WASHINGTON, Dec. 28.—The OPA aimed a blow Monday at high prices on new brands of whiskey which have appeared on the market within the last year or so.

Price ceilings were imposed at the discretion of the War Relocation Authority for wholesalers and retailers as well as for the retail trade.

The action is calculated to roll back consumer prices on some brands. Effective Jan. 1, the flat maximum prices are applied to all new brands of domestic whiskey introduced since March, 1942.

The action is directed at bolstering the original whiskey price ceiling regulations which pertain only to those brands then in stock. After that regulation was announced new and unfamiliar names appeared on whiskey bottles and in many cases were subject to the ceiling.
