

THE FARMERS HAVE A PROBLEM

THE FARMERS HAVE A PHOBLEM genalitied observers, looking over the dairy-ing and granary regions, agree unanimously that the farmers are not oversitating the gravity of the crisis that confronts them. Between now and next spring the nation must find some effective relief for its farm-ers-gome sound, workable formula to rescue our greatest, most vital industry, the produc-tion of foodiutie.

our greatest, most vital industry, the produc-tion of foodsulfs. We are handlcapped in the beginning by the fact that for two decades now we have been experimenting unsuccessfully in hope of solving a farm problem that was the exact opposite of the one now at issue. All of our tlought about the farmers and their (rpubles centered upon how to assure them a price for their product which would enable them to pay their bills and live de-cently. The experiments tride out most often involved. In one way or another, restrictions upon output. Chemurgy and processing plants such as, our own potato starch factory have been making headway in providing new uses for agricultural products, but these develop-ments are still in their infancy. Now prices are high and will remain high or the duration of the war. The farmer will
