Allied Leaders Plan To Smash Foe; Japs Will Lose All Gains

President Roosevelt, Marshal Stalin of Russia and Prime Minister Churchill of Great Britain were reported conferring today in the Persian capital of Tehran on a supreme drive to crush Germany before winter ends.

Dispatches from Washington and London suggested the big three were making as fateful a decision for Germany as that announced last night for Japan: A solemn resolve to thrash Japan into unconditional surrender, tear away the sprawling empire she has looted in the last 50 years and return the Japanese to their own insignificant home islands.

Formal announcement of the momentous North African conference between President Roosevelt, Prime Minister Churchill and President Chiang Kai-shek came from Cairo last night. President Roosevelt and Churchill were disclosed only to have left Cairo for an unannounced destination on Friday after completing their talks.

# Minor League Revolt Against Landis Fails

NEW YORK, Dec. 2 (AP)—The revolution against the control of Kenesaw M. Landis and William G. Brannan over minor league baseball has collapsed in a brawl that brought roars of illegality and threats to take the entire minor league set-up to the courts.

When the smoke cleared away, Landis still was the head man in power and Brannan was re-elected president of the National Association of Professional Baseball Leagues for five more years at \$25,000 a year.

Although in the driver's seat, it took some fast "footwork" by Brannan in his handling of the national association meeting to remain there.

The explosion on the floor of the convention and the resultant election of Brannan and renewal of one year of the 1940-41 agreement, by which Landis would have the big stick over the minors, was by far the hottest action of the week-long winter baseball meeting.

Although the attempted rebellion was broken up by the national association convention, the insurgent leagues declared they weren't going to take this lying down. As a result, they went into an immediate renege session and it was learned they would appeal the crucial vote over voting privileges to 10 suspended leagues directly to Landis.

For Landis to take jurisdiction in the battle, the case would have to be based on the ground that conduct detrimental to baseball was involved. And the insurrectionists were prepared to claim just that.

The lid was blown off in the national association get-together by the rebellion aimed at ending the district control over the minors. This was sponsored by the three powerful doubles-A leagues—the International, Pacific coast and American associations—and the Piedmont and Big Circles.

But Brannan gave back to 14 suspended leagues the right to vote and the nine operating leagues took away from them a few months ago for failure to operate in 1943.

By doing this he explained his reasoning to the insurgent leagues. He said the national association agreement he never knew existed—Brannan
