1,297 tournaments on the PGA Tour and 50-and-over circuit. He won 11 times in 694 PGA Tour starts and added 24 victories in 603 events on the Champions Tour.

“We are saddened by the passing of Miller Barber,” PGA Tour Commissioner Tim Finchem said in a statement. “He was a wonderful player who made his mark on the PGA Tour with 11 victories and then really ex-

celled on Champions Tour, becoming one of its best players in the tour’s formative years. Miller and the Champions Tour’s other early stars helped establish the tour and make it the tremendous success it has become. Golf has lost a great man and competitor.”

Barber was born in March 31, 1931, in Shreveport, La., and grew up in Texarkana, Texas. He graduated from the University of Arkansas in 1954, served in the U.S. Air Force and joined the tour in 1959. He won the 1964 Cajun Classic Open Invitational for his first tour title.

Known for his unusual swing that featured a flying right elbow, the two-time Ryder Cup player had his best chance to win a major championship in the 1969 U.S. Open at Champions Club outside Houston.

Nobel Prize-winner Robert Fogel Dies

CHICAGO (AP) • Robert W. Fogel, a University of Chicago economist whose study of the economics of slavery sparked a furious debate in academia and later helped garner him a Nobel prize, has died. He was 86.

The university announced that Fogel died on Tuesday, reporting that the family said he died after a brief illness.

Fogel wrote 22 books in all — the last one published in April — and, according to the school, was an active faculty member in the Department of Economics and the Booth School of Business who was working on three more books at the time of his death.

Fogel first rose to prominence among economists in the early 1960s when as a Ph.D. student at Johns Hopkins University he conducted a statistical analysis of the impact railroads had on the nation’s economy in the 19th century. That led to a book, “Railroads and American Economic Growth: Essays in Economic History,” in which he contended that the railroads had a far smaller impact on the economy than was widely believed at the time.

But it was his work on slavery that brought Fogel the most attention. In “Time on

the Cross: The Economics of American Negro Slavery,” a book published in 1974, Fogel and co-author Stanley Engerman “challenged the long-held assumption, by then taken as fact, that slavery was unprofitable, inefficient and in decline in the years leading up to the Civil War,” according to an article released by the school.

Instead, Fogel and Enger-

man concluded that farms where slaves were used were as productive as those where they weren’t.

Fogel spent decades at the University of Chicago, joining the faculty in 1964. After leaving for Harvard University in 1975, he returned to the university for good in 1981.

In 1993, the Royal Swedish Academy awarded Fogel the Nobel Memorial Prize in

Economic Sciences. He shared the award with Douglass North, a professor at Washington University in St. Louis.

In the citation, the academy praised Fogel “for having renewed research in economic history by applying economic theory and quantitative methods in order to explain economic and institutional change.”

Clay was appointed Gary’s mayor in 2006 after Mayor Scott King abruptly resigned. Clay was elected to a full term in 2007.



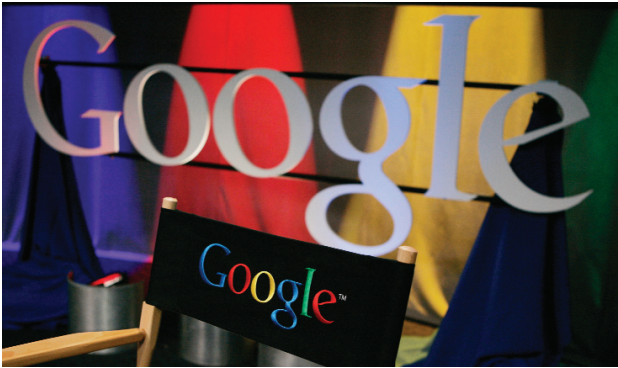
GOOGLE ASKS TO PUBLISH MORE US GOV'T INFORMATION

SAN FRANCISCO (AP) • Google is asking the Obama administration for permission to disclose more details about the U.S. government's demands for email and other personal information transmitted online in an effort to distance itself from an Internet dragnet.

In a show of unity, Google rivals Microsoft Corp. and Facebook Inc. also supported the attempt to pressure the U.S. Justice Department to loosen the legal muzzle that

limits disclosures about government surveillance authorized by courts to protect national security.

Google made its plea in a Tuesday letter to Attorney General Eric Holder and FBI Director Robert Mueller. Google is trying to debunk media reports that the company has created a way for the National Security Agency to gain access to large amounts of its users' online communications as part of a secret program code-named "PRISM."

NSA Director: Programs Disrupted Dozens of Attacks

WASHINGTON (AP) • The director of the National Security Agency said Wednesday that once-secret surveillance programs disrupted dozens of terrorist attacks, explicitly describing for Congress how the programs worked in collecting Americans' phone records and tapping into their Internet activity.

Vigorously defending the programs, Gen. Keith Alexander said the public needs to know how the programs operate amid growing concerns that government efforts to secure the nation are encroaching on Americans' privacy and civil liberties.

"I do think it's important that we get this right and I want the American people to know that we're trying to be transparent here, protect civil liberties and privacy but also the security of this country," Alexander told a Senate panel.

Alexander said he will provide additional information to the Senate Intelligence Committee in a closed session on Thursday and hopes to have as many details as possible within a week. He said he wants the information to be checked first by other agencies to ensure that the details are correct.

But he also warned that disclosures about the secret programs have eroded agency capabilities and, as a result, U.S. allies and Americans won't be as safe as they were two weeks ago.

"Some of these are still going to be classified and should be, because if we tell the terrorists every way that we're going to track them, they will get through and Americans will die," he said, adding that he would rather be criticized by people who think he's hiding something "than jeopardize the security of this country."

He was questioned at length by sen-



ators seeking information on exactly how much data the NSA collects and the legal backing for the activities. He did not give details on the terror plots he said had been disrupted.

Half a world away, Edward Snowden, the former contractor who fled to Hong Kong and leaked the documents, said he's not there to hide from justice and has faith in "the courts and people of Hong Kong to decide my fate."

"I am neither traitor nor hero. I'm an American," Snowden told the *South China Morning Post* about his disclosures of top-secret surveillance programs that have rocked Washington.

Snowden said in the interview published Wednesday that he hasn't dared contact his family or his girlfriend since coming forward as the leaker of NSA documents. "I am worried about the pressure they are feeling from the FBI," he said.

The FBI visited his father's house in Pennsylvania on Monday.

Snowden resurfaced in the Chinese newspaper after dropping out of sight since Sunday. Snowden said he wanted to fight the U.S. government in Hong Kong's courts and would stay unless "asked to leave." Hong Kong is a Chinese autonomous region that maintains a Western-style legal system and freedom of speech.

U.S. law enforcement officials have said they are building a case against Snowden but have yet to bring charges. Hong Kong has an extradition treaty with the United States; there are exceptions in cases of political persecution or where there are concerns over cruel or humiliating treatment.

Snowden told the paper from a location the paper didn't disclose that he has no plans to leave.

"I have had many opportunities to flee (Hong Kong), but I would rather stay and fight the US government in the courts, because I have faith in (Hong Kong's) rule of law," he said.

On Tuesday, a phalanx of FBI, legal and intelligence officials briefed the entire House in an attempt to explain National Security Agency programs that collect millions of Americans' phone and Internet records. Since they were revealed last week, the programs have provoked distrust in the Obama administration from around the world.

House members were told not to disclose information they heard in the briefing because it is classified. Several said they left with unanswered questions.

"People aren't satisfied," Rep. Tim Murphy, R-Pa., said as he left the briefing Tuesday. "More detail needs to come out."

Attorney in Florida Robbery Case Seeks NSA Phone Records

MIAMI (AP) • The lawyer for a man on trial in a South Florida armored car robbery is seeking cellphone records possibly produced by a recently revealed National Security Agency surveillance program, according to federal court documents.

Attorney Marshall Dore Louis said in the court papers that the Justice Department is required to turn over the phone records if they exist because they could be crucial to his client's defense. Louis represents defendant Terrance Brown in the Broward County bank robbery case, which involved the killing of an armored car messenger in October 2010.

Prosecutors say they are missing a month of Brown's records from two phones because his service provider at the time, MetroPCS, no longer has them. But Louis says the NSA most likely collected data on Brown's calls and that the defense is entitled to access because they may show Brown wasn't involved in a previous July robbery attempt.

