

WAR COMES FIRST

The weight of war on the telephone lines grows heavier every day. We can't build new lines and switchboards to carry. the load because copper, aluminum, rubber and other materials, needed for telephone equipment are vital war materials as well. What facilities we have must serve as fully as possible.

Telephone subscribers themselves hold a great part of the answer. Here are some ways in which you can cooperate:

- Limit long distance usage to necessary calls and be as brief as possible. The longer lines, particularly those to the Pacific Coast states and east of the Mississippi River, are especially busy, and calls to these areas should not be made unless they are very important or relate to the war effort.
- If your call is delayed please do not ask the operator for reports unless necessary. Such requests tie up switchboards.
- Please do not call "Information" until you have referred to the telephone directory. Other calls such as for "time of day" should be avoided unless they are necessary.
- We cannot always give you the type of equipment you desire. In some cases we can furnish no new local service, and in general only party-line service. Considerate use of party-line service is neighborly and particularly helpful at this time.
- Long telephone conversations not only tie up the two lines that are connected but also the central office equipment that is common to many lines. Please use the service moderately. A long unnecessary conversation may delay a call essential to the war effort.

THE TEST CAME QUICKLY
When Elmer Davis went to Washington to
become car over war publicity, few newsmen doubted that he would come into conflict with the war and navy departments
--or, specifically, with the generals and the
admirals.

The controversy came more promptly than most had expected, Mr. Davis had not even ind time to accomplish administrative relisions before the trial of eight nazi saboteurs began before a special military commission appointed by the President and headed by Maj.-Gen. Frank R. McCoy.

Original detailed publicity on the capture of these submarine-borne enemies was broadcast, foolishly we believe, by FBI Director J.

Signt Hoover.

Before the trial commenced Mr. Davis promised newspapermen he would make valinable daily a censored report on proceeding, including as many facts as would not e of ald to the centre. But General McCoy, presumably with the pproval of his fellow officers on the comission, arbitrarily, curtly—in fact, very univiliy—snubbed Mr. Davis and ignored Attorney General Biddle.

This is no mere technicality. One of the greatest reasons Elmer Davis or somebody like him was needed in Washington was because the army and the navy were doing two of the worst public relations jobs on recordinininicity inferior to that of civilian war neemeles.

Taking everything into consideration, we could stretch a point and feel sorry for Leon Henderson. The record, if considered dispassionately, could easily show that he is getting a raw deal, in spite of his widespread unpopularity.

We have disagreed with much that Mr. Henderson has said, much that he has done, much that he believes, Obviously he has made mistakes. But if ever a man stood on a keg of dynamite in the midst of a fire, and tried to save his fellows, the price czar is that man. All that Mr. Henderson has to do is prevent inflation. The simple task handed to him is that of keeping retail and wholesale prices down while wages, raw materials and transportation go up, without destroying the nation's mercantile fabric by bankrupting its merchants,

tion's mercantile tabric by bankrupting its merchantic, If the price car lets prices go up, he has falled on his job.

If he suggests 'stabilizing' wages, he is an enemy of the working man.

If he advocates an effective ceiling on farm prices, he is the farmer's foe.

The war labor board can approve a pay raise for steel workers — and later perhaps for all in similar jobs. But Mr. Henderson cant let prices go up to absorb such raises. When gasoline distribution among dealers works undue hardships, and a plan is evolved by Mr. Henderson's staff to correct the evil, he must get WPB and Petroleum Administration approval and co-operation — if he can.


