BOISE, June 26 (UP)—A woman today stands in the spotlight of Idaho's political arena and it may turn out that upon her rests what Democratic leaders hope will be a successful campaign in 1944.

Fear Reaction
Because of her vote-getting ability and popularity, Democratic leaders feel she is the logical person to carry the party colors during a time when they fear a reaction at the polls and a possible return of the state to the Republican standard.

There are leaders who already are calling about over the state to determine whether it would be wise for them to choose her as governor, U. S. senate or as representative from the second district.

One may be sure that Mrs. Enking will not run for any of the offices unless she is assured in advance of the support of party leaders and factions all over the state. If she feels she cannot have that support to doubt she will run again for state treasurer, a post to which she has been elected six successive terms.

Woman Governor?
Of course, the one question in the minds of the Democratic leaders, and probably in that of Mrs. Enking, is whether Idaho voters would elect a woman governor. Such an election would be unprecedented in the state. In fact the seeking of the post by a woman would break precedent.

1944 CAMPAIGN STIRRINGS HEARD

BOISE, June 26—This is "ear to the ground" months in Idaho politics, and while the faint stirrings of the 1944 campaign are just beginning to be heard, speculative communications report a number of new possible candidates for the primaries a year from next August.

While Sen. D. Worth Clark mends fences through the state, and Governor Bolton ponders the reports he heard on recent trips to almost every county of the state, these darkhouses were receiving mention in informal discussions, if not more formally.

Among the most interesting of these discussions were those involving Mrs. Myrtle P. Enking, state treasurer, in the running as a likely candidate for governor. Slightly unofficial, this report is being widely circulated in more than one corner of the state, particularly north Idaho.

Also mentioned as a possible Democratic candidate for the governorship has been state Auditor Calvin E. Wright, and while this possibility is seen because of Wright's popularity with leaders of both parties, some close friends of the young auditor say he has no plans that office and probably will content himself with running for reelection to his present post.

Walker Mentioned
A possibility mentioned for the Republican governorship rate, should incumbent Bolton run for the senate as many believe he will, is Mayor Austin Walker, Boise. Walker, who succeeded Mayor J. Westerman Whitlock when the latter entered the navy, has been mentioned as a possible candidate for the post. Walker was elected to the post in 1938.

Other Possible Candidates
William Hawkins, Cour d'Alene, Democratic Kootenai county prosecutor, and Richard W. Fossell, prominent Republican lumberman, also must have had their ears burning recently from talk about the governorship race.

And, but by no means least, there are those who feel confident that E. T. Taylor, state Orange membership secretary and prominent business man, would accept the Republican designation for the state chief executive office, or for first district congressional office, for that matter, should conditions in the next few months prove to his liking.

P-47 OUTFIGHTS FOCKE-WULF 190

WASHINGTON, June 26 (UP)—The first detailed report on the new P-47 Thunderbolt fighter in action released by the war department says that its performance probably will "outmatch the much-publicized Focke-Wulf 190."

The P-47 is the U. S. army's latest high altitude fighter. The F-W 190 is the best German plane in this class. The report concerned action on two consecutive days recently over France, when P-47s shot down four Focke-Wulfs and damaged two others.

Explosion Described
Capt. Walter V. Cook, 23, Cincinnati, credited with one enemy plane destroyed, described his experience.

"The enemy made a slight turn as I dove on him, spreading their wings piece by piece on the right side of his fuselage and tail. Then I must have flown into prop wash and it threw my next burst into his left wing. There was a big puff of black smoke and a flash of fire as he rolled over on his back and blew up."

Cook's victory was confirmed by Lieut. George C. Goldstein, Hampton, Va., who acted as his observer.

On the second day the Thunderbolts were led by Col. Hubert Zentke, assistant commander of the 48th Fighter Group, and 20 miles from Dunkirk the column sighted 12 or more F-W 190s at the same time. He maneuvered his formation into position and attacked as the enemy planes began turning to the right.

Letters of administration in the \$60,000 estate left by Walter Brose, who died June 17, are sought by the widow, Mrs. Ellen Brose, Twin Falls, in a petition filed in probate court here today.

60 Hostages Die For Train Wreck
Italian authorities executed 60 hostages after several hundred fascist soldiers were killed in a munitions train wrecked while passing through a tunnel blasted by Greek guerrillas, the British radio said yesterday.

Deserter Taken To Coast Depot
Pvt. R. E. Thomas, 18, who was arrested on a check charge, was taken in custody Friday by military authorities from the Pittsburg replacement depot, Pittsburg, Calif., from which Private Thomas admitted to deserting W. W. Lowery that he had deserted.

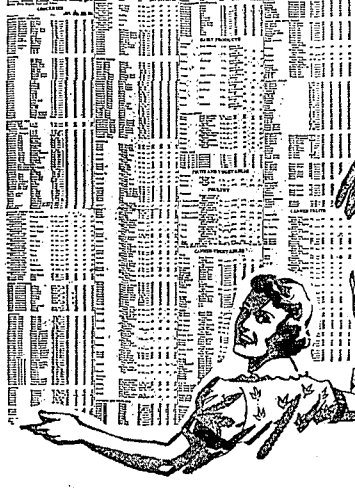
