### DOT ASKS HUNT CAMP USED FOR WAR PRISONERS

BOISE, July 29 (AP)—Governor Bottelofen today asked the federal government to provide "needless expenditure of money" in Idaho by consolidation of the Paul prison camp, now under construction, with the Japanese relocation camp at Hunt, 20 miles away. The consolidation was proposed as a measure to curtail construction of the Hunt Japanese camp for use of war prisoners, should the hunt camp be closed at Bunkyo, and had been proposed in press dispatches.

The governor made public a telegram he sent to Dillon B. Myers, chief of the Federal Bureau of Investigation at Washington, urging the change of plans for the hunt camp for which work has already been started.

The telegram reads: "The press dispatches credit you with the belief that the hunt camp should be abandoned at an early date. Inasmuch as war prisoners are just being received, construction of large air camp to cost more than million dollars at Hunt, Idaho, 20 miles from Hunt, Japanese camp, it seems that immediate action should be taken to halt construction of prison camp at the Japanese camp site."

"Will you bring this to attention of proper authorities so that they may be taken to effect this million dollar project? The citizens of Idaho are opposed to this proposal with all its attendant waste of money."

Backed by G. C. Earl W. Murphy, chamber secretary, continued: "The Japanese camp can not be used for war prisoners, and more than 2,000 of the evacuees who formerly were quartered there have left and are now being sent to the Paul camp. The other vacant space by war prisoners."

### CIVILIANS TO GET MORE 1943 EGGS

WASHINGTON, July 29 (AP)—The little red hen stays on the job, but the American chicken can't lay as many eggs in the next 12 months as she did in 1942. But that probably isn't still more. The war food administration said today that it is increasing the egg supply expected to provide for the needs of our armed forces and our allies. It says more than 100 million eggs are being produced for civilian use. It says that the increase should give civilians about 238 eggs apiece during the 12-month period which started July 15—about 18 eggs more than the average during the calendar year 1942.

The production was contained in a report announcing egg allocations for the next 12 months. It says that the country now has grown so much that the increased supply of eggs will not be adequate.

### FEED SHORTAGE

CHICAGO, July 29 (AP)—There is a shortage of feed for the nation's poultry, a poultry executive said today. He said that the general public is not buying enough feed for the country's 10,000 hatcheries. He said that the shortage is estimated to amount to 300,000 tons over last year.

ALLIED HEADQUARTERS, NORTH AFRICA, July 20 (UP)—The top-sep battle for Catania raged more bitterly than ever today, with the British eighth army tightening a strangle-hold on the east coast port, while an allied communique reported signs of mutiny among Italian troops elsewhere in Sicily.

# U.S. AIR OUTPUT TURNS WAR TIDE

LONDON, July 20 (AP)—Describing the flood of American production which will sweep the tide of the air war against the Axis in 1947, the latest issue of "America's War Aircraft," declares that "we are on the threshold of mighty victory."

In a forecast for the 1947 volume, which is being released by the War Relocation Authority, the noted writer on air warfare, concludes:

"The air alone will probably not bring Germany down. The war will end only by the bombing of her industries and communications. Without such bombing it probably could not be won at all.

"The air arm is in fact an indispensable partner in the great joint endeavor and may prove to be the leading partner."

Proven Types Preferred  
Covering the work of the new volume shows how emphasis for the past year has been on the development of proven types of warplanes, rather than on the production of new types. The book, in more than 200 pages and hundreds of illustrations, contains a detailed list of the types listed in the 1944 issue but did not add very many new planes.

Noting that the United States produced nearly 5,000 primary fighters in 1942 and in December turned out 5,500 military aircraft, the report said that the total was not only greater than all the Axis output for that month but that it was nearly twice as high as likely to be reached in time.
