

S. landings on New Georgia island today following a smashing 94.0-1 Am-erican naval victory in the battle of Kula gulf, Nine, and perhaps 11, Japanese cruisers and de-stroyers were destroyed by American warships in a little more than 20 minutes of actual fighting early Tuesday, a communique from Gen. Douglas MacAr-thur, supreme commander of coordinated south and southwest Pacific offensives, announced.
