AGE WILL RETIRE OFFICERS SEPT. 1

SALT LAKE CITY, Aug. 4 (AP)—Mandatory retirement of army officers from the United States Army will be effective Sept. 30, an announcement at headquarters of Gen. Kennerly, chief of staff, commanding general of the ninth service command, national headquarters.

The age limit is 60 years for officers up to and including the rank of colonel and for brigadier generals, and 64 for major generals, lieutenant generals and all officers of the general staff and all officers of the general staff and all officers of the general staff.

The government owes a salute to the stockholder older officers who rendered their services at the outbreak of the limited emergency. Their patriotism is evidenced by their leaving the peace and comfort of retirement to take up difficult tasks of war administration or to remain at such tasks after reaching an age when retirement could be accepted.

I regret your departure and wish for you all continued success in the future and peace from the trying grind of the war effort."

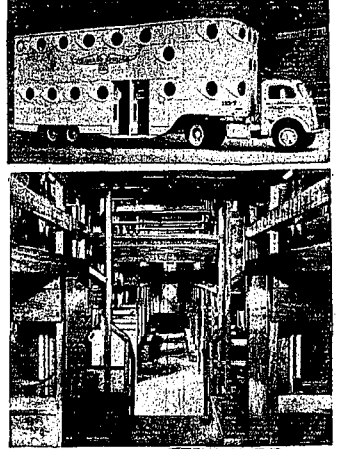

Physicians on Air Raid Find 50 Missions Flier's Capacity

MIAMI, Fla., Aug. 5 (AP)—American bomber crews completing 50 missions over enemy territory can come home with unscathed air. The general of at least five army doctors of the north African command, a group of Flying Fortress gunners disclosed.

Sgt. Bill Drews, Upper Darby, Penn., and Sgt. Charlie Hudson, Terre Haute, Ind., veterans of the spectacular American raid on Rome, told how physicians accompanied them on an earlier mission over flak-protected Messina.

Announced intention of the army doctors, Drews and Hudson continued, was to determine whether bomber crews could stand the strain of 50 consecutive missions, instead of 50.

4th Assignments The raid on Messina was the 40th assignment for both men. As the planes roared over the six-hour "escape port" of Sicily—described by Hudson as "one of the toughest flat spots in the Mediterranean"—several of the Fortresses were hit by anti-aircraft fire. All the physicians were wounded, one suffering an abdominal wound and another a broken arm.

\$56,444,954 PAID BY TAX CHISELERS

WASHINGTON, Aug. 5 (AP)—The treasury reported it had rounded up an additional \$56,444,954 from tax chasers during the past year and in doing so had taken out of circulation these "chiselers" against the nation's wartime revenue needs: "A professional card shark whose 'take over' a period of years approached six figures, a wealthy lottery card, a racketeer tax adviser, and two purveyors of 'blue sky' financing stock."

Summarizing the annual report of W. H. Woolf, chief of the internal revenue bureau's intelligence unit, the treasury said the exposure, production and conviction of these individuals were merely incidental and to the business of hunting down tax frauds. Woolf's agents, the department reported, spotted the additional revenues in the course of nearly 1,000 investigations which led to tax evasion charges against 85 persons, all but three of whom were convicted.

MOSCOW TRYING TO DIVIDE NAZIS Lone Yankee Captures Sicily Town to 'Save Ammunition'

LONDON, Aug. 5 (AP)—The suddenness of Italy's collapse and the fact that something of the same nature will occur eventually in Germany has focused increasing attention on Moscow's "free Germany" committee.

The committee also affords a means of German propaganda in the high command sentiment when, as and if the generals consider that continuation of the war is futile.

Joe's Stalin's asserting that Germany can not be deprived of all military power is the type of logic which may prove most appealing to the military chiefs who are to decide that Hitler has lost the war.

However, the military angles of the free Germany propaganda are not believed likely to override the Russian determination to punish war criminals. This is basic Soviet policy and there is little doubt the Russians number among war criminals many members of the German high command as well as a long list of army commanders whose ravages against the civilian population, and their activities are being chronicled for post war trials.

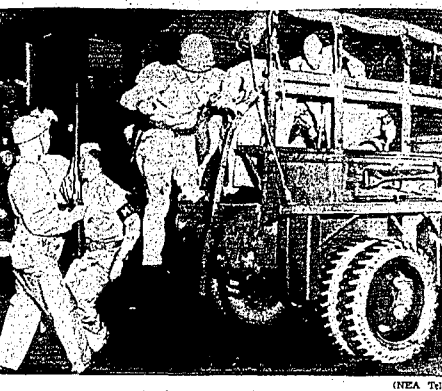
