





The London Passenger Transport board reduced the thickness of tickets by only .004 of an inch, thereby saving 480 tons of paper annually, and that paper is needed for cartridge wads. Most important, enough scrip metal—old kettles, sardine tins, razor biades, toothpaste tubes and the like—rolled from those cans, Junk heaps and city dumps to build 10 destroyers, 10,000 tanks and 10,000 anti-aircraft guns. That is only part of the British salvage, system, but obviously it is more than worth while, and could possibly spell the difference between defeat and victory.

If acrap iron can build destroyers, tanks and guns for Britain, it can also build them for the U.S.A. Let's round it up and get it on its way to the smelters where it will do some good!


