United Nations Pledge Action to Insure Peace After Defeat of Enemy

WASHINGTON, Nov. 1 (AP)—The United States, Great Britain, Russia and China have pledged themselves to united action by the post-war defeat of their enemies and to establishment of a "general international organization" for maintaining peace and security.

This declaration was signed by the big four of the United Nations at the Moscow conference attended by Secretary of State Cordell Hull, Foreign Minister Anthony Eden of Britain and Foreign Commissar Vyacheslav Molotov of Russia. It was made public simultaneously today in Washington, London and Moscow.

Highlighting fruits of a conference which included also declarations governing the restoration of a non-aligned Italy, a free Austria, and Roosevelt-Churchill-Stalin, a pledge to publish the four-power declaration of the four-power declaration stressed unity of action and consultation between the four nations.

In a joint communique, the tripartite conference, which included an American-British-Russian-European advisory committee, in London to examine European questions arising as the war developed. The four nations also decided to set up an advisory council on Italy with representatives from the four nations.