"The government must be ordered to turn over the records for the two telephones that it attributes to Mr. Brown for the dates

which are relevant to this case," Louis said in the motion.

U.S. District Judge Robin Rosenbaum told the Justice Department to respond by the end of Wednesday on whether disclosure of the data — if they exist — would harm national security. The judge also said she would review whether the NSA surveillance, authorized by the secret Foreign Intelligence Surveillance Court, was legally conducted.

George Washington University law professor Jonathan Turley, who has litigated national security cases, said he hadn't heard of this approach being used in court before.

"The chances that he will succeed in pulling these calls out of the bowels of the federal government are rather slim," Turley said.

But he said it would make for a novel case because the government usually invokes some sort of protection against disclosure, but in this case it has already acknowledged the program.

He noted that the past 48 hours have already seen "an explosion of demands in litigation" challenging the government's phone records collection program.

Orwell's '1984' Soars on Amazon after NSA Surveillance Reports

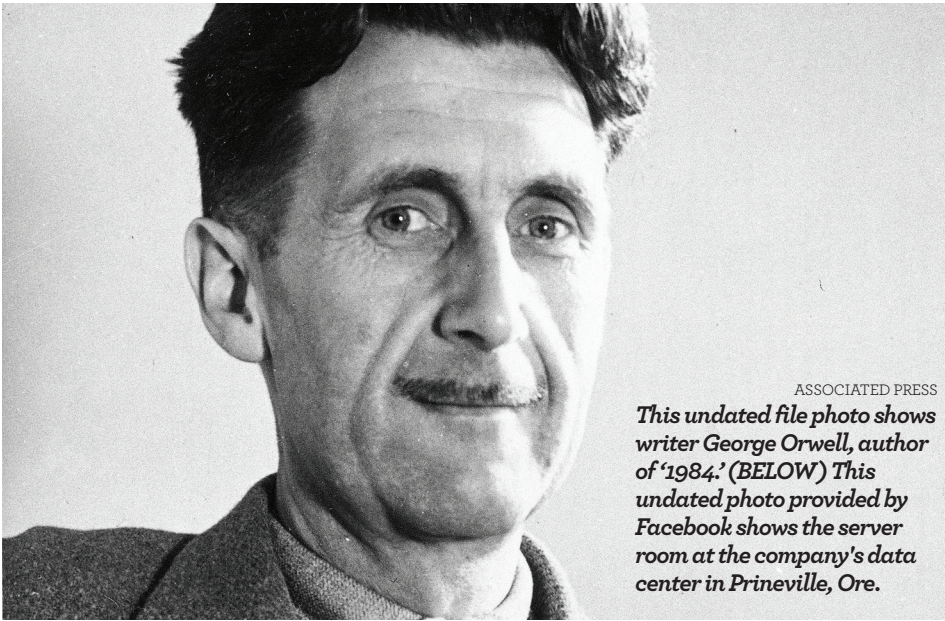
Sales of George Orwell's novel "1984," featuring a futuristic totalitarian state, jumped on Amazon.com's website following reports of a classified program that lets the U.S. government collect personal data.

One edition of the book, originally published in 1949, moved to the No. 3 spot on Amazon's Movers & Shakers list, which tracks dramatic increases in sales volume over a 24-hour period. That made it the 100th-best-selling book on the site late Tuesday, an increase from its previous rank of 11,855.

The sales gains come after the revelation of a top-secret electronic-surveillance program that allows the National Security Agency and the FBI to access data from audio and video chats, photographs, emails, documents and connection logs from the biggest U.S. Internet companies. *The Washington Post* and the British-based Guardian reported the program's existence last week.

Orwell's novel portrays a dystopian society where individuals are monitored through ubiquitous television screens and overseen by a leader called Big Brother.

Barnes & Noble has seen a "significant spike in sales recently as government surveil-

lance and Orwell have been paired in the news," even though the book is consistently a top seller, said Patricia Bostelman, vice president of marketing at the bookseller.

On Amazon, another publication of "1984" jumped to 179th from 626th, while a separate edition including "Animal Farm" another Orwell work along with "1984" reached 228th on the list, up from 656th.

At the Strand Book Store in New York, sales of the novel have increased more than 50 percent from an average of about 12 copies a week, according to Carson Moss, a buyer for the store. He attributed the increase to the reports of NSA spying as well as



the prospect that the book was included on schools' summer reading lists.

None of the booksellers disclose statistics on who is buying the books.

Idaho High School Drops Redskins Mascot

DRIGGS (AP) • An Idaho high school will drop its longtime “Redskins” nickname, logo and mascot in a move its top administrator says was made to show respect for Native Americans.

The decision at Teton High School in Driggs is a way to encourage students and the community to see beyond skin color and stereotypes, said Monte

Woolstenhulm, superintendent of District 401. Motivation also came from renewed efforts nationally to change nicknames and logos deemed offensive to many Native Americans.

“Students need to be taught to see people beyond the color of their skin,” said Woolstenhulm, who was a student at the school. “They need to get to know who

people are without using nicknames or assumptions based on outward appearances.

Woolstenhulm expects the decision will draw some criticism, but dropping the name won initial approval from the school board Monday night.

Last month, 10 members of Congress sent letters to the owner of the Washing-

ton Redskins NFL and the league commissioner urging the team to change the name. The letter to team owner Daniel Snyder says that “Native Americans throughout the country consider the ‘R-word’ a racial, derogatory slur akin to the ‘N-word’ among African Americans.

Snyder has vowed he will never change the nick-

name. On Wednesday, NFL Commissioner Roger Goodell responded to the congressional pressure, calling the Redskins nickname a “unifying force that stands for strength, courage, pride and respect.”

The name is also the subject of a legal challenge from a group seeking to have the team lose its trademark protection.

The farmers contend that Monsanto failed to take steps to make sure the genetically engineered plants didn’t contaminate regular wheat through cross-pollination, mixing of seeds or other means. Because the wheat industry uses a system that gathers and commingles wheat from thousands of farms for sales and shipping, the farmers contend Monsanto should have known that it would be virtually impossible to prevent the Roundup Ready wheat from infiltrating the non-genetically engineered wheat supply.

“Monsanto knew, or should have known, that the existence of genetically-engineered wheat — commingled with the general wheat supply — would cause significant disruptions in the wheat export market, and that such a situation could involve huge disruptions in the wheat trade while imposing additional costs on U.S. wheat farmers and specifically Pacific Northwest soft white wheat farmers. These costs eventually would detrimentally impact worldwide prices for Pacific Northwest soft white wheat, causing significant financial damage to wheat farmers,” attorney Benjamin Schwartzman wrote in the lawsuit.

The farmers say the discovery of the genetically engineered wheat growing in Oregon has diminished prices for all soft white wheat because of the loss of export and domestic markets, and that it has also increased costs for growers who must go through extensive testing to prove the wheat from their fields isn’t contaminated with genetically engineered wheat before they can sell to some buyers.

Just before noon yesterday, a line of children waited for lunch. Families spread out around the park, sitting at tables or on blankets.

Around south-central Idaho, school districts and non-profit organizations regularly provide free summer lunches for children ages 1 to 18.

Income doesn’t matter; anyone can come to the program funded by the U.S. Department of Agriculture.

Some local sites already are seeing more children this year.

Last year, about 2,000 children ate lunches through the Twin Falls School District’s 15 sites, said Food Services Supervisor Susan Henderson.

That number could climb to 2,200 this summer, she said. Lunch sites have been “really busy” so far, and they only began serving Monday.

The lunches continue on weekdays through Aug. 23.

The program started small here at least eight years ago, said Henderson, who

Sites have been added since, and more children have been fed. “I think there’s a real need for it,” Henderson said.

The program requires the kids to stay and eat their meals on site. Parents can buy a lunch for \$3.85.

The program enables families to give their children at least one nutritious meal a day, Henderson said. “It just makes the food available.”

About 250 children - 100 more than expected - have been showing up daily at Kimberly City Park, said Roxanne Mumm, food service supervisor for the Kimberly School District.

“It’s a pretty good indication that the lunches are needed here in Kimberly,” Mumm said.

The number of Jerome’s young diners has been about normal, said Food Service Supervisor Carolyn Sullivan. That school district is providing lunches Monday through Thursday this summer at Jerome Middle School, Jerome High School and

Gayle Forsyth Memorial Park. It also offers free breakfasts from 7:30 to 8 a.m. at the middle school.

