Dworshak said the provost-marshal general's office was considering the proposal today but he emphasized no final decision had been made up to the time he telephoned.

The congressman said he expects a definite statement by tonight from the provost-marshal general.

"It is likely, I believe, that axis prisoners may be quartered near Rupert," he said, "I am informed that the provost-marshal general is giving it careful consideration but has not yet reached a decision. "Personally, I think there is great likelihood of the Rupert location receiving approval."

Congressman Dworshak said that until the army either approves rejects the Rupert location, no details will be available. He added: "If Rupert is approved, however, the eamp for axis prisoners of war would probably accommodate about 3,000 men. They are establishing a number of such camps instead of just a few larger ones, and I understand 3,000 is about the total provided for each.

Pending army announcement, the Idaho Republican congressman said he had no information as to whether such a Rupert camp would be a tent city or a center such as was constructed for evacuees at




