ANOTHER CARD TO CARRY

For administrative reasons which may be adequate, the selective service bureau has ordered that after Jan. 31 all draft registrants from 18 to 45 must carry classification cards as well as registration certificates.

The latter, which registrants already are required to keep on their persons, are small enough to fit into any wallet or identification card case. Form 57, the classification card, is postcard size and must be carried loose in most meris prockets.

The penalty for not having it to show on demand cannot be more than a \$5,000 line and five years' imprisonment.


