FDR Orders Seizure To Avert Tie-up of U.S. Transportation

NASHINGTON, Dec. 23 (PP)—America's entire railroad system went under army control today, taken over by order of President Roosevell to avert a strike that threatened to interfere with "major military offensives now planned."

Swiftly taking over physical possession of the railroads, the army is concentrating troops with railroad experience to supplement any possible manpower shortages.

Secretary Stinson disclosed the use of troops at a special news conference. He said an organization had been set up to operate the railroads and that wages and labor conditions as of 7 o'clock last night would be held in "status quo" until the railroads were returned to civilian munagement.

Somervell and Stinson declared emphatically that the railroads would be kept operating.


