

British, Germans Trade Blows on Berlin and London

Damage Heavy in Nazi Capital as RAF Hits Hard

RAF Hits Hard

LONDON, Jan. 18.—A strong force of RAF bombers laid fire across Berlin in the renewed "war of the capitals" last night, but stiffened defenses of the German city took a toll of 22 planes compared with only one the previous night.

London's anti-aircraft gunners meanwhile threw Nazi raiders into confusion by the fierceness of their barrage during two assaults last night and early today when the attackers lost 10 of perhaps 60 planes.

German efforts at retaliation for the mighty attack which apparently inflicted heavy damage on Berlin Saturday night were relatively mild. London's ground guns threw up a curtain of steel and fire more continuous and powerful than anything Londoners ever heard before.

Heavily damaged London rooftops with shell fragments and several persons were killed or injured in the heaviest explosion since after striking the ground. The firing combined with new secret anti-aircraft devices to make a spectacular show.

The RAF ministry announced both sides in the defense of London. "Berlin was again attacked by a strong force of our heavy bombers last night," the ministry spokesman said. "A great load of bombs was dropped and, by the end of the attack, three fires were burning."

The bombers flew in bright moonlight on most of the 100-mile round trip, but encountered some clouds over the target area. In contrast to the light moonlight Saturday night, the air ministry said there were many combats with enemy fighters. One of these was reported shot down.

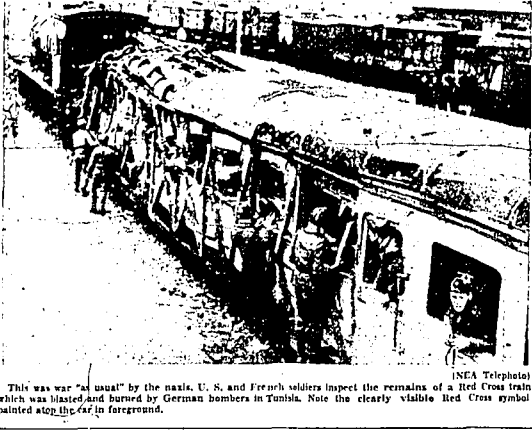
Presumably the night fighters and anti-aircraft guns shared in the toll of 22 bombers officially reported today. The German radio, in a broadcast recorded in London, boasted this figure by the end of the attack.

"Bombs were dropped at a number of places in Greater London and caused considerable damage," the ministry reported. "Some damage was done."

WASHINGTON, Jan. 18 (AP)—The labor board today asked President Roosevelt to intervene in the 20-day strike of Pennsylvania hard coal miners.

The board asked the president to demand that the workmen return to work immediately. The board's request, drafted at a brief emergency session this afternoon by six WLB members.

The board decided to ask for presidential action after 10,000 strikers voted at weekend meetings to accept a WLB plan which they would not work.

COURT UPHOLDS AMA CONVICTION

WASHINGTON, Jan. 18 (AP)—The supreme court today upheld the conviction of the American Medical Association for restraining trade in connection with its fight against Group Health, Inc., a Washington medical cooperative organization.

The ruling was unanimous, except that Justice Frank Murphy and Robert Jackson did not participate, presumably because the suit was in progress while they were serving as justices on the court.

The ruling affirmed a decision by the court of appeals for the District of Columbia which held that the practice of medicine was "trade" within the meaning of the anti-trust law, and sustained fines of \$25,000 against the AMA and \$15,000 against the District of Columbia Medical society, local affiliate of the AMA.

Roberts, however, said the high court was not deciding whether a doctor's practice of medicine was a business, but whether the government's action constituted trade under the Sherman act.
