

RUBBER TIRES BILL
The so-called rubber tires buil, introduced y Senator Ellender of Louisiana on behalf himself and six other solons, is not very ramatic in its humdrum legal phrascology, at it is well worth reading beyond its in-octous formal description as "A bill to prode for the effective inspection, conservation, dd distribution of motor-vehicle tires, and or other purposes."

That bill-drafting bromide "and for other purposes" usually is just an insurance clause, to make certain that stovenly titling shall not defeat the legislative intent. In this case, however, it is the heart, soul and body of the

"Other purpose"—schually, the sole purpose for which the bill was drafted—is to drive all the manufacturers, gasoline refiners, automobile makers and chain stores out of the tire selling and repairing business, under penalty of \$5,000 fine, a year in prison, or soft.

The term applies only to dealers substan-inity all of whose business consists of selling action-bolles or automotive equipment, selling assoline and oil, or repairing, recapping or retreading tires.

This would specifically bar stores owned by the manufacturers or oil companies or automotive manufacturers. It would bar chain stores except those confined to auto-tion. It would bar accres of thousands of country stores with gasoline pumps and tire service sidellines, which are the only agencier avail-able to perhaps millions who live in rural areas.






