Reds Smash Enemy Rail Escape Line

MOSCOW, Oct. 18 (AP)—Russian forces, cutting in behind Dniepropetrovsk, began shelling the trunk railway running west to Besarabia today, cutting the primary retreat route from the flanked German stronghold inside the Dnieper bend. The red army, after crawling through a fortified German belt, west of the Dnieper, crossed the east of Kremenchuk, was pouring through the breach and threatening to envelop Dniepropetrovsk, from detachments revealed.

The liberation of Kiev is imminent, the newspaper Pravda said in declaring that the middle Dnieper bend was entirely cleared, and the whole Dnieper line was cracked.

The threat to the German armies in the southwest Ukraine and the Crimea, mounted heavily, and also increased that the red command was beginning the evacuation of the Black Sea peninsula, while scattering troops by the thousands at the middle Dnieper.

Gen. Rodion Y. Malinovsky's men went secretly southward through the new gap in the Dnieper line, posing an imminent threat to Dniepropetrovsk from the rear and east, and the Mezzolano area.

The Dnieper bend is being crumpled. The German defenses southeast of Kremenchuk and laid out in the vicinity of the bend, are in the arms of the Dnieper.

Field reports said that a substantial German force was annihilated during the fighting. The Germans forced the river, Pravda said, the Germans moved up a distance of 100 miles.

GERMANS SINK HOSPITAL SHIP

LONDON, Oct. 18 (AP)—The British hospital ship *Winnipeg* was sunk off Galapagos Sept. 13 as the result of "deliberate" German action. The ship was carrying 100 American survivors, reported to have been killed.

Survivors reported that all the lifeboats were destroyed and that large Red Cross symbols were clearly visible.

"There could be no mistake," a witness said.

The sinking presumably occurred during allied landings on the Galapagos. There were no survivors, it was reported. The vessel was carrying 100 American survivors, reported to have been killed with the fifth army.

Of those killed, five were nurses and 95 were patients. The *Winnipeg* was a nurse ship, further identified, and the British navy doctors and the ship's officers.

MANUFACTURERS DEFY INCREASE OF ADDED TAXES

WASHINGTON, Oct. 18 (AP)—The National Association of Manufacturers today expressed its opposition to all proposed new taxes in a statement that welcomed the administration's proposal to increase the tax on the production of goods.

The association's statement said that the proposed tax would reduce national revenue. C. Cheever Cowden, chairman of NAMA's committee on government finance and chairman of the board of the American Finance Corporation, Los Angeles, presented the NAMA "no tax increase" recommendation to the House ways and means committee.

Cowden claimed that the present tax would bring in to the federal treasury \$4,500,000,000, which he said would be reduced to \$3,500,000,000 by the treasury.

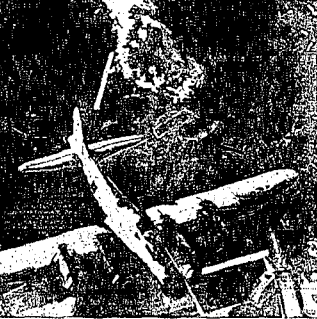

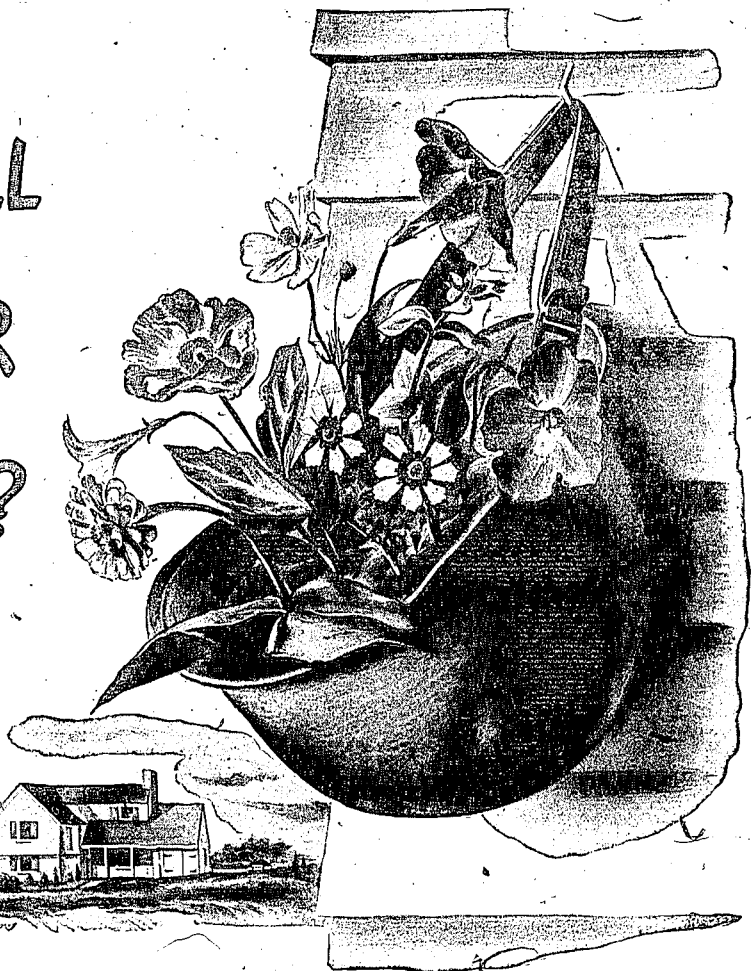

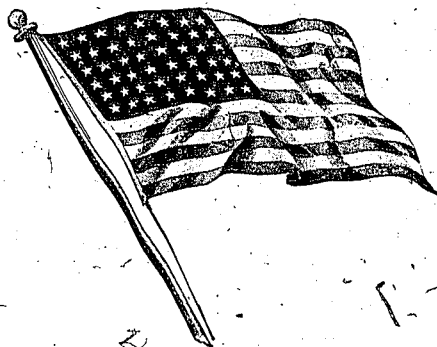