“It’s just available for all children who might otherwise go hungry,” Sullivan said.

Plea Change Scheduled in Craigslist Rape Solicitation Case

Can Rubio Win over His Fellow Republicans on Immigration?

The attempted seduction of Senator John Cornyn by immigration reformers is akin to my effort to get Neil Patrick Harris, the best emcee ever of any awards show, to sing at my next birthday. No matter how much I offer him, he'll turn me down.

That's the situation in which Sen. Marco Rubio of Florida finds himself with several Republican colleagues. Take his wooing of Cornyn, of Texas. Cornyn is just not that into immigration reform. He won reelection comfortably in 2008 by 12 points, despite losing the Hispanic vote by 25 points.

But Rubio is willing to poison his own bill, which the Senate voted June 11 to take up, to get him on board. Cornyn wants to link heightened border security to a path to citizenship for the more than 11 million people already in the U.S. illegally. This would make an onerous legislative process impossibly more onerous.

Unlike many of his colleagues — including his state's junior senator, Ted Cruz, who wants anyone already here illegally to automatically be barred forever from legal status — Cornyn gets heard because he's seemingly on the fence. On television last weekend, Rubio tipped his hat to Cornyn: "If we cannot secure the border and cannot take the necessary steps to earn our colleagues' trust, this will never become law." The same sentiment was voiced by two other Republican senators, Tom Coburn of Oklahoma and Jeff Flake of Arizona.

Republicans in the Senate's Gang of Eight, the bipartisan group that wrote the immigration reform bill, look like they're willing to drown their own measure with amendments. In the Senate Judiciary Committee, 301 amendments were offered, 162 were voted on, and 92 were approved. One of the more prolific amenders is Charles Grassley of Iowa, who was responsible for about 30 percent of them, even managing to bring up an old grudge over what South Korea did to the farmers of his state during the mad-cow crisis in 2003.

Guess who's in charge of the bill on the floor? Mr. Amendment himself, Charles Grassley. Rubio, who signals he's no sure vote himself, introduced an amendment that requires "English proficiency" for legal status. Expect thousands more amendments before the Senate votes on the bill next month.

Yes, Republicans want a bill — a watered-down bill that nevertheless retains Democratic support. The politics of immigration are so twisted it is hard to know what people really think, regardless of how they vote. What unites all Republicans who support the bill is a desire to see the party back in the White House someday. Some of these Republicans really want to keep immigrant families together. Others don't give a hoot about deporting Grandpa. (There are also those who will simply vote their consciences, but that group is too small to count.)

Weaving his way through this minefield is Rubio, who is looking over his shoulder at Rush Limbaugh, who could sour on him at any moment. Rubio's easiest job is to write off his outspoken colleagues such as Jeff Sessions of Alabama and Cruz. There's nothing he can do to get them. His focus is the Cornyns of the Senate, who want so many concessions that Democrats, who thought they had a deal with Rubio, begin to peel off. And if the bill fails, Rubio is deprived of a shiny object to take into a national election.

Any more concessions and it would be like turning over my Frequent Flier miles to Neil Patrick Harris, who's never going to help blow out the candles on my cake. With a thousand amendments to come, and all those Cornyns to keep happy, Rubio may well find that sweet spot where Republican conservatives come on board and Democrats don't jump off. Maybe, just maybe, our dysfunctional Senate can pass a bill to fix our dysfunctional immigration system. Let's not think about wooing a dysfunctional House.

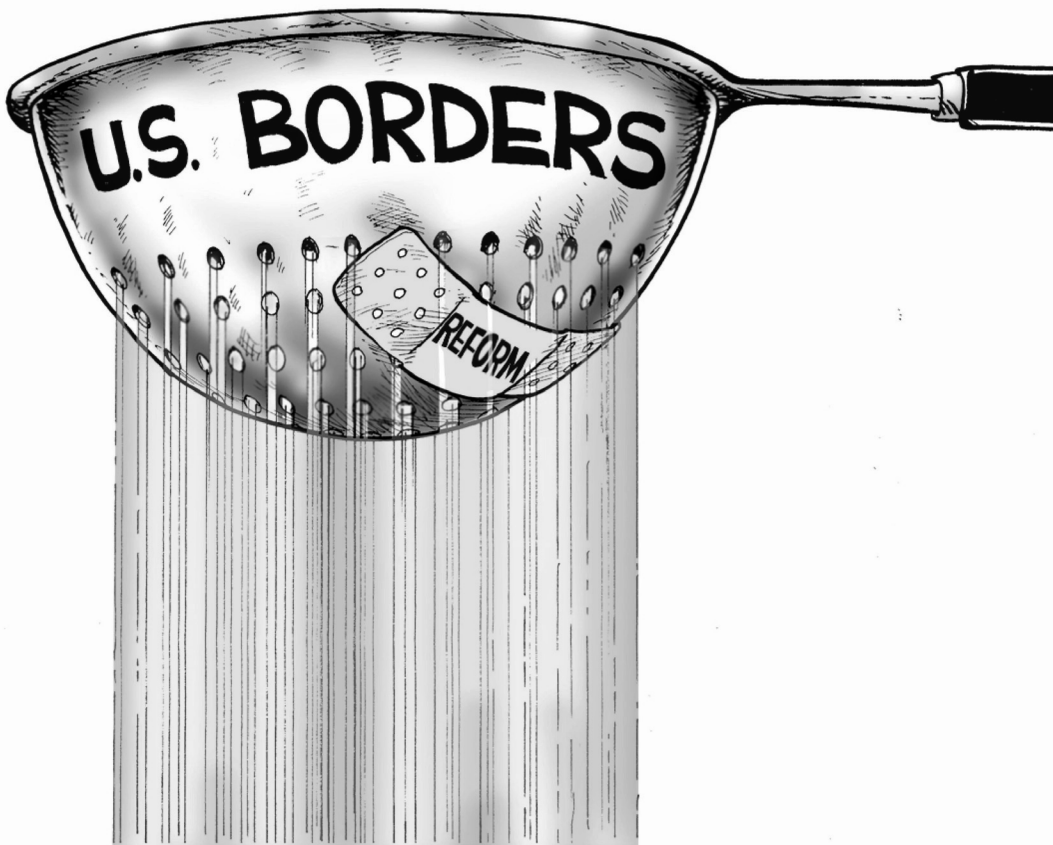

Too Sweet to Kill: Taxing Sugar



market is allocated for imports from particular countries at a preferential tariff rate. Minimum prices are guaranteed for sugar from cane and beets. Surplus sugar — meaning that which U.S. producers cannot profitably sell — is bought by the government and sold at a loss to producers of ethanol, another program whose irrationalities are ubiquitous.

All this probably means \$3.7 billion in higher sugar costs. It also means scores of thousands of lost jobs as manufacturers of candy and products with significant sugar content move jobs to countries where they can pay the much lower world price of sugar. The big companies like Mars and Hershey can locate plants around the world. The hundreds of family-owned American candy companies cannot. In the last four years, the U.S. price has averaged between 64 percent to 92 percent higher than the world price. The costs are dispersed to 316 million consumers. The benefits accrue primarily to 4,700 sugar beet and sugar cane farms.

What begins in Washington as simple garden-vari-

ety grasping becomes an entitlement, the argument being that the longer the benefit has lived, the more its beneficiaries have built their lives around it, so ending it would be disruptive. Again, the Senate voted not on ending sugar protectionism but on making it slightly less irrational.

Sugar protectionism is government planning. It is industrial policy — government picking winners and losers — applied to agriculture. It is politics supplanting the market in allocating wealth and opportunity. And it is perfectly all right with 20 of the 45 Republican senators.

That many voted against modest reforms, thereby rendering themselves forever ineligible to speak the language of limited government. One of them is known as tea-party-favorite (this compound word is his first name, judging by the way he is constantly identified by the media) Marco Rubio. He is fluent in that language but he represents Florida. Actually, he represents the state's sugar cane growers better than he does its 19.3 million sugar consumers, or his own tea party expostulations. Texas, too, has cane growers but Sen. Ted Cruz, elected by espousing tea party principles, voted for those principles by voting for reform.

