

Thanksgiving time is turkey time—and the turkey has to be one of tenniting goodness. It has to be the right type of bird . . in adequate quantity for the feast . properly dressed . and definitely good. So to help you when you go abuying this important holiday bird, let's talk turkey for awhile, as you will probably wonder .

women. How much turkey you should buy An easy rule to remember in gauging quantity is to provide "4, to a pound of turkey (dressed but not drawn) for each person to be served. Naturally, the larger the turkey, the more meat you'll have in -proportion to lone. And it's really good economy to buy a turkey a few pounds heavier than you will actually need.

What size turkey is best for roasting Twelve pounds is the maximum weight for a tender roasting hen. If you need a larger bird than this, buy a tom, for a tom weighs heavier for its age than does a hen.

Is there any home work to be done on a tarkey drawn at the market It's your turkey from now antil table time and it's wise to roust a turkey within 24 hours after it has been drawn. To get a turkey ready for stuffing, remove any pinfeathers, using a paring knife, a strawberry huller, or old sterilized tweezers. Remove the cearse feathers from the wing tips—pilers work fine—or cut off the wing tips.—Harls work fine—or cut off the wing tips. Harly hairs remain, singe them off, using a gas flame or tightly twisted paper torch. Then serub the outer skin of the turkey with a brash and warm water. Cut out the oil sac on top of the tall-piece and remove odds and ends of lungs, and windpipe. Cut off the mek inside the skin down close to the bird's shoulders. Rinse inside and out with cold vater; pat dry with paper towed or clean cloth. Sprinkle lightly inside with saft. Mr. Turk is ready to be stuffed!

DRIFTING TOWARD DISASTER

The problem of manpower utilization for war purposes is drifting its uncharted course toward disaster. It is now just about where the rubber problem was when President Roosevelt appointed the Baruch committee to study the facts and recommend what

o study the facts and recommend and nould be done. There are a few things about manpower pon which most of us can agree. Let's see

pon which most of us can agree, Leve acc hat some of them are.

First, we can agree that if this country is be the arsenal and the granary of democ-ley, and aiso to supply millions of solders, allors and marines for fighting, we must filtize our manpower with a degree of ef-ciency hitherto never needed in this lush

utilize our manpower war or expected in this hash industrial paradise. Second, we can agree that industries upon which the winning of the war must depend are having trouble getting enough qualified workers to do their Jobs. Third, we en agree that there are millions of persons—notably women and Negroes—who could be used but are not being used. Fourth, we can agree that there are millions of persons now employed in tasks which we would like to have continued, but which we would like to have continued, but which are less vital than the winning of this war. Fifth, we can agree that we are handleapped by shortages of raw materials to expand our industrial plant without-using materials to deterwise could be made into armanent.

ierials that otherwise could be made into arrnament.

Sixth, we can agree that the plant we possess is not, for the most part, being utilized with anything approaching 100 per cent efficiency—that is, that if we had the men to operate all essential industry on a 108-hour a, week basis, we could produce much more of weapons and supplies with the plant we already possess. Seventh, we can agree that the problem is nor of arranging so that all the potential-manpower is used with maximum efficiency. The question is, how?

Some believe that by voluntary cooperative methods, men and jobs can be matched up with no more waste than is inevitable in such a mammoth problem. Others believe that, human nature belia, what it is, men and jobs cannot be matched up althout compulsion applied or held in sea shufffed like hences of a crossword puzzie, and fitted together.






