SENATE GROUP VOTES GRADUATED SCALE OF WAR PROFITS

Final Evidence That Spring Has Come

WASHINGTON, April 4 (AP)—A graduated schedule for limiting profits on war contracts, with a top limit of 15 per cent, was sent to the senate appropriation committee, but one member, Senator C. McNair, of Ohio, is the only "stop-gap" bill out of price control.

Profits on war contracts ranging from 10 per cent on smaller contracts and automatically down to 2 per cent on the largest, awarded, the law passed by the senate along with the latest war appropriations which was raised to \$10,412,000 by the senate group.

Expect Debate
Both the profits limitation and the price control bill were ready for senate consideration Monday and senators freely forecast a sharp and possibly lengthy debate. In accepting the "sliding scale," the senate committee rejected requests for top-ranting war production board officials for flexible authority to revise contracts which would allow reasonable and excessive profits.

Need Profit Division
Senator McNair, D., Tenn., chairman of the subcommittee which conducted hearings on the measure, conceded that army, navy and maritime commission officials all had testified against the production board's authority to allow reasonable and excessive profits.

Heads of the war or navy departments, or maritime commission officers, will be required to approve any contracts in order to recover any excessive or unreasonable profit which could order recovery suits brought in courts.

U. S. RECOGNIZES DE GAULLE AREAS

WASHINGTON, April 4 (AP)—The United States gave formal recognition today to the Charles de Gaulle's control over French equatorial west Africa and the French Congo and Gabon, along the supply route to the middle east, and India.

The action, bringing closer ties between the United States and the Free French, came in the announcement of the establishment of a French general in Brazzaville, capital of the French possession west of the Atlantic from Brazzaville, and taken "in view of the importance of French equatorial Africa in the united war effort."

Recognition of the African Free French territory came after similar approval of the Gaullie authority over New Caledonia, strategic island off the coast of Australia, valuable also for its large oil reserves.
