We wish it weren't necessary to criticize, but some of the statements by James F. Byrnes, director of the economic stabilization board, in making the announcement of the 48-hour work week, are too ridiculous for us to swallow unless we want to play chump. Obviously, the 48-hour week will mean an increase in weekly paychecks for those now working less than 48 hours — a 30 per cent increase in the case of those working only 40 hours. But here's the argument Byrnes puts forth why this condition will not be inflationary, and it's a classic:

"Overtime payments have been an effective aid to increased production during the war. Paying more for the same work makes for inflation. Paying more for extra work does not."

From this statement, it is apparent that the administration is thinking only of "payare aummistration is thinking only of "pay-ing more" whether it's for regular time or overtime. And without any regard for how much this overtime costs, the bureaucrats would like to have it appear that the extra hours worked on a rate-and-a-half basis amount to a real scarifice on the part of organized lubor.