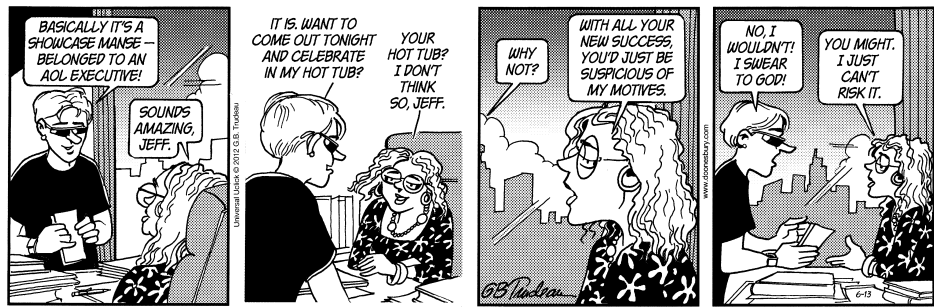
President Lincoln's

biggest blunder was — no, not Gen. George McClellan — creating the Agriculture Department. Since 1995, 75 percent of all agriculture subsidies have gone to the largest and wealthiest 10 percent of farms. Largely because of steadily loosened eligibility criteria — loosened at the collaborative behest of agriculture interests and the "caring class" (i.e., welfare workers) — food stamps are now used by 48 million Americans.

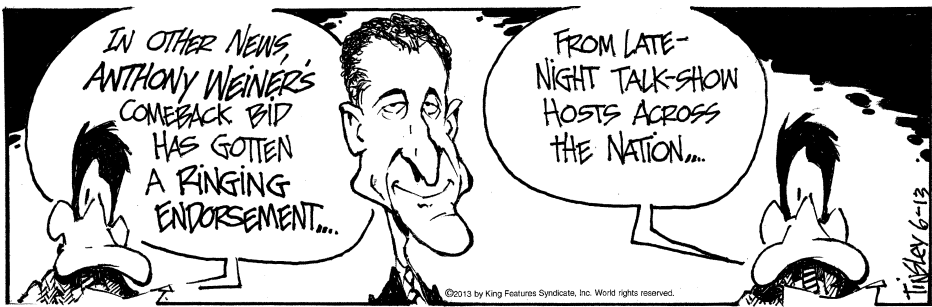
The stamps buy less than they would were sugar quotas not raising the price of every edible thing, from ketchup to bread to yogurt, that contains sugar. But, then, big government always is most caring about the strong, the articulate and the organized.

About 6,700 generations (200,000 years of 30-year generations) ago, the human race arrived. About 400 generations ago, agriculture began. Seven generations ago (1800), it took five American farmers to feed one non-farmer. Until four generations ago, a majority of American workers were in agriculture. Today, less than 2 percent of the workforce are farmers, and one farm-worker feeds 300 people. But 6,700 generations from now, there will still be today's web of policies — not a safety net but a hammock — woven for the comfort of sugar producers.

Israeli PM Warns of Another Holocaust from Iranian Govt.

WARSAW, Poland (AP) • Israeli Prime Minister Benjamin Netanyahu began his two-day visit to Poland, which Germany's Nazis occupied during World War II and where they committed the genocide against the Jewish people, with a stern warning about a potential Holocaust from Iran.

Netanyahu said Wednesday the upcoming "so-called" Iranian presidential election will "change nothing" in the Islamic republic's quest for nuclear weapons and that the regime will continue to pursue a bomb aimed at destroying Israel. Iran insists its uranium enrichment program has only peaceful goals.

Iran's election overseers have approved a list of would-be hopefuls, most of them loyalists favored by both the theocracy and the military, and any future president will likely side with the supreme leadership's nuclear aspirations.

"This is a regime that is building nuclear weapons with the expressed purpose

to annihilate Israel's 6 million Jews," Netanyahu said, alluding to the number of Jews killed by the Nazis during World War II. "We will not allow this to happen. We will never allow another Holocaust."

Israel considers Iran its greatest threat because of its support of Islamic militant groups, its arsenal of long-range missiles and primarily its advanced nuclear program. Netanyahu's comments in Warsaw carried added significance since they came a day before he travels to the former Nazi death camp of Auschwitz in southern Poland, where he is to inaugurate a new pavilion meant to educate visitors about the Holocaust and the Nazi Germany's quest to exterminate the Jewish people.

Netanyahu, whose father was born in Warsaw, has an emotional connection to the Holocaust, although he has faced criticism for citing it frequently in the context of current events, notably regarding the potential nuclear threat from Iran.

Feds: Bulger at Center of Murder, Mayhem in Boston

BOSTON (AP) • Reputed gangster James "Whitey" Bulger was a "hands-on killer" responsible for "murder and mayhem" in Boston for almost 30 years, a federal prosecutor told a jury Wednesday as Bulger's highly anticipated racketeering trial began.

Bulger's lawyer acknowledged that Bulger made millions through drugs, illegal gambling and loan-sharking, but told the jury that three ex-mobsters who have pinned murders on Bulger cannot be believed. Each of the men received "extraordinary" deals from prosecutors in exchange for their cooperation, defense attorney J.W. Carney Jr. said.

The defense also denied prosecution claims that Bulger was an FBI informant for years and provided information on the rival New England Mafia.

Bulger, now 83, was one of the nation's most wanted fugitives when he fled Boston in 1994 after receiving a tip from his former FBI handler, John Connolly, that he was about to be indicted. He was finally captured in 2011 in Santa Monica, Calif., where he had been living with his longtime girlfriend in a rent-controlled apartment.

The defense went after the three once-loyal Bulger cohorts who are expected to be the prosecution's star witnesses: convicted hit man John Martorano, former Bulger partner Stephen "The Rifleman" Flemmi and former Bulger lieutenant Kevin Weeks.

Carney said Martorano, who served 12 years in prison after admitting to killing 20 people, was able to dictate the terms of his deal with prosecutors.

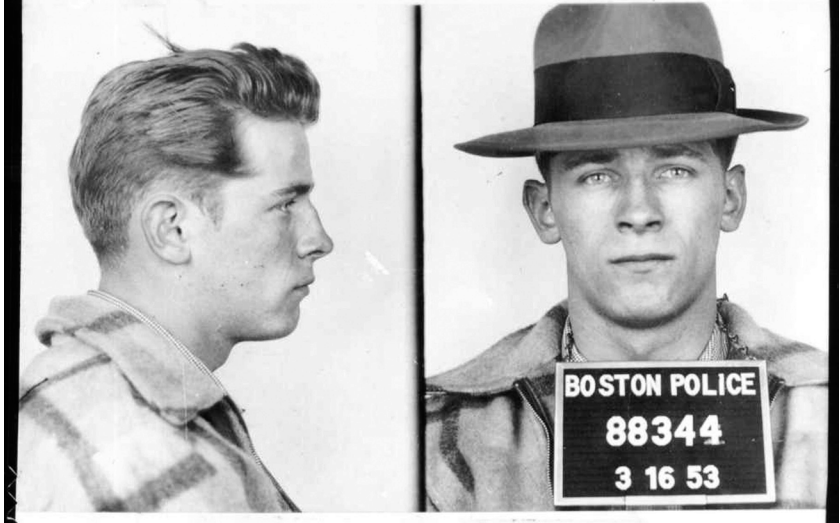
"The federal government was so desperate to have John Martorano testify ... they basically put their hands up in the air and said, 'Take anything you want,'" Carney said.

Kelly said Bulger headed the Winter Hill Gang, a violent group that "ran amok" in Boston for three decades, killing 19 people, extorting millions of dollars from drug dealers and other criminals, and corrupting police and FBI agents.

"At the center of all this murder and mayhem is one man — the defendant in this case, James Bulger," Kelly said.

Kelly offered chilling details of several of the killings, including the 1984 shooting death of John McIntyre. Authorities say he was killed after Bulger learned he had become an informant.

Kelly said Bulger chained McIntyre to a chair, interrogated him at gunpoint for hours, then tried to strangle him with a



rope, but it didn't kill him.

"Bulger asks him, 'You want one in the head?'" and McIntyre says, 'Yes, please,'" Kelly said.

Bulger then shot McIntyre, he said.

Kelly also described how Bulger allegedly strangled two 26-year-old women: Debra Davis, Flemmi's girlfriend, and Deborah Hussey, daughter of Flemmi's common-law wife.

