He would like to see us concentrate in the west, where he has no immediate ambitions, if any at all, and leave to him the Balkans area where Russian interest is strong.

We are interested in winning the war wherever it can be won. If victory can come quickest by an Angio-American invasion of the Bnikans before the cross-channel climax, we can't be greatly worried by post-war am-

bitions.

New York bank statements for the quarter ending Sept, 30 are an indication of the present degree of inflation.

It's an old custom in normal times for 4-financial institution to have on deposit a sum not more than 10 times its capital, surplus and undivided profits. A survey of reent balance sheets shows that the money placed with cashiers has almost doubled since the eutbreak of the war. The Chase National bank and National City bank are examples with ratios of 1:17 And 1:19 respectively.

There is seant opportunity today for man-sements to go into the open market to raise fresh capital. They can make certain minor adjustments to strengthen their own stand-ing but they cannot hope to catch up with the vast increase in deposits largely occasioned by large government operations like

When peace domes private enterprise will be asked to grant loans to keep workers employed, to purchase raw materials and to depend largely on the condition of fiscal concerns. If their position is greatly extended, they may be more cautious than formerly about risking customers funds. If private banks cannot supply venture capital, the government will step in with its big bag of gold, and industry will be mortgaged by Uncle Sam.
