HOW TO CURB INFLATION

Congressmen worrying about how to curb inflation and also how to keep their jobs in Washington, should be heartened by reports that President Roosevelt plans to call for freezing of commodity prices, wage controls and new curbs on installment buying.

The President's proposals appear to be aimed to curb inflation by checking inflation, which the aforementioned congressmen still might study with profit. Canada, too, insisted for a time upon the Anglo-British prerogative of trying to muzzle the price-fixing without any attack upon the fundamental elements of cost.

Figures are boring and can be confusing. But every time a housewife buys groceries, or her husband a suit of clothes, they have to deal with the unpleasant statistical fact that what they spent, subtracted from what they have, leaves an ever smaller remainder in their pocketbooks or bank account.

Great Britain still is trying to curb inflation by guerrilla methods, striking here and there to get the inflation down. So long as Canada did likewise her price level rose gradually but persistently — just as ours is doing.

Then the Dominion decreed that after Dec. 1 no price and no wage should be higher than that for the base period from Sept. 15 to Oct. 11.

In November, the last uncontrolled month, the family dollar was worth slightly under 87 cents and in December the dollar was worth a full 87 cents and in January slightly more. Price inflation had been stopped dead in its tracks, and even set back a few inches.

TRAIC-A senate military affairs subcommittee is wrestling with the highly controversial and vexing problem of probing into the cause of the appalling series of airplane crashes. Final decision will probably be left to the full group and will consist of a report to the committee by Secretary Blumenthal's subcommittee.

The expatriate inquiry was inspired by Ben. Harley M. Kilgore of West Virginia, who received information that military cranks were bent to sabotage in aviation plants. Military witnesses are active on the assembly line accounts for aerial fatalities, although the military is understood that there have been more than 4000 airplanes since the outbreak of European conflict with a death toll of almost 1,000, including 500 after Dec. 7.

Flying experts maintain that a large number of these accidents have occurred in the early stages and are attributed to the inexperience of pilots. It is also pointed out that in some instances, it was not the pilot but the machine that was at fault. The aircraft were crowded with more machines than ever before and ground safety devices have not yet been expanded proportionately. Lastly, the amount of wing tanking has become so great that fire-dreadnoughts must be sent along with a minimum of training.

BRUTAL-The conflicting psychology of war produced a mental condition in the military which has been demonstrated in a number of instances. The most prominent of these is the attitude of the military officers who have been in command of military operations since the outbreak of the war.