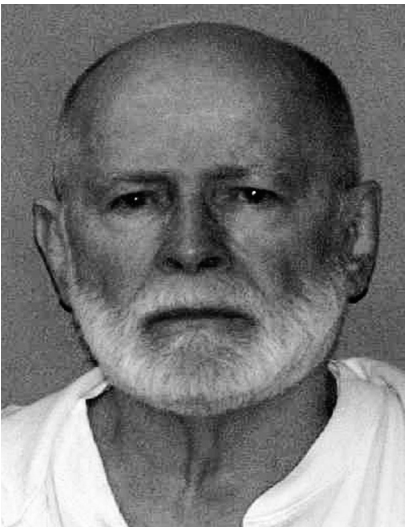
Flemmi has testified previously that he watched Bulger kill both women. Weeks testified that he was also present when Bulger killed Hussey. Bulger, Kelly said, was a "hands-on killer who was the leader of an extensive criminal enterprise." Bulger's lawyer, however, said Flemmi is the one who killed the women and decided to pin the murders on Bulger after Bulger fled Boston in 1994.

Carney said Bulger had no motive to kill Davis or Hussey, who were close to Flemmi, but not Bulger.

Carney insisted that Bulger was not an FBI informant but instead paid FBI agents to tip him off when he and his gang were being investigated or about to be indicted. "James Bulger never, ever — the evidence will show — was an informant," Carney said.

Carney said it went against Bulger's Irish heritage to be an informant. He also said Bulger was not close enough to members of the local Mafia to provide any useful information to authorities.

Carney said former FBI agent John Connolly — who was convicted of racketeering for tipping Bulger and Flemmi to an indictment — fabricated a lengthy FBI informant file for Bulger to cover up the fact that he was regularly seen meeting with Bulger. Kelly said Bulger's gang succeeded by instilling fear in other criminals

and corrupting Connolly and other law enforcement officials.

"It was part of a strategy they had, and it worked for them," Kelly said.

Kelly slowly read the names of each of the 19 victims while showing their pictures to the jury.

The first prosecution witness, retired state police Lt. Robert Long, identified surveillance video and photos of Bulger taken during a 1980 investigation. The video showed Bulger meeting with various organized crime figures at an auto repair garage in Boston's North End. Testimony was set to resume Thursday.

Defense Hints at Plea in Ohio Kidnapping Case

A man accused of holding three women captive in his home for about a decade pleaded not guilty Wednesday, and the defense hinted that a trial can be avoided with a plea if he escapes the death penalty. Attorney Craig Weintraub addressed the death penalty issue after his client, 52-year-old Ariel Castro, pleaded not guilty to hundreds of charges including rape and kidnapping.

Weintraub said the defense was working to avoid an "unnecessary trial" involving the death penalty. Current charges he faces involving an alleged forced miscarriage don't include death penalty specifications, but the prosecutor says that's under review.

"Mr. Castro currently faces hundreds of years in prison with the current charges," Weintraub said after the arraignment. "It is our hope that we can continue to work toward a resolution to avoid having an unnecessary trial about aggravated murder and the death penalty."

Fish and Wildlife Service Proposes Endangered Listing for Chimpanzees

The federal government moved Tuesday to declare all chimpanzees endangered, an

act that would provide stronger protections and potentially end nearly a century of using great apes as test subjects for invasive medical research.

In announcing the propos-

al, Fish and Wildlife Service Director Dan Ashe said that a 1990 decision by the agency to classify wild chimps as endangered and captive chimps as threatened, a designation that carries fewer protections, was flawed.

The "split listing" under the Endangered Species Act, the only one in the history of the agency, was designed to allow the National Institutes of Health to fund medical experiments using captive chimps, he said in an interview.

Ashe said the new rule sends a clear message that,

contrary to popular belief, the survival of all chimps is threatened. More than a million have disappeared from the wild since the beginning of the 20th century, according to estimates by the International Union for the Conservation of Nature and Natural Resources.

Fewer than 300,000 remain, as people invade chimpanzee habitats, using the land to farm and hunting the animals for meat, according to IUCN's Red List of Threatened Species.

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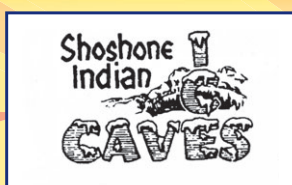

New Bridge Links Urban Nature Retreats

HAILEY • Carol Blackburn has tended the Sawtooth Botanical Garden for 17 years. But nowadays when the Shoshone woman needs a change of scenery, she heads for the new Bow Bridge and the Draper Wood River Preserve, which sits along the Big Wood River in the heart of Hailey.

There she eats her lunch on a bench of Douglas fir as she watches the Big Wood flow. From a boardwalk she watches some 48 bird species flitting among the cattails. She examines the dogwood, chokecherry, wild rose, currant and elderberry that students from Hailey Elementary School and Pioneer Montessori planted.

“They’re poking right along,” she said.

This area has an entirely new flavor since the Wood River Land Trust took it

TWIN FALLS • After docking her pontoon boat named “River Angel” on the banks of the Snake River, Kathy Peterson looked skyward after someone above signaled like a bird. “Ka-kaw!”

Peterson smiled and called back, “ka-kaw!”

A few minutes later Sean Chuma, a Twin Falls BASE jumper, leaped from the middle of the Perrine Bridge, his blue parachute blossoming as he drifted to a stop about 20 feet from Peterson. Chuma landed safely, but Peterson was there just in case he didn’t.

...

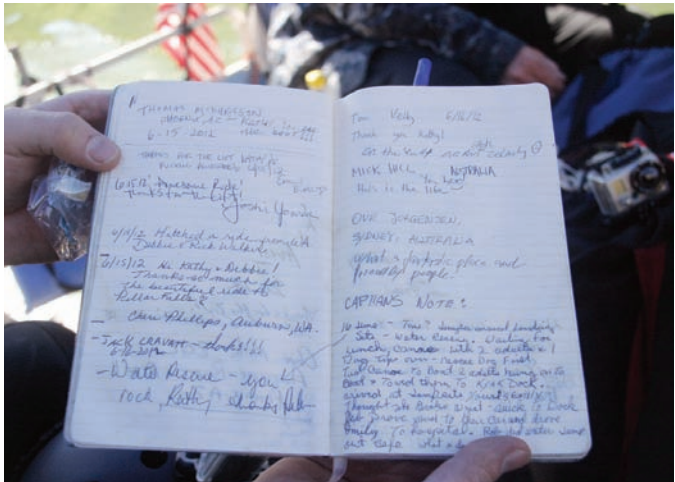
Three years ago, Peterson started to keep her eyes to the sky, patrolling the waters of the Snake River Canyon. If a jumper lands in the water — or worse — she is there to help if needed.

An Air Force and Navy veteran, Peterson does this on her own time and free of charge to BASE jumpers, kayakers, canoers or anyone else in the waters.

She has formed a friendship with the BASE jumping community. In turn, BASE jumpers from around the world have donated money to the Disabled Veterans Courtesy Cart Program that gives veterans, seniors and disabled people rides at

money donated by BASE jumpers after rides on her boat funds the cart program, which has two running golf carts and one in need of repairs.

BASE jumpers “do more than people think,” Peterson said.

Peterson said a lot of trash gets blown down into the canyon but gestured around her, “Do you see any trash?”

Two years ago an American flag planted at the bottom of the canyon was stolen, Peterson said. It was BASE jumpers who replaced the flag.

“Here these people are from a foreign country and they replaced the American flag,” Peterson said.

BASE jumpers have also done volunteer work for Magic Valley veterans.

A few months back, Bob Jackson, a retired Navy veteran, said high winds damaged the roof of the DAV Hall in Twin Falls.

“The wind blew everything right off and these guys came in and replaced everthing. They even

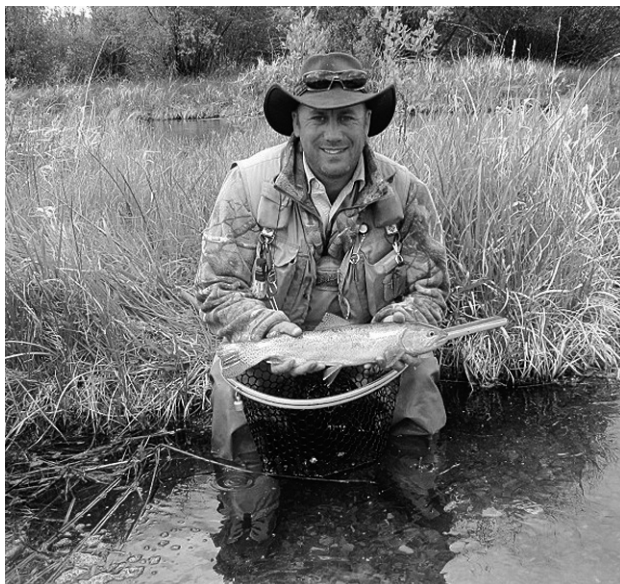
The ranger station is about three miles south of Stanley on Highway 75, the Sawtooth Scenic Byway.

bought all the materials," Jackson said.

