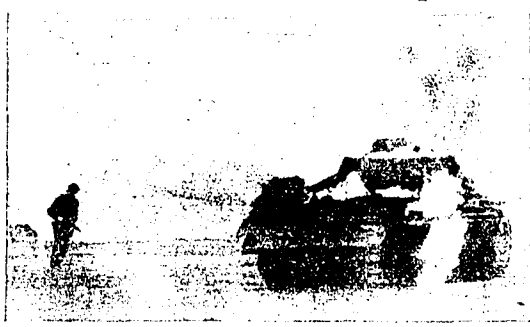

Russians Open New Offensive in North

LONDON, Jan. 15 (AP) - Russia's northern army has begun attacking the German positions at Leningrad for over 48 hours in a major offensive designed to free the Soviet union's second city, dislodged from Stockholm reported today. Marshal Semion Timoshenko, secretly transferred from the southern front command, opened the attack Wednesday morning with a four-hour bombardment of the powerful German fortifications at Schlossburg, 23 miles west of the city at the point where the entire German position at Leningrad, dispatches said.

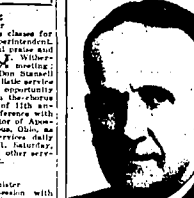

## Rickey Doubts Quality of 1943 Players

NEW YORK, Jan. 15 (AP) — With current manager Leo Durocher facing imminent induction into the army, speculation is possible as to the quality of the players to be drafted to the post of pilot of the Brooklyn Dodgers today centered on First Baseman Dolph Camilli and Bill Terry, former general manager of the New York Giants.

President Branch Rickey, who revealed Durocher's latest military status after checking with him at the Navy club in Rochester where he is undergoing a routine checkup, emphasized that he doesn't plan to make any immediate moves regarding a new manager.

Durocher, who had his registration suit filed in Brooklyn in 1942, is expected to be called to active duty on Jan. 23, 1943. He is married but his wife is in camp. He is expected to be inducted into the army and to be assigned to the Pacific coast to see the players and "Dolph" Camilli.

Camilli stated some time ago that he had no desire to resume his playing career but his family across the country. He might change his mind if the manager's post topped his mind.

Terry was in town to attend an athletic dinner in which he said he was being approached regarding the position. He was willing to listen to the manager's offer.
