The current controversy over sugar supply is unfortunate. The Office of Price Administration says firmly that sugar stocks on hand are not as large as the public believes, that the sugar shipping situation may not continue as favorable as in the past few months OPA, while making two extra pounds of fract available between July 10 and Aug. 22, atill maintains that it is not possible to assure permanent increases in the weekly ration.

The real dispute 1sh between those who believe sugar will confline coming in at the present pace — and therefore the public should be given a fatter allowance — and those who fear shipments may fall off soon, and argue that a stockpile must be built up to insure against future shortage.

This was a wise ruling. The law generally protects mothers who are under age, unmarised or acting under temporary stress, from losting their infants. But there is a growing line of decisions to assure childless couples that when they take a baby into their homes and hearts, they need not fear having their happier homes disrupted by a belated change of heart on the part of the natural parents.

Without such assurance the adoption system, which has given loving parents to thoughn's who otherwise would have grown up as whits, would be badly handleapped.