He estimated that the repair would have cost around \$1,000.

Forest Service Allows New Mountain Bike Trails on Bald Mountain

KETCHUM • Ketchum District Ranger Kurt Nelson authorized Sun Valley Co. to construct 11 miles of new summer mountain biking trails on the National Forest portion of Bald Mountain Ski Area.

The decision allows Sun Valley Co. to begin construction of the first trail in August; other new trails are expected over the next four to six years.

The Forest Service gathered public comments about the trail proposal, and those who commented may appeal during a 45-day period.

"My decision to authorize construction of new mountain biking trails on Bald Mountain is based upon my belief that con-

centrating new 'flow' trail construction within an existing ski area makes both economic and environmental sense," Nelson said in a press release. "Year-round resource-based recreation and summer facilities on Bald Mountain are consistent with national direction for ski resorts on National Forest lands, specifically the Ski Area Recreational Opportunity Enhancement Act of 2011."

June 14 Talk Features Historical Ruby Mountains Photos

ELKO, Nev. • The Forest Service will host a talk on the 1868 King Expedition's photography in the Ruby Mountains.

It's 6-8 p.m. June 14 at Great Basin College, Room 130, in the Greenhaw Technical Arts Building. Gary Reese from Las Vegas will present results of his field work completed in 2012.

Reese re-located and re-photographed 41 viewpoints of the Ruby Mountains which were first photographed by famed Civil War photographer Timothy O'Sullivan on the King Expedition that surveyed portions of the Great Basin.

Clarence King organized the Geological and Geographical Survey of the Fortieth Parallel under the Army's sponsorship. His

survey report included practical information of use to the mining industry. King's quest for good science led to reports that were the first thoroughly professional studies of the Western environment, a Forest Service release said.

This set of historical images represents some of the earliest known photographs of the Ruby Mountains. The comparison will be useful to land managers, scientists and others studying natural history, climate change, fire history and range conditions in the Rubies, the Forest Service said.

Junior Licenses

Fish and Game will no longer sell youth small game hunting licenses. Youths 10-17 may buy the Resident Junior Hunting or Nonresident Junior Mentored Hunting license.

Motorized Hunting Rule

Fish and Game's motorized hunting

rules apply only to hunting big game animals — including moose, bighorn sheep and mountain goats — in designated units from Aug. 30 through Dec. 31: Hunters may use motorized vehicles only on established roadways that are open to motorized traffic and capable of being traveled by full-sized automobiles.

The restriction applies to units 29, 30, 30A, 32, 32A, 36A, 37, 37A, , 45, 47, 49, 50, 51, 52, 52A, 53, 56, 58, 59, 59A, 66, 66A, 69, 70, 72, 73, 75, 76, 77 and 78.

Exceptions address handicapped hunters, retrieval of downed game, packing of camping equipment and private landowners on their own land; contact Fish and Game for details.

What to Expect from the Sun at its Peak

If the northern lights (aurora borealis) seem to be getting a lot of attention lately, it's not your imagination. They're just one sign that the sun is nearing the maximum of its 11-year cycle of activity.

The sun's variation is rooted in its magnetic field, which is embedded in its constituent, ionized gases. Because different parts of the sun rotate at different rates, the magnetic field gets twisted up over time.

Where knots in the field protrude from the sun, the magnetic field is concentrated, which slows the ascent of hot gases from within. The surface cools, and a dark sunspot forms. Sunspots, easily visible in a small telescope fitted with a proper solar filter, often appear in groups. Larger ones may comprise a dark central umbra, ringed by a lighter penumbra.

The jutting loops of solar magnetic field carry gases above the surface as solar prominences, but only a special (read: "expensive") hydrogen-alpha filter will show them, either as a bright plume on the solar limb, or as a dark thread silhouetted against the sun's face.

If the magnetic field loops get too twisted, they break, releasing stored magnetic energy in the form of a solar flare, sometimes accompanied by an outflow of ions called a coronal mass ejection. When these solar winds blow our way, they run into Earth's magnetic field, which channels them toward the pole, producing the aurora

when they crash into the upper atmosphere. Eventually, the convoluted solar magnetic field reaches the limit of how much energy it can store, and it fails, fragmenting into dozens of pieces. This disintegration of the global magnetic field signals the end of solar maximum, followed by a steady decrease in the number of sunspots, prominences and flares as well as a reversal of the overall field orientation.

on as a project about 15 years ago.

It was used as a city dump when Scott Boettger moved to Hailey in 1997. City workers had pushed trash along the banks and into the river to reduce flooding. There were rusted shells of automobiles, pieces of concrete, broken glass — all detracting from the beauty of an area with towering trees fed by clear mountain snowmelt.

"It wasn't the type of place most people felt comfortable frequenting," said Boettger, executive director of the land trust.

Boettger vowed to change that. He rallied volunteers to remove 55 dump trucks full of appliances and other material. They removed noxious weeds and restored a wetland. They built a boardwalk through that wetland, a platform from which to enjoy waterfowl, freshwater shrimp, mayflies and the occasional moose, mountain lion and elk that frequent the wildlife corridor.

Then the land trust engineered a land swap with the state of Idaho to create an 80-acre nature preserve.

Finally, last fall the land trust provided the missing link: a bridge that would allow nature lovers to stroll from one part of the Draper

If You Go ...

You can access the Draper Wood River Preserve at a few points.

- One is from Hailey's Heagle Park at its south end. To get there, turn west off Idaho Highway 75 onto Cedar Street just north of the Hailey Post Office. Turn left on Queen of the Hills Drive, right on Della View Drive, then follow War Eagle Drive to the park.
- Or, follow Cedar Street clear to the end to access the trails in the Cedar Bend area.
- There's another access point off Aspen Drive. To get there, turn west off Main Street onto Elm Street and follow it to Aspen Drive, turning left as you reach Aspen.
- The bridge and boardwalk are closest to the Croy Creek Road. To get there, turn west on Bullion Street, which turns into Croy Creek Road, and drive across the river to the turnoff for Lions Park.

Preserve to the boardwalk on the other side.

When part-time Sun Valley resident Leslie Howa heard of the project, she volunteered a design in the shape of a recurve bow, a target-precision shooting bow with wingtips that curve away from the archer when the bow is strung to give the arrow more acceleration.

The shape honored the American Indians that she figures camped in the area while fishing its waters. And it dovetailed with her own experience as a competitive archer who narrowly missed competing in the Olympics.

"I told Scott, 'Let's make this bridge a work of art!'" she said. "I said: I'm not a bridge builder, but I have an idea for a design like no other."

The bridge opened just before the snow flew last winter. Already it has become an iconic landmark of Hailey. A handful of weddings have been performed there. Hispanic youth have taken photos celebrating their 15th birthdays there; high schoolers have taken their senior portraits.

Now, hundreds of people stroll the woodchip and dirt paths stretching from Lawrence Heagle Park on Hailey's south side over the bridge to the boardwalk. Some cross Croy Road and climb the trail up Carbonate Ridge to a mining shaft ringed by prayer flags and a view of homes owned by actors Demi Moore and

Bruce Willis.

"It's a hidden gem just waiting to be discovered by someone who's never seen it before," said Daphne Muehle, director of development for the land trust. "It's a great family walk, what with benches along the trail. Elderly people can use it because it's flat. And the boardwalk gives you the opportunity to see wetlands and wildlife from a different perspective."

One of the treasures of the preserve is the Heart Rock Tree tucked away in the woods near the Cedar Bend neighborhood that borders the path. There, people have collected rocks that resemble hearts and placed them around a big, shady tree.

Paths ramble through the woods like a maze with little alcoves opening to beach nooks along the river. Towering trees offer shade on hot days.

