FAIR PRICES ON CROPS PLEDGED

WASHINGTON, Oct. 7.—War Food Administrator Marvin Jones assured congress the nation's farmers will get a "fair and adequate price" for producing the greatest food supply in history next year.

White Jones was outlining his problems before the agriculture committees. House banking committee struggled with the task of shaping commodity credit corporation legislation in a form acceptable to both congress and the administration.

1. Representative Crawford, R. Mich., demand an accounting of the loss and volume in the huge stockpiles of government held crops, canned goods and meats.

2. B. Hubton, chief of the CCC, report that all commodities now are selling about parity except barley, wheat, rye, cow peas, cotton, hay, peanuts and lemons.

3. Charles W. Wilson of the national cooperative milk producers federation asserts support to increase the price of dairy products he increased, "we may wind up with a decreased production wholly inadequate for civilian needs."

4. Representative Monroney, D. Okla., argues that an increase in the price of dairy products will mean an increase in the price of corn, and in turn to other price booms, thus breaking the "chicken-egg" program.

5. Poultry Prices Drop. Meanwhile, an office of price administration ruling reduced, in effect, the retail price of all sold cut-up pieces smaller than halves or quarters.

The ruling, effective next Monday, stipulated that to command maximum base prices, drawn poultry must be sold and delivered to retailers in whole, split or quarter carcasses.

Prices for smaller pieces generally have been higher. The agency also ruled that drawn poultry prices must be sold and delivered to consumers within a 40-mile radius of the slaughter point.

Another OPA ruling was that poultry which has been killed, but not bled or plucked, must be sold at live rather than dressed poultry prices. Koster-killed poultry is exempt.
