When Canada first discovered the need to mushroom her revenues for war purposes, she did exactly what the United States is doing. Retaining all the old taxes, she expanded her to bring in new taxpayers and simul-ously boosted the rates so as to hit everyody harder.

Jusd any alightest idea where he was. However, Canada did not stop there. Hav-ing created a topheavy tax edifice, the Do-minion put tax architects to work to correct her most obvious faults.

Moreover, having jacked up their tax rates until they really hurt; the Canadians put a publice on the sore spat by placing the all-inclusive income tax on a partial pay-as-you go basis. In the words of a Dominion tax ex-pert. "We have applied the Rumi plan ene-third of the way."

"We nave approx t Sopt. 1 Canadian employers, bond-s, etc., began withholding approximate-per cent of the tax due on wages, in-, etc., Then taxpayers will file income sturns, and will pay any portion of the levy which by that time has not been wid

Those complications arise from the fact that Canada had a defense tax last year. We are not faced with those compli-cations yet. We shall be when we begin collecting the Victory tax. So the appropri-ate opportunity for installing the Rumi plan here, all at once instead of plecemeal, is pass-ing fast.

But we Americans have every right to look at Canada's intelligent initiative, then at our own lackadatical dallance, and wonder why the little neighbor should have a monopoly on willingness to admit and correct errors. Canada has done much of what we have urged that our own government should do Why can't the United States, too, give the taxpayer a break?
