On this 35th birthday of the federal bureau of investigation, it seems fitting to say what many of us have been thinking for some time now. That is that of all agencies ensaged in the American war effort none has approached so close to perfection as has the FBI.

But right down to the moment of writing there is no concrete evidence that axis agents have got away with even a mini-num of organized asolatoge. 


