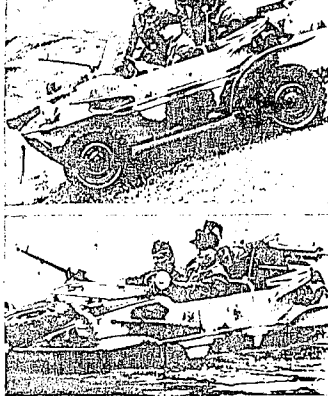

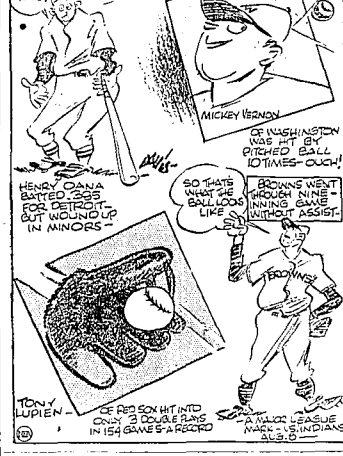

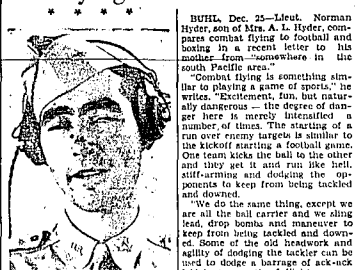

### GERMAN ROCKETS DECLARED FUTILE

SEATTLE, Dec. 25.—One of the most complete reports on Germany's latest desperate attempt to develop counter weapons to the flying Fortress was made in Seattle Friday by Wallace Brawl, vice president in charge of engineering at the Boeing Aircraft company plant.

Brawl, returning to the Seattle office after a trip across the Atlantic six weeks ago to study the Germans' vital projects in action, said Germany's rocket carrying planes were "dead soup" for American gunners.

**Hit Like Shell**  
He said the rocket gets the wall-pot of a five-inch shell, spreads into flying pieces of shrapnel like a banana peeling when it explodes—and these hurtling pieces of metal are murder for any bomber they hit.

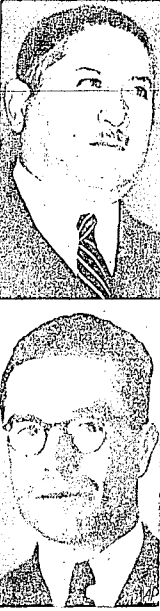
"But the bombers are taking a terrific amount of punishment and they are still coming back," Brawl said. Although he said he had not learned of a case of a direct hit with a rocket, "I am sure a direct hit would mean the plane was gone."

**Disadvantage Great**  
The disadvantages of the rocket weapon are that while carrying them, they simulate a bomb. In comparison, a defensive allied fighter plane, Brawl said.

And so far as rockets fired from gun installations, along the French coast are concerned, it is admitted that British military experts are not worried at all.

"A rocket installation is pretty hard to hit, and British intelligence is on its toes. They watch the Germans setting up an installation, and when it's about ready, they knock it off."

### KAISER CONDUCTS MUSTER-OUT POLL

OAKLAND, Calif., Dec. 25.—Hubert J. Kaiser, who believes that postwar reconstruction of industry is an immediate priority, observed today that he already has taken a sample "muster-out poll" out of his about shipyard.

The poll followed the maritime commission's announcement that "we are over the hump in ship building."

Kaiser's survey, believed to be the first such information gathered since the business, trends started showing a general employment leveling off, followed his announcement that "the peak of America's war production is over in almost every town."

**No Immediate Problem**  
The industrialist, who studied shipyarding trends and now has his sights on "padding" reconstructions to practice production strategy, said that the "muster-out poll" does not mean there is an immediate prospect of a large unemployment problem at his shipyards employing 20,000 persons.

"But all this we have to prepare for," the "muzzle builder" said. "We would be wise to plan for the lightning strikes that war has here and there. The generals will observe the end of the battle zone on a certain date. But the industrial front has already been broken in most factories. The unemployed job seeker should get out of town, get 75 per cent want to stay and work at the shipyards at the end of the war."

Reasons given for the others expressed desire to get further education, to re-enter their former trades or professions, or to engage in farming or create small business fields.

Of 460 women, 62 per cent want to stay in the shipyards. Half of them want to leave and get out of town, and the other half desire to go out for the war "and to get married, go back to the farm, go to school some more, become a factory or opera singer, or retire early from being lady waiters, etc.

### \$77,000 ESTATE DIVISION DELAYED

The estate includes an undivided three-fifths interest in 40 acres of land lying southeast of Twin Falls, an undivided three-fifths interest in 6.50 acres of rough land in Twin Falls county, a quantity of livestock and sheep ranch equipment along with nettle proceeds, money on deposit and other assets.

The will provides for creation of a trust to be administered by Edward Yzagui until Joseph Yzagui shall have military service, after which the small net proceeds for maintenance of the estate at the age of a trustee, to be followed by the end of the war.

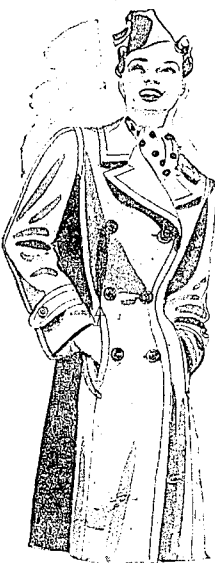