The other side of the preserve near the bridge and boardwalk features a picnic shelter and a ball diamond at the adjacent Lions Park.

"I love to go in early morning — 6 a.m. is ideal — and evening because that's when you spy the most wildlife," Muehle said. "I love to listen to the calls of the birds."

THE ACES ON BRIDGE®

Bobby Wolff

"Do not stop thinking of life as an adventure. You have no security unless you can live bravely, excitingly, imaginatively; unless you can choose a challenge instead of competence."

If you ask the top players in the world how much their success is due to competence, how much to brilliance, I suspect most would say that simply mastering the act of drawing trump, taking finesses and cashing winners would suffice to succeed at all but the very highest levels of the game.

Still, sometimes one needs imagination, or flair, to bring home the impossible contract or to defeat the laydown game. Today's deal decided the qualifiers for the 1991 Venice Cup (the Ladies' World Championships). Had Great Britain not gained a game swing on this deal, they would not have qualified.

The Spanish ladies had played in five diamonds from the North seat, and the defense did their best by leading three rounds of clubs. To succeed, declarer must draw only two trumps before testing the spades. When they do not split, she can ruff out the spades and cross back to dummy by drawing the last trump. The Spanish declarer failed to get it right and went one down.

Pat Davies of Great Britain declared four spades from the South seat, after East had shown a two-suiter in hearts and clubs. The defense also led three rounds of clubs, giving declarer an easy plus 420. But how would declarer have played if the Spanish defender had cashed two clubs and deviously switched to a low diamond? If you believe East is 2-5-1-5, you might easily rise with the diamond ace and rely on the spades to behave.

ANSWER: I would not necessarily advocate opening this hand in first or second seat because of the uncomfortable rebid over a response of one spade. In third seat, passing is not an option, although whether you open one heart for the lead or one diamond is a matter for your partnership — or your conscience. Put me down as a one-heart bidder.

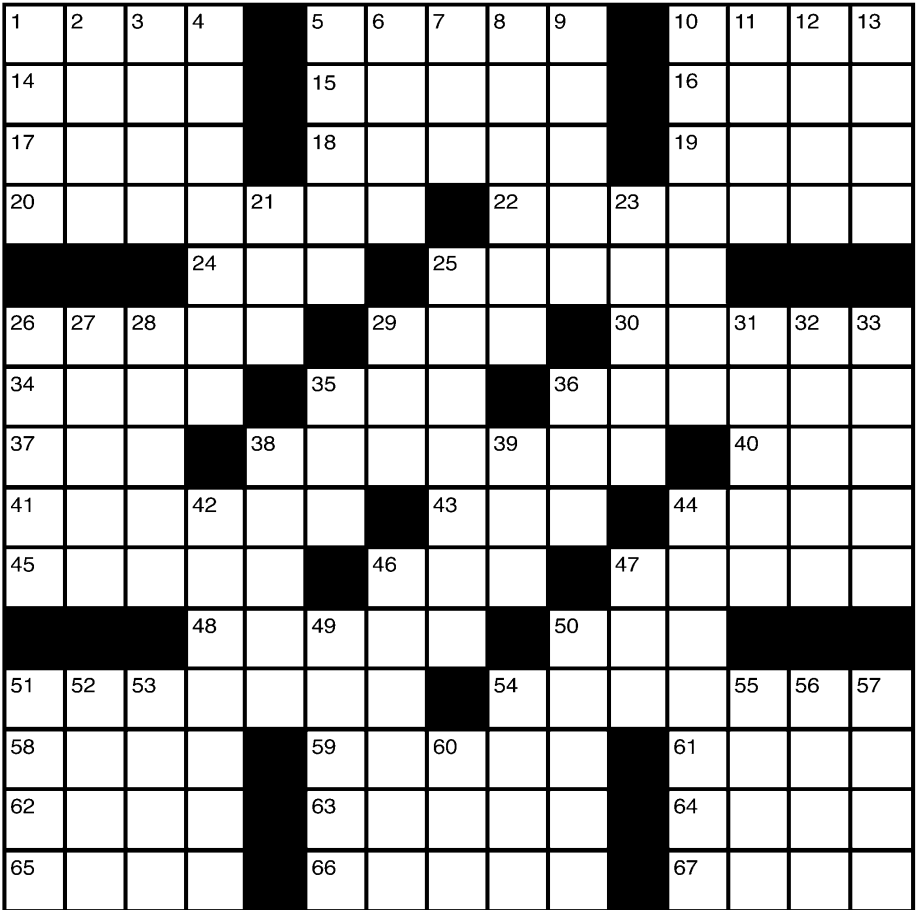

Elder abuse can be prevented if everyone would learn the warning signs and report it to Adult Protective Services or the police if they suspect it is happening.

TWIN FALLS • When she's old enough to understand, Carrick Felix's daughter will hear some wicked good yarn about her father – perhaps best told by her father. He was after all accepted by Duke University, has a bachelor's degree in communications and a master's in liberal studies from Arizona State University.

His tale – so far – doesn't have to be embellished.

She might still grow up through the best part, the precipice of which Felix may be upon now.

From a state high school championship in Arizona, to not receiving a Division I scholarship offer because he was too slight, then starring at the College of Southern Idaho and missing the 2011 national championship season by a year, to being the first JUCO player to be offered and receive a scholarship from Duke head coach Mike Krzyzewski, then, incredibly, turning it down, going back to his home state, playing at Arizona State University, and becoming one of the most improved players in the country by last season, Felix could sell his story now.

It's about to take another turn.

Before Felix prepares for his final batch of workouts prior to the 2013 NBA draft, he dropped by the CSI gymnasium this week. He played pick-up games with some old CSI players, some new ones, and even a guy who'll be in his line of a work in a month – prospective first round pick Pierre Jackson.

But that's not what Felix, the last off the court, wanted to talk about with the *Times-News* late Monday night.

Who?

That was the more important question to Felix.

"My daughter," Felix said.

How, his young daughter might ask, has daddy gotten so far in life?

Perhaps, Felix would answer, by not looking so far – either in time or space – perhaps, by looking back at her.

While his daughter lives in Twin Falls with what Felix described as a "great family and mom," he made this trip back just for her.

The 37-year-old Leffler, a two-time winner on the NASCAR Nationwide Series who had the nickname "LefTurn" above the driver's side window on his race cars, was pronounced dead shortly after 9 p.m., New Jersey State Police said.

"NASCAR extends its thoughts, prayers and deepest sympathies to the family of Jason Leffler who passed away earlier this evening," NASCAR said in a statement. "For more than a decade, Jason was a fierce competitor in our sport and he will be missed."

Bridgeport Speedway

immediately suspended racing for the rest of the night after Leffler's accident at the 0.625-mile, high-banked dirt oval.

After losing his NASCAR ride, Leffler had been racing dirt car events most of this year, including the 410 Sprint Car race Wednesday that promised a \$7,000 prize to the winner. On Sunday, Leffler finished last at Pocono in his lone NASCAR Sprint Cup start of the year. He ran just eight laps in a start-and-park ride.

From Long Beach, Calif., Leffler made 423 starts in NASCAR's three national series, but won just the two Nationwide races and one Truck Series event in a career that began in 1999. He also made three IndyCar Series starts, finishing 17th in the 2000 Indianapolis 500.

"It's been a long time coming since I've been back (to CSI)," Felix said. "I can definitely tell how different I am. It's not so much on the court. I have grown up a lot since the first couple years of college."

He credited a litany of coaches for his personal development, many of whom are still at CSI.

"(Head coach) Steve Gosar, (former assistant) Ryan Devlin, (assistant) Colby Blaine, especially Colby, there was always someone who I could go talk with about the little problems in my life. I got a lot of life support."

But uncharted waters lie ahead — call Felix an explorer.

None have been through what Felix could go through in the next few months, making an NBA team without being drafted.

Felix has no idea if or where he'll go — likely in the mid-second round if he does.

There's not much more he could have done; he'll have made more than 20 workouts before the draft on June 27th.

An All-Pac-12 first team defender with the projected ability to guard three positions — he was shutting down CSI point guard Montigo Alford Monday night — Felix seemingly has the chops to be a quality NBA rotation player.

Chops, not pork chops.

At the NBA combine, Felix was measured to have one of the lowest percentages of body fat in the event's history — 3.3 percent.

Felix never stops moving.

