SUGAR OFF THIRD FROM LAST YEAR

DENVER, Aug. 15 (AP)—The president of the National Sugar Association estimated that the decrease in American sugar production this year was one-third less than the 1942 output because the government had failed to maintain a complete position of sugar in other vital war crops.

Frank A. Kemp, Denver, president of the Great Western Sugar Company, said the industry was encouraged by a statement by the War Relocation Authority that sugar acreage will not be restricted in 1944 as reassuring as far as they go.

But restriction in acreage will be placed on the amount of sugar that can be produced in any one year. 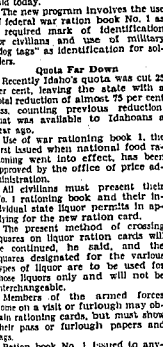
