





Un-less the axis can be beaten sconer than seems possible, we talk about putting 10 million men into uniform. We may have to take two out of every five American men in the prime of life, in such a way as not to destroy the industrial setup without which those 10 millions would be-come defenseless fodder for axis shells and bombs.
