SOONS SAY TAX PROPOSAL TO HIT LOWER BRACKET

WASHINGTON, May 11 (AP)—Senator Robert M. La Follette, of Wis., today proposed that the skip-a-year tax bill approved by the senate finance committee drastically means higher taxes in the next 12 months for individuals making from \$150 to \$250,000 a year.

"To enact legislation at this time, forgetting existing tax liabilities, will compel congress to raise tax rates later this year," La Follette said in a one-man minority report explaining his opposition to the tax bill which the senate will begin debating tomorrow.

Sen. La Follette's committee members also opposed the bill, but they did not sign La Follette's report. There were interesting indications, however, that the bill will pass the committee's version of the future plan.

La Follette directed his entire attention at the future plan in his collection of one year's taxes in order to put taxpayers on a 100 per cent pay-as-you-go basis starting July 1, without doubling of and requiring payment of two years' taxes in one year.

"It is a foregone conclusion that the annual income tax will be a very serious income group cannot, as a practical matter, be removed from the tax base through the use of increased rates," he asserted.

He pointed out that rates in the upper brackets already covering about 10 per cent of the total income.

Employment Stabilization Plan Operative Wednesday

DENVER, May 11 (AP)—A temporary employment stabilization plan to control the transfer of essential workers in five Rocky Mountain states was announced today by John B. McCusker, regional war manpower commissioner.

McCusker said the plan would go into effect at midnight tonight in Colorado, Wyoming, Utah, Idaho and Montana.

The stabilization plan, he said, "implements the President's recent order that all government agencies hold the line against inflation by instituting controls over job transfers by essential workers."

According to McCusker, adoption of the regional plan will permit essential workers to transfer to other jobs at higher pay in cases where the transfer will aid in the production of war materials.

The plan, he said, "will be effective for a period of 90 days, during which time the transfer of essential workers in the five states may be suspended, later by the War Relocation Authority."

ALLIED HEADQUARTERS IN NORTH AFRICA, May 11 (AP)—Gen. Dwight D. Eisenhower's headquarters announced today that British armor had forced a complete breakthrough on the neck of Cap Bon peninsula, closing that blind alley at its mouth and pocketing enemy forces which still were fighting fiercely to the south and west.

Advancing from the Hammam Lif area on the north side of the neck, the British first army crossed the base of the peninsula to the outskirts of Hammam on the south side, and took Soliman, Grombala and Menzel Bou Zelfa in the center, the communique announced.

(A Reuters dispatch from allied headquarters said the British entered Hammam early this morning.)

Scorched by allied fire from land, sea and air, the remnants of the German and Italian armies which were crowded upon Cap Bon appeared to have lost their nerve after this bold, swift stroke by British armor and the prospects of a last stand on the mountain-rimmed peninsula were diminishing.

The opposition from their troops was slight, and the trapped soldiers were inclined to surrender at the first opportunity as British naval forces scoured nearby waters in what was described as a "mopping up" of small parties of enemy troops attempting a disorganized escape.

Photos continued to sweep the beach reported today at the mouth of the Cap Bon peninsula, which had recognized the full effect of the allied attack. The British armor had been firing steadily along the beach, and the German and Italian troops were being driven back.
