# There is "great likelihood" that a camp for approximately 3,000 

 axis prisoners of war may be located in the vicinity of Rupert, Cong Henry C. Dworshak told the Times-News at $2 \mathrm{p} . \mathrm{m}$. (MWT) today by long distance telephone from Washington.Dworshak said the provost-marshal general's office was consider ing the proposal today but he emphasized no final decision had-beer made up to the time he telephoned.

The congressman said he expects a definite statement by tonight from the provost-marshal general.

It is likely, I believe, that axis prisoners may be quartered near Rupert" he said. "I am informed that the provost-marshal general is giving it careful consideration but has not yet reached a decision.

Personally, I think there is great likelihood of the Rupert locaion receiving approval.
Congressman Dworshak said that until th army either approves or rejects the Rupert location, no details will by available. He added 'If Rupert is approved, however, the camp for axis prisoners of way would probably accommodate about 3,000 men. They are establish ing a number of such camps instead of just a few larger ones, and I understand 3,000 is about the total provided for each.'
