Soviet Offensive Breaks Nazi Line In South Sectors

MOSCOW, Nov. 23 (AP)—A formidable red army force of infantry, tanks and guns pursued broken German divisions through the mine fields and fortifications on the frosty steppes northwest and southwest of Stalingrad today after smashing the enemy lines in the greatest Russian offensive of this year's campaign.

Already some 15,000 Germans have been killed and more than 13,400 captured since the Russians sprung their drive. The German prisoners of Stalingrad have been placed in a perilous position, and the German forces in the Caucasus and other areas are being held to a standstill as the bitter Russian winter sets in.

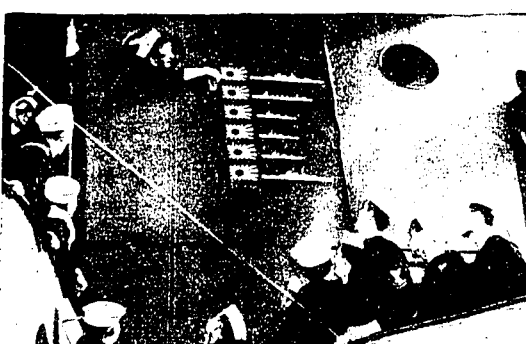
The Soviet offensive stretched two arms around the Germans still holding positions in Stalingrad and placed the Russians astride two important railway lines used by the Germans to supply their forces.

The offensive began, dispatches said, with a one-hour artillery barrage to intense that when the firing ceased only isolated enemy units remained. Red army infantry and tanks then filed through the mine fields from trench lines to the open steppe, where the German front was shattered by the ferocity of the Russian offensive, dispatches said. Prisoners were taken in great numbers and mortars piled up as the red army carried the advance as far as the German positions.

During the night of Nov. 22-23 our troops in the Stalingrad area continued to carry out successful operations and continued to move forward," the Russian communique said.

50 Miles West
In a special communique last night the Russians announced that they had begun a new offensive 50 miles west of Stalingrad, while another column striking toward the northwest of the city had occupied the railroad town of Abakurovo.

AMERICAN CHINA AIR FORCE SINKS BIG ENEMY SHIP

A large Japanese ship, reported to be either an aircraft carrier or a transport, was sunk yesterday by American Sky Troopers of the China command in a terrific attack upon Hainan, French Indo-China, eliminating a stockpile which might have proved a rising threat in attacks from Burma to the Yangtze valley.

The Hainan attack was announced today in a communique from the headquarters of Brig. Gen. Claire L. Chennault, commander of the China air task force. It said immense fires developed the entire waterfront of the port through which the Japanese are believed to be sending supplies inland for an attack upon Kunming, provincial capital of Yunnan, in central China.

Attack on Enemy Tunis Positions Gets Under Way

LONDON, Nov. 23 (AP)—The allied pincers in north Africa slowly closed today on the doomed axis positions in the Tunisia-Henic area.

Radio Morocco reported that allied forces had opened a general attack on axis positions at the two major cities and that the first axis prisoners had arrived behind the allied lines.

Citing as authority an allied headquarters communique, the French-controlled radio Morocco said the axis had attacked entrenched enemy positions in the desert driving against the entire position of the German and Italian armies.

A later radio Morocco broadcast said that the allied troops continued their attack and were advancing rapidly.

French troops reported that they had defeated the German heavily in a savage fight in the Gafsa region of north Tunisia, 70 miles inland from the coast.

German and Italian forces, driving in from the Gulf of Gabes, filtered into the British front lines on the railroad running from Algeria to Mahrane on the gulf, the radio communique said.

French, American and British troops met there. The axis forces were halted, the communique said, and then the allies launched a counter-attack.

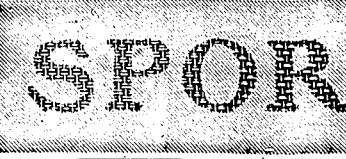

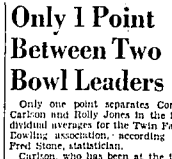

MORALE BUUNDER UNITS IN ARMY

"Sailors, Not Factory Men," Is Goal of Maritime Schools

SAN ANTONIO, Tex., (AP)—"Morale Builders" is the nickname attached to the eighth special service unit, formed at Fort Sam Houston, in answer to Chief of Staff Gen. George C. Marshall's request for more recreational facilities for American soldiers fighting on the western fronts all over the world.

Trained for overseas duty the eighth special service unit—made up of the organizations mobilized in the United States at about the same time—prepared a wide variety of entertainments to make life more pleasant for the Yanks who are being sent to make things hot for the Axis.

Each unit, headed by officers and includes band leaders, drummers, radio operators and Broadway-style entertainers, headed by Gen. Frederick H. Arnold, who was reported by the Army as the last survivor of six first-eight first-aid.

Units specially equipped General sponsors of congressional program agreed to give more than 1,000 recordings of their broadcasts for distribution to the unit.

Ready to satisfy American love of combat on more intensely than any other service, the units are being equipped with the latest in sport equipment to care for all sports. Scores of baseball bats, volleyballs, basketballs, footballs, tennis rackets and similar paraphernalia are available to the units.

For the literary-minded, each of the units is equipped with a complete set of 8,000 books pocket sized covering all types and classes of literature, including encyclopedias.

In addition to the entertainment features offered by the units, they are also equipped with comfortable canteens close to the lines, where fighting men can obtain cigarettes, candy, soft drinks and other comforts.

The 17 units are intended to be forerunners of many more. At least 50 more units are to be formed to follow the special first service unit, which was sent to wherever American units are fighting.

"The units are not a easy one," said Lieut. Donald W. Hamilton, commanding officer of the eighth special service unit, "but they are comfortable buildings in which to set up our alarms or centers, for the units are not to be used as a headquarters that have been here for months or years of war. 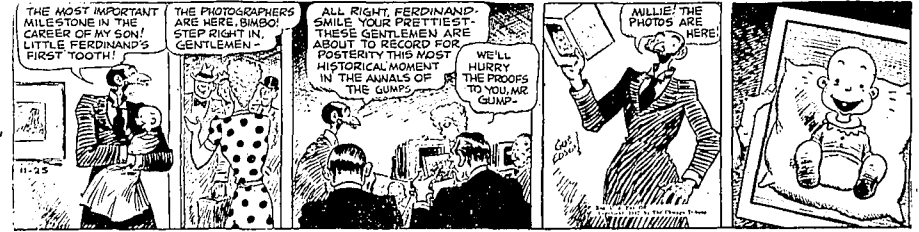

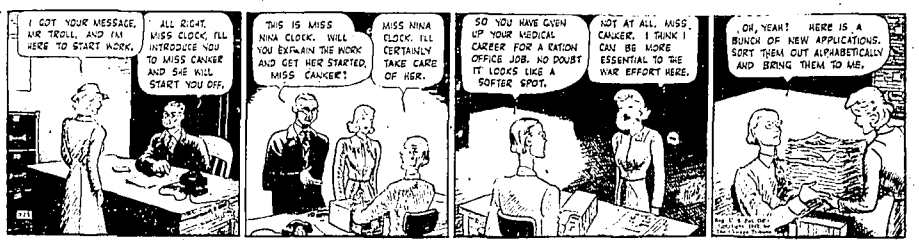

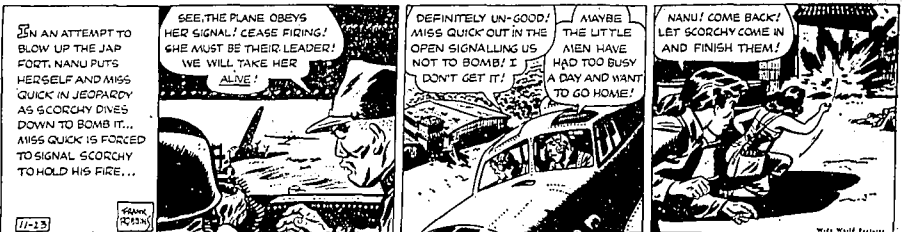