He's renowned for his hustle — a possession generating machine. He's numbers, from 3-point shooting, to scoring efficiency, rebounding, and his combine athletic measurements, they're all seemingly impressive enough to merit a selection in the draft, to impress one team enough to invest in him up front.

But Felix is a late-bloomer.

Was last year an anomaly?

In his first two seasons at ASU, Felix had zero double-doubles. He then led the Pac-12 with 13 last season.

What is his ceiling?

Felix says he isn't concerned about developing into a star.

That, he thinks, should make him more attractive.

"I've tried to develop into a smarter player, to play within myself," Felix said. "I know what I am good at; I know what my strengths are. I'm not looking to turn into a Kobe or LeBron, but to be a high character guy who can grow, develop, someone who know who they are on the court, someone like a Jimmy Butler, Kawhi Leonard, Iman Shumpert, a more athletic Bruce Bowen. I believe I have the ability to go in the first round, but what I'm really worried about is the right fit."

Broncos Hoping for Clady's Return

BSU alum rehabbing from surgery while angling for new long-term contract.

ENGLEWOOD, Colo. (AP) • Everybody at Broncos headquarters is operating under the assumption Pro Bowl left tackle Ryan Clady will return to Denver in time for training camp with a new contract and a clean bill of health in hand.

Everybody except for Chris Clark, that is.

The fifth-year journeyman tackle is preparing as though he'll be the one protecting Peyton Manning's blindside on the Broncos' upcoming Super Bowl-or-bust tour.

Clady has stayed away from Dove Valley since January while rehabbing from offseason shoulder surgery and angling for a new long-term contract while his \$9.828 million free agent tender gathers dust instead of his signature.

Vice President John Elway is on the record stating he wants to sign Clady to a long-term deal this summer, and coach John Fox said Wednesday, "I'm sure that'll all get worked out and I anticipate seeing him in camp."

All indications, he added, are that he's progressing as

expected in his rehab. The Broncos, though, have yet to get a firsthand look at him since his surgery.

"I think he will be here," Manning said. "I certainly hope that he'll be here. I know there's the business side of it. I've certainly kept in touch with Ryan (and know) he wants to be here ... (and) there's no question we want Ryan to be here."

Clady, after all, allowed just one sack in more than 1,100 snaps last season.

Clark has filled in for him at all of the team's offseason

workouts, and in his first interview since last season, he told The Associated Press on Wednesday that he doesn't just see himself as keeping the seat warm for Clady.

"No, not at all. I approach it every day as though I'm the starter and I'm going to be the starter," Clark said. "For whatever reason, the guy signs, he may not sign, you never know what happens. So, my job is just to be ready and not worry about another guy, you know? Their decision is their decision. What I do is on me. So, that's the way I approach it."

The Broncos wouldn't want it any other way, really.

LOS ANGELES (AP) • The Dodgers remained upset Wednesday about their brawl with the Arizona Diamondbacks, and much of their ire was directed toward pitcher Ian Kennedy. Kennedy hit Los Angeles rookie

Yasiel Puig and pitcher Zack Greinke with high pitches Tuesday night, and a day later the Dodgers were still taking exception to where they were thrown. "Anything like that is going to leave a lot of taste in people's

mouths," manager Don Mattingly said. Mattingly said he doesn't think Kennedy hit Puig deliberately. The ball deflected off the young slugger's shoulder and grazed his nose. The pitch from Kennedy to

Greinke deflected off his helmet and struck his upper left shoulder. "The second ball is no doubt intentional," Mattingly said. "That's two balls thrown last night that could have ended guys' careers." Arizona manager Kirk Gibson re-

peated his earlier denial that Kennedy was head-hunting Greinke. "That's not our intent," he said. The teams met in the series finale on Wednesday night, one night after their nasty fight led to six ejections, including Kennedy, Puig and Gibson. "We had some guys on our team get heated and overreacted," Dodgers ace Clayton Kershaw said.

The farmers contend that Monsanto failed to take steps to make sure the genetically engineered plants didn't contaminate regular wheat through cross-pollination, mixing of seeds or other means. Because the wheat industry uses a system that gathers and commingles wheat from thousands of farms for sales and shipping, the farmers contend Monsanto should have known that it would be virtually impossible to prevent the Roundup Ready wheat from infiltrating the non-genetically engineered wheat supply.

"Monsanto knew, or should have known, that the existence of genetically-engineered wheat — commingled with the general wheat supply — would cause significant disruptions in the wheat export market, and that such a situation could involve huge disruptions in the wheat trade while imposing additional costs on U.S. wheat farmers

and specifically Pacific Northwest soft white wheat farmers. These costs eventually would detrimentally impact worldwide prices for Pacific Northwest soft white wheat, causing significant financial damage to wheat farmers," attorney Benjamin Schwartzman wrote in the lawsuit.

The farmers say the discovery of the genetically engineered wheat growing in Oregon has diminished prices for all soft white wheat because of the loss of export and domestic markets, and that it has also increased costs for growers who must go through extensive testing to prove the wheat from their fields isn't contaminated with genetically engineered wheat before they can sell to some buyers.

They are asking for compensatory and punitive damages in an amount to be determined at trial, and they want a judge to order Monsanto to decontaminate the farmland and transportation and harvesting equipment of all affected farmers.

Just before noon yesterday, a line of children waited for lunch. Families spread out around the park, sitting at tables or on blankets.

Around south-central Idaho, school districts and nonprofit organizations regularly provide free summer lunches for children ages 1 to 18.

Income doesn't matter; anyone can come to the program funded by the U.S. Department of Agriculture.

Some local sites already are seeing more children this year.

Last year, about 2,000 children ate lunches through the Twin Falls School District's 15 sites, said Food Services Supervisor Susan Henderson.

That number could climb to 2,200 this summer, she said. Lunch sites have been "really busy" so far, and they only began serving Monday.

The lunches continue on weekdays through Aug. 23.

The program started small here at least eight years ago, said Henderson, who has worked 26 years for the Twin Falls district.

Sites have been added since, and more children have been fed. "I think there's a real need for it," Henderson said.

Idaho has more than 80 sponsors for the Simplified Summer Food Program, some with multiple lunch sites.

The program requires the kids to stay and eat their meals on site. Parents can buy a lunch for \$3.85.

Idaho High School Drops Redskins Logo, Mascot

DRIGGS (AP) • An Idaho high school will drop its longtime "Redskins" nickname, logo and mascot in a move its top administrator says was made to show respect for Native Americans.

The decision at Teton High School in Driggs is a way to encourage students and the community to see beyond skin color and stereotypes, said Monte Woolstenhulm, superintendent of District 401. Motivation also came from renewed efforts nationally to change nicknames and logos deemed offensive to many Native Americans.

"Students need to be taught to see people beyond the color of their skin," said Woolstenhulm, who was a student at the school. "They need to get to know who people are without using nicknames or assumptions based on outward appearances."

Woolstenhulm expects the decision will draw some criticism, but dropping the name

won initial approval from the school board Monday night.

Last month, 10 members of Congress sent letters to the owner of the Washington Redskins NFL and the league commissioner urging the team to change the name. The letter to team owner Daniel Snyder says that "Native Americans throughout the country consider the 'R-word' a racial, derogatory slur akin to the 'N-word' among African Americans."

Snyder has vowed he will never change the nickname. On Wednesday, NFL Commissioner Roger Goodell responded to the congressional pressure, calling the Redskins nickname a "unifying force that stands for strength, courage, pride and respect."

The name is also the subject of a legal challenge from a group seeking to have the team lose its trademark protection.

At the college level, the NCAA warned more than a

dozen schools in 2005 to change American Indian nicknames or logos or face sanctions. Some have followed the warning, including North Dakota, once known as the "Fighting Sioux," while others have gotten permission from tribes to keep their names.

Meanwhile, Woolstenhulm says maintenance crews will begin removing Redskins logos and signs from around the school this summer. Uniforms for all athletic teams and cheer squads will be phased out and the school newspaper, "The War Cry," will be renamed.

The process for picking a new nickname and mascot will begin next fall, he said.

Brody Birch, school athletic director and football coach, said the decision is unfortunate for students and alumni who identified with the nickname. Though he also understands how the name can do more harm than good. "You have people who are indiffer-

ent and then you have people (asking) 'What are we doing?' Why are we caving in?" Birch said. "It's not going to change what we are at Teton High School or what our values are."
