WARNING TO SPORTSMEN

It takes a long, hard struggle to get any epartment in state government divocred rom politics and re-established as a non-artitan commission, and once such a com-listion is established, attempts to undermine will continue to be made by selfish inter-

ests.

That has been Idaho's experience with its state fish and game department, long a hotbed of puny politics and political patronage. And now that this department is directed by a non-partisan commission, it behooves every good sportsman in the state to be on his guard against anything that might tend to destroy the present set-up and thereby endanger Idaho's wildlife resources.

destroy the present set-up and thereby endanger Idaho's wildlife resources.

Now pending in the state legislature are two measures, senate bills. Nos. 35 and 38, against which all sportsmen should make strong protest. These bills are camouflaged to take from the state fish and game comission the control of all fur-bearing animals, primarily beaver. These proposals are in direct conflict with the initiative act by which the voters of Idaho Iinally established the commission. Moreover, these bills would take from the fish and game commission at power to regulate wild fur bearers through rules or regulations contrary to the restrictions in the proposed legislation.

It takes no crystal-gazer to see that these measures are being approximed by solfish interests composed mostly of, trappers, fur buyers, and hose who have a special motive to undermine the effectiveness of the commission.

If the sportsmen are determined to keep management of our fish and game resources under control of the commission, we suggest that they urge their representatives in the state legislature without fail to kill senate bills Nos. 35 and 36 and all other similar legislation.




