30,000 Nazis Die in Futile Smashes at Russian Lines

MOSCOW, July 8 (AP)—Fresh Nazi reserves were reported pushing through smokes and dust along paths marked by wrecked machines and the dead today to bolster the Kursk plain offensive which the red army, fighting more brilliantly than ever before, has limited to small gains in the Belgorod sector.

Russian forces slew 30,000 Germans, destroyed or damaged 1,539 tanks and shot down 649 planes during the first three days of the battle, it was announced officially.

Nazi air force squadrons are attached constantly to the invasion armored columns under a German plan to attack by Hitler's high command hopes to pinch off the 60-mile-deep Soviet salient extending westward from Kursk.

The immediate assignment of the German paratrooper divisions to push north from Belgorod and south from Orel, 160 miles apart, to a junction somewhere behind the Russian-held rail city.

A Berlin radio dispatch broadcast by the Berlin radio said air forces were used in both sides in massed attacks before dawn today.

The German high command communique also broadcast from Berlin, declared army units, anti-air fighter-bombers and tactical air forces destroyed more than 500 Soviet tanks and 193 planes yesterday.

The Russians declared July that Belgorod was the only area in which the Germans made any advances, and these were limited to regions of less than 100 meters.

ARMS TOTAL MAY QUADRUPLE AS NELSON ASSERTS

TORONTO, Ont., July 8 (AP)—Charmers Donald M. Nelson of the war production board declared today that the allied arms output in 1944 may be nearly four times as great as that of the axis.

The North American continent alone, he said, is producing this year twice as much in combat munitions as the axis.

Nelson's remarks came less than 407 miles from the front in the Canadian club that the allies out-produced the axis by almost two to one in 1942, and that in 1943 the United Nations output may "reliably" be expected to meet three times axis production.

Nelson warned the enemy today not to "take too much comfort from the so-called slogan of the front in the United States in recent days."

Although the trend toward victory is apparent, he emphasized that it can be sustained only by the continued effort of the people.

Line to 11 Jap Warships Sunk in 20-minute Fight

ALLIED HEADQUARTERS, AUSTRALIA, July 8 (UPI)—U. S. jungle forces; fanning out from new bridges only a few miles distant, closed in on the last two enemy bases in New U. S. landings on New Georgia island today following a smashing 9-to-1 American naval victory in the battle of Kula gulf.

Nine, and perhaps 11, Japanese cruisers and destroyers were destroyed by American warships in a little more than 20 minutes of actual fighting early Tuesday, a communique from Gen. Douglas MacArthur, supreme commander of coordinated south and southwest Pacific offensives, announced.

Another Japanese warship was damaged to complete a clean sweep for the American forces—the sinking of the destroyer of the Japanese ship sighted in the battle.

The action, biggest since the start of the war to 100 and perhaps 150, cost 100 American lives, including 100 American only the 9,700-ton light cruiser Helena sunk and booted the major force.

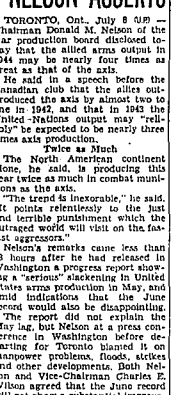

ITALY SEA POWER STEADILY DROPS

By VIRGIL FENIKLEY

ALLIED HEADQUARTERS, NORTH AFRICA, July 8 (AP)—Increased sea and air cover and the reluctance of the Italian fleet to come out and fight prevented one of its major problems for this week as they attempt to frantically dispose of the Mediterranean and adjoining territory.

The allied fleet and its armadas have won a second valuable bases as a result of the Tunisian campaign, and our strength in the two vital categories of three-dimensional warfare has grown steadily. Meanwhile, Italian sea power has declined. Mussolini's fleet is so badly dispersed it would be extremely difficult to assemble sufficient power to offer anything like formidable opposition to the Mediterranean.

Allied Forces Flexible

The great flexibility of our land and sea forces enables us to strike a number of Mediterranean targets—the mainland of southern Europe as well as the islands—simultaneously or one after another in rapid order.

The Italian fleet has suffered a number of severe losses, especially in carriers, small ships and merchantmen. As the fascist admirals study their lineup today, they must be exceedingly uncomfortable because the sea is so badly peppered along the Adriatic and also at the heel of Italy while our units are strung out along the western coast of the continent all the way from Naples to Greece. Trying to assemble their scattered ships would be a mammoth undertaking and also would expose Mussolini's navy to allied naval and air power.

