A COMPLAINT THAT'S FAMILIAR

The possibility that War Food Administrator Chester C. Davis will soon resign the job that for months ago became too hot for Secretary of Agriculture Claude R. Wickard is bad enough in itself, but what he has to say about the food situation generally is still more serious.

He believes the present food program is not only unworkable, but that there is danger of its complete collapse.

Strangely enough, the reasons Mr. Davis has to offer for this condition are the ones we have heard so often, and it makes one wonder if the bureaucrats are entirely responsible for all the criticism that has been heaped upon them.

Davis makes the same complaint: Authority over all phases of the food program should be vested in one man or agency, and that one man or agency should appear and publicly be responsible for the entire program.

To him, war food administrator is an empty title because he has no direct responsibility for the program without authority to shape it. Actually, he believes, the present unfavorable production output is less caused by the conflicting differences over food administration.

But all proposals like Davis has to offer are considered by President Roosevelt to be a waste of time and energy, and the confusion resulting from conflicting bureaus, the chief executive apparently refuses to deviate from this policy.

President Roosevelt has any one's outstanding weakness, it's his inability to organize efficiently. For some reason he prefers a system of management that's cumbersome, slow and that does not clearly define responsibility.

EVAPORATED MILK SUPPLY ADEQUATE

CHICAGO, June 24 (AP)—Dr. Frank E. Rice, executive secretary of the Evaporated Milk Association, asserted that "all users of evaporated milk can be assured that for the present and as far as can be seen into the future, evaporated milk supplies are adequate for family needs."

Rice told a meeting of the evaporated milk industry that "manufacturers' stocks of evaporated milk are higher now than in any previous year" and declared that the government cannot be criticized for over-estimating their needs for evaporated milk.

"It is flowing into the plants at a rate equal to a year ago, which was an all time high," he said. "The industry now has on hand more than 2,000,000 cases (400,000,000 cans) approximately a two-month supply for civilians in normal times. Grocers have more than normal supplies of delivery to the grocery trade having been 25 per cent above normal since January 1."

"Government agencies have for a long time been estimating that for all war purposes 2,000,000 cases per month will be needed. However, in no month during the past month has there been taken as much as 1,000,000 cases. Manufacturing plants are now piled high with government purchased milk, awaiting shipping instructions."

LIGHTNING PLANE OUTPUT DOUBLED

DURHAM, Calif., June 24 (AP)—Lockheed Aircraft corporation has placed in operation a new, completely moving assembly line which within 60 days will, an official said, double the output of P-38 Lightning fighters which have been scoring smashing victories on the world's battle fronts.

"The new line will not only double the output of Lightnings but will also result in a 40 per cent reduction in man-hours per plane," declared Richard Von Staak, Lockheed's vice-president in charge of manufacturing.

The extra manufacturing speed is gained by eliminating pauses in the conveyor line, Von Staak said. The motion is slow but steady, a continuous four inches per minute. He added that similar continuous-moving lines will be set up within 60 days. For several sub-assemblies, another improvement will be a mechanized line to carry the plane's two Allison engines to the point on the main assembly line where they are installed.

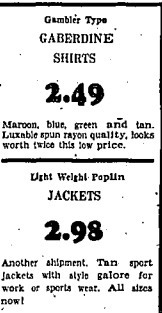

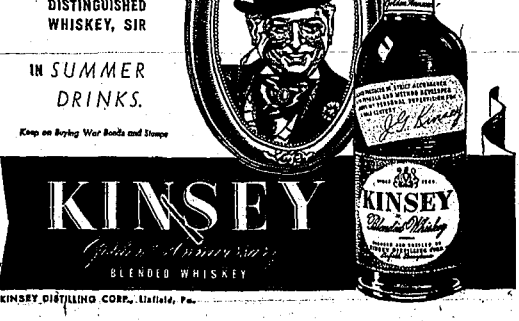

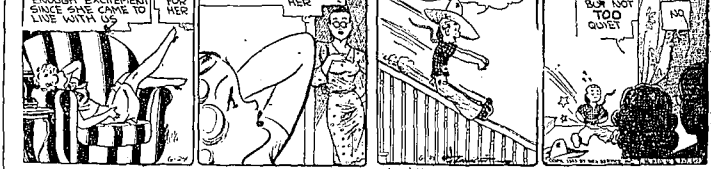
