DUST COLLECTORS SHIPPED TO MILL

Dust collectors will be installed in the new alfalfa mill here to a condition that has caused certain people to feel that the dust is being blown into the bins in a manner expected to keep much of the solid matter from escaping into the air in the neighborhood of the mill.

That collecting equipment includes a system of fan and outlet filter screen to catch the dust as the air goes through. Concrete blocks are being laid into the plant around the mill, and for construction of a fireproof building to house the fans and other dust-collecting equipment will be stored.

Walker said Wednesday that the company is anxious to take any steps necessary to stop its mill from causing any harm to the community and its neighbors. He said he did not think that the dust is causing any harm, but it is understood by all people who may have heard of the objection raised by some.

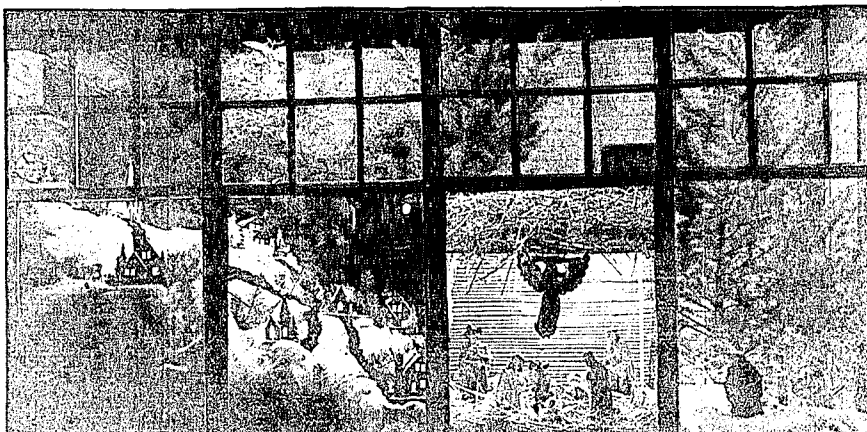

NAZIS THREATEN HANGING REVENGE

LONDON, Dec. 22 (AP)—The Nazi Propaganda News Agency reported today that as a result of the war guilt trial at Nuremberg, German military courts soon will "decide" with Anglo-Saxon prisoners' accused of violating International Law.

A Berlin broadcast quoting a Transoceanic dispatch carried the implied threat of destruction against American and British armies in retaliation for the hanging of three German officers at Nuremberg after they were convicted of war guilt.

TUCKER'S NATIONAL HERB GIG

VETERANS—The White House welfare group and cabinet officers are busy today with the return home of the veterans.

Although the legislature ordered the liquidation of the national youth administration, the civilian conservation corps and the farm security administration will remain operative for many years.

Only a few employees are being transferred to other agencies. Roosevelt, Henry Hopkins and George A. Brown are among their department heads.

Their work will be done by the veterans who they get back.

The relief covers the three organizations as the means through which the benefits of education, employment and retraining can be extended to millions of ex-servicemen. With Magic Valley already one of the richest agricultural sections in the United States, it is reassuring to expect that this section of Idaho may soon make a place for itself in the field of industry.

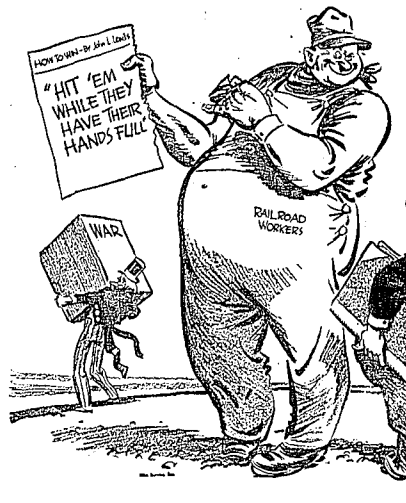