Almost Scuttled

With the allies holding Malta, Pantelleria, Algeria and Tunisia, it would be almost suicidal to try to run ships from eastern or southern ports through the narrow Sicilian Channel, which is only a few miles wide. This alley-way now is almost dominated by allied aircraft and ships.

In three major sea clashes in the war Italy has suffered her heaviest losses: the battle of Matapan in which the ships of Admiral Sir Andrew Bonaime Cunningham scored a smashing victory during the time it took to drink an after-dinner cup of coffee and almost without leaving the table scratched from the British ships.

Then Cunningham's air fleet flew straight into Taranto harbor and delivered splintered torpedoes which further reduced Italian sea power and resulted in the policy of keeping the fascist units tightly sealed up in Italy's most remote harbors.

The third was the Tunisian campaign during which hundreds of thousands of tons of Italian ships were sunk or damaged. The losses were especially heavy in tankers, merchantmen and small boats such as E-boats and destroyers.

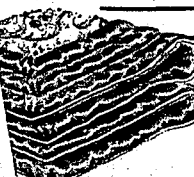

PAPER PENNIES HOBBY SUCCESS

BOISE, July 8 (AP)—Those paper pennies being sold by the Federal Reserve bureau printed last fall didn't work out too well from a usage standpoint, but they did give the public a new view of what was a routine success.

When treasury officials announced last year that because of the shortage of coins the government would no longer be minted, the bureau's problem only briefly.

"What paper pennies to take the place of," Harlan, director of the Shortly Treasurer 100,000 small pieces of paper, made their appearance.

They were blue and white and carried the following words: "Redeemable before June 30, 1944—value one cent." On the reverse side was a blue "V" and a miniature drawing of the Great Seal of the United States.

Many Requests Received
Newspapers in all parts of the United States have carried the story of the pennies and it was only a matter of time until letters, telegrams and telephone calls began to plague the Chamber of Commerce office requesting a few for souvenirs.

Then came requests for the substitute pennies from lawyers, doctors, sailors, soldiers, marines, publicists, coin collectors, numismatists, societies, banks, including the Chase National of New York, and hundreds of others.

And more than 10,000 requests were received from every section of the United States and Canada. A typical letter received from a collector is this one, written by Mrs. Amy Ellen Davis, Chicago.

Bought 100 "Pennies"
"I have read with keen interest a newspaper article concerning the paper pennies. Since I am a collector of such things and also supply other collectors, please send me 100 of them."

A short time later, a second request was received from Mrs. Davis, this time for an additional 200.

Not many persons have attempted to have the pennies returned, Harlan said. "So far we have redeemed only one \$10 worth of them."

Since the paper coupons had a cash value of one cent each, this represents one per cent of those printed. The chamber still is redeeming any brought in.

Harlan explains that the pennies were issued as a convenience to merchants to help them make change when real coin ran short.

Merchants would deposit a box in the chamber and take out 500 paper pennies. Now they can bring back paper pennies and get 50 cents.

Collectors bought them at the same rate. The chamber bore expenses for lithographing the pennies.

But even though it didn't work as planned, and few paper pennies made their way to general circulation, it turned out to be an excellent publicity stunt, he agreed.

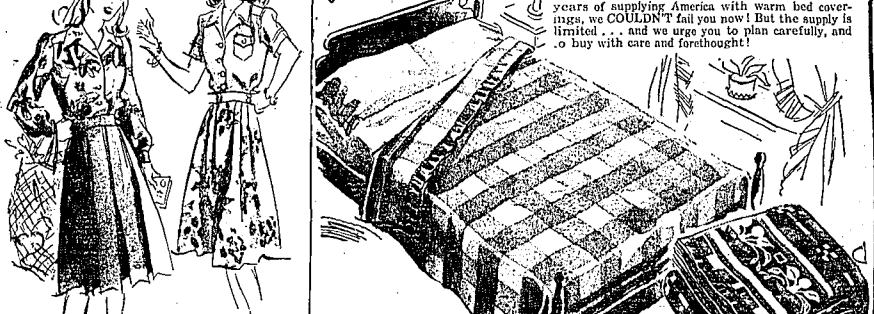

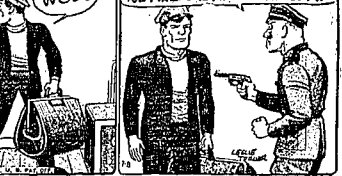

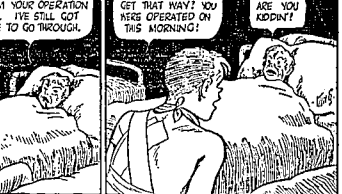
