THOSE IMPORTED FARM WORKERS THOSE IMPORTED FARM WORKERS If this areas experience with the farm sc-enrity administration's plan for solving the farm manpower shortage in Iduho is any in-dication of what may be going on over the country generally, an immediate and far-reaching investigation would seem in order. The 23 Mississippi farm workers who ar-rived here March 25 with 43 additional mem-bers of their families at a transportation cost of approximately \$5000 have found them-selves in a predicament that's anything but a credit to the program.

They were brought to this county as part of the FSA's plan to import 160 agricultural workers from Mississippl. Louisiana and other localities. The story they have to tell following their arrival is interesting. Representatives of the FSA in Missisalppl, these workers allege, publied a rosy picture of opportunities awaiting them in Idaho, the promises including free rent on homes up to cight-room size, a cow, chickens and a gar-den ic go with the home. and wages ranging from 375 to 3125 per month. In their aggerness to take advantage of this generous offer, some of the imported workers explain they even wont so I ar as to sacrifice the personal belongings they did not feel they would need in their new envir-omment.
