ALLIED HEADQUARTERS

ALLIED HEADQUARTERS IN THE MIDDLE EAST, Oct. 20 (AP)—Buttered German forces were reported flanking back today under a new defense line along the Italian battlefront today under the impact of pilder drives by allied troops, who advanced five to seven miles and captured five more key towns.

After losing the crucial battle of the Volturno, German Marshal Albert Kesselring's divisions were trying desperately to dig in on a new stretch of the Volturno river, 35 miles southeast of Rome.

Nazi forces were scattering the earth of the Italian countryside as they gave ground before the hard, frontal attack of the British troops, destroying what they could not take.

Maintaining the pressure on the German rear guards, Lt. Gen. Walter Krueger's troops, the fifth army occupied the important towns of Dragoni, Rocca Romano and Pignone.

In the Adriatic coastal sector, Gen. Sir Kenneth G. Anderson's British eighth army forced ahead four miles to seize Petricchio, nine miles along the coast from the Volturno, and was still working gains of five to seven miles.

Petricechio fell after heavy fighting in which the British used tanks and artillery to blast out the stubborn German garrison.

Tanks Taken Among the captured towns were Guardafiera, seven miles west of Lerno; Ippona, six miles west of Lerno; and Petricchio, six miles west of Lerno.

While Kesselring tried to set up a new defense line, the British were sending reinforcements to the Italian front.

Rail and highway traffic on the Adriatic coast was cut off.

SIDETRACKING THE CONSTITUTION

The administration is working out plans for a United Nations Relief Administration. The original version proposed revised sections of congressmen. The final draft is expected to be acceptable to congress as a whole.

It is not, however, intended to submit the agreement to congress for ratification. President Roosevelt, Premier Churchill, presumably Premier Stalin and Marshal Chiang Kai-shek will sign, and then congress will be asked to approve by joint resolution. The funds necessary to finance the scheme.

A joint resolution will require only a majority vote in each house. Ratification of a treaty would require a two-thirds vote in each house, whereupon the house and the senate, each by majority vote, would have to agree to the necessary appropriation.

So far as the relief project is concerned this is of no particular importance. Heller can and should be satisfied by executive action except as to the raising of the funds.

But word is circulating among persons who usually are very well informed as to administrative details that this is a sort of a trap to test out a new short-cut to treaty-making, in order to avoid the situation which arose after World War I when a small group of big money men had more than half the blocked approval of American membership in the League of Nations.

As Raymond Clapper writes, "the relief administration is but the first of many other projects that will be created as part of the United Nations." Some will be of emergency nature, like the relief organization. Others will be semi-permanent—or permanent—and will influence our international relationships for years to come.

Does the American public want these alliances to be made by the executive, with no input from congress? Or will it insist on the purse strings? If so, there is nothing in the relief administration subterfuge about which to worry.

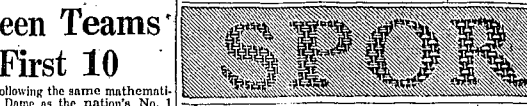

SPANGLER RAPS WHOLE NEW DEAL

MISSOULA, Mont., Oct. 20 (AP)—Harrison E. Spangler, national Republican leader, today sharply criticized the new deal with a "contrary and reactionary" philosophy. He based his attack on the idea of an all-powerful centralized state which controls our daily lives here exercised in far-off Washington.

Spangler's address concluded a two-day planning conference of more than 400 party leaders from Montana, Wyoming, Washington, Oregon, Utah, Idaho, North Dakota, South Dakota and Colorado.

New Deal Confusing

He accused the Roosevelt administration of transferring the power of the courts to the administrative department "so that we now have not a government of the people, but a government of arbitrary orders, executive decrees and congressional directives."

He said the new deal "and its paltry guard" has created an all-powerful horde of office-holders who control the nation's money, credit, and tax money to finance more than 150 government periodicals and publications which are, he said, merely used to promote a fourth term campaign.

He said government incompetence has plunged the nation into a period of waste, extravagance, deficit and a peacetime debt which will be a burden upon every citizen for generations to come.

One of Series

Spangler spoke before a final assembly of the delegates and endorsed the Mackinac Island declaration in which the Republican post-war planning committee asked that American participation in the world wide program of reconstruction of peace without any forfeiture of American sovereignty.

The Missoula conference was one in a series being conducted by Spangler over the country to correct the party organization and publicity machinery and get the party ready for the 1948 campaign. Sessions have already been held in the east and midwest.
