ALLIED HEADQUARTERS IN NORTH AFRICA, June 11 (AP)—Pantelleria surrendered unconditionally at 11:40 a. m. (3:40 a. m. mountain war time) today after the most concentrated allied aerial attack of the war and Gen. Dwight D. Eisenhower's ground forces swarmed ashore from fleet-backed assault craft 20 minutes later.

The senior Italian officer on Pantelleria sent the following message to allied headquarters:  
"Beg to surrender through lack water."  
It was officially announced that the landing parties met slight resistance, due to the fact that word of the commander's surrender had not reached all points of the island, but all objectives were reached by 12:22 p. m.

# MILITARY CASTE SMASHING URGED

NEW YORK, June 11 (AP)—Former President Herbert Hoover, and Hugh Gibson, former U. S. ambassador to Belgium, called for the destruction of the military caste in Germany, Italy and Japan by "complete disarmament" of these countries after the war.

In their latest article in a series of columns appearing in Collier's magazine, they wrote:

"The preservation of order in these latter countries should be delegated to a consular body where the armistice has ended, an officer's commission would be allowed to serve. This only can ensure the continuity of these war machines be broken and the menace wiped out."

They declared that the victorious nations will need to reduce militarily their armed forces as well as the arms of their neighbors.

"Development of the combat plane makes disarmament easier," they said, asserting that a "comparatively small air force in the hands of the trustees of peace, with appropriate bases, could in a disaster ward preventive order and prevent aggression."

Saying that the disappearance of small states should be sought, Hoover and Gibson announced that such states be encouraged to federate, economically and defensively, under some "national system" such as Switzerland's or by some other method which will preserve their racial cultures and at the same time promote their economic and political stability.

They added that there are 16 European states "that would fall naturally into four or five groups."

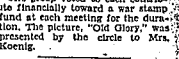

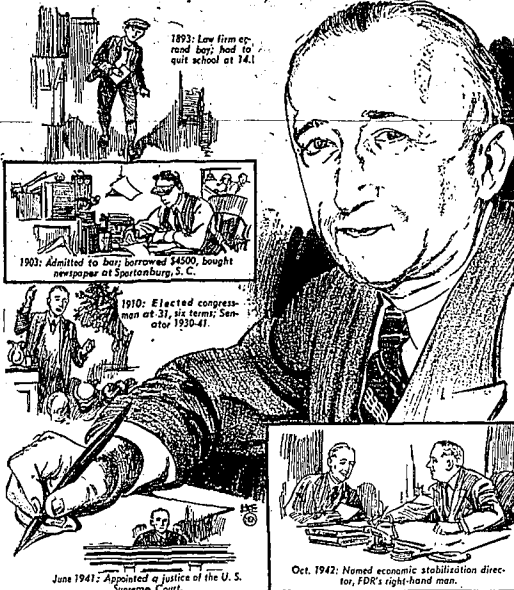
