LONDON, May 11 (AP) — A Reuters dispatch from allied headquarters in north Africa said today it was officially announced that enemy resistance on Cap Ron was collapsing. The number of prisoners was increasing hourly.

ALL1ED HEADQUARTERS IN NORTH, AF-RICA, May 11 (AP)—Gen. Dwight D. Eisenhower's headquarters amounced today that British armor had forced a complete breakthrough on the neck of Cap Bon peninsula; closing that blind alley at its mouth and pocketing enemy forces which still were fighting fiercely to the south and west.






