THOMAS RAPS AT HOUSE-APPROVED TAX ON FREIGHT

WASHINGTON, Aug. 3 (AP)—Senator John Thomas, R., Ind., declared today that a house-approved tax of 1 percent on shipments would decimate against shippers of farm and forest products in states distant from central markets.

In a brief submitted to the senate finance committee, which is conducting hearings on the house measure, Thomas' statement said:
