



Death Toll Reaches 478 in Boston Night Club Catastrophe; 176 Hurt

BOSTON, Nov. 30 (AP)—An official report today placed the death toll from Saturday night's disaster in the Coronet Club night club at 478 persons and injured 176.

The person indirectly responsible was a practical joker, unidentified, who may have paid with his life. His person immediately had been identified as a 16-year-old boy.

Only one fire in American history took a greater toll than that which destroyed the Coronet Club in Chicago in 1932 and killed 575 persons.

Cross quiet victims had but a large segment of it in a mood for celebrating.

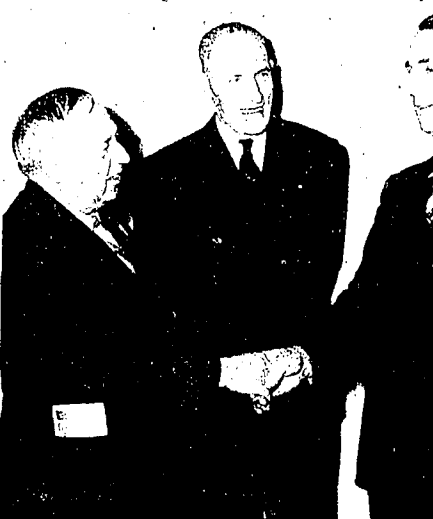

BEHIND THE RED BALL

As was to be expected, the Roosevelt-Brynes party limited its attacks to being Communist in spirit and in trend. This is not fair... to the Reds. They have long since progressed beyond the experimental stage marked by this executive law.

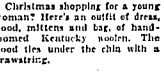

2. Pour into clean, wide-mouthed can. It is best to pour into a wide-mouthed can, such as a coffee or vegetable shortening can. Be sure the can is spotlessly clean. And strain your fats as you pour them in, so that all foreign matter is removed.
3. Keep in refrigerator or a cool, dark place until you have collected at least 1 pound.
4. Take to your meat dealer, who is cooperating patriotically in this drive. He will weigh your can of fat, pay you the established price for it, and start it on its way to the war industries. Frozen food locker plants will also accept your salvaged fats.

FOUR THINGS NOT TO DO

1. Don't take less than 1 pound at a time to your meat dealer.
2. Don't take your fats to the meat dealer in glass containers or paper bags.
3. Don't let fats stand so long that they become rancid. If they do, the glycerine content is reduced.
4. Don't take your fats to the meat dealer on week-ends if you can avoid it. Help him by returning them early in the week.

City Collections

Your meat dealer has been designated as an official collection agency for waste fats and greases. He will buy all your salvaged fats and greases at the government established price of 4c per pound, and will speed them on their way to make munitions to shoot down MacArthur Way.

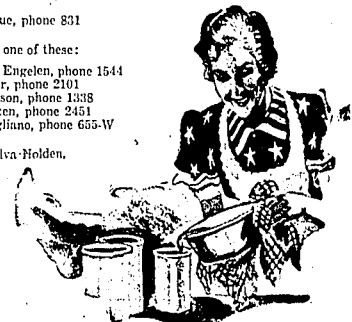
