Steuber Holds 2nd, Fekete Retains Third

CHICAGO, Nov. 19.—Rudolph (Little Doe) Mobley and six-foot Camp Wilson, the long and short of quarterback hardin-simmons' devastating running attack, are well on their way to becoming the top two ball carriers in national rushing figures.
If they succeed, it will mark the first time in modern football that two members of the same team have run over 1,000 yards in national rushing figures.
Mobley, already credited with a record-breaking total of 1,440 yards in seven games, has first place virtually sewed up. Wilson, next best with 1,100 yards, has Steuber and Ohio State's Gene Fekete for the runner-up position.
Figures released today by the American Football Union show Steuber with 884 yards in nine games; Fekete 872 in eight games; Wilson has 727 yards in seven contests, with two more to play.
Together, Mobley and Wilson have hardin-simmons leading the nation in rushing with an average of 320 yards a game, 40 yards better than the second best by Columbia's 1927. Meanwhile, Frankie Sinkwich, the Georgia powerhouse, is running wild passing his way toward the 2,000-yard mark in total offense. He has a 1,815 total gained by running 622 yards and passing for 1,193 and still has two games to go to tie record in 1,928 yards.

Proceeds From Pro Bowl Go To Sailors

PHILADELPHIA, Nov. 19.—(AP)—The pro bowl football game will be played this year in Philadelphia for the first time, with the entire proceeds going to the "missing heroes" of our merchant marine.
Elmer Layden, commissioner of the National Football league, announced that the game will be held at the Philadelphia Veterans stadium, probably the Chicago Bears, and the league will donate \$25,000 for the game.
The game was played in Los Angeles under last year's terms, and was shifted to New York because of the war.
General Elmer S. Tamm, war shipping administrator, sponsor of the United States service in conjunction with the merchant marine, telegraphed Layden "my personal thanks to you and members of the National league for your contribution to this vital service of the merchant marine."
A capacity crowd of nearly 40,000 is expected. Tickets range from \$1.65 to \$5.50 with all seats reserved. Layden said no complimentary tickets, other than working press, would be issued and that the league would not receive a penny in addition to what is being declared, the players will not be paid.
Layden also announced that the playoff for the league championship between the Chicago Bears, winners of the western division, and the Washington or Pittsburgh, whichever wins the eastern title, will be held at Washington on Dec. 14.
The all-star selections will be announced directly after this game. The players will come to Philadelphia Dec. 15 to start practice.

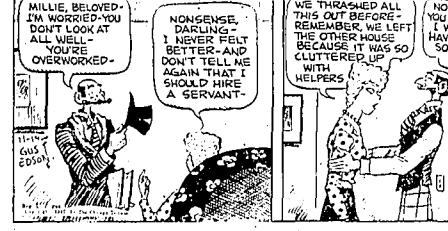

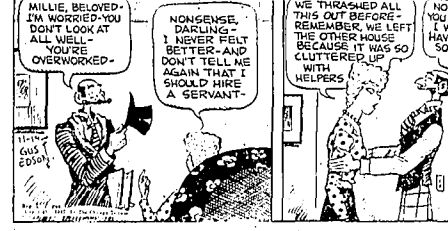

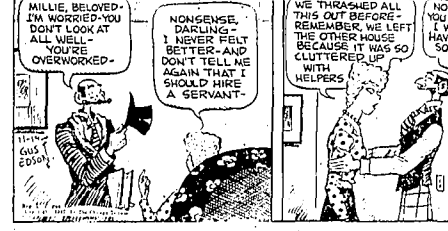
