PUSH TRIED TO SEEN FOR 30 CHARGED WITH CONSPIRACY

WASHINGTON, Jan. 4 (AP)—The department officials today announced the trial of 30 persons—28 men and two women—indicted by a federal grand jury yesterday on charges of conspiring with Nazi leaders to overthrow the government of the United States.

John Rogge, special assistant to Attorney General Francis Biddle, said he was anxious to bring the defendants to trial as quickly as possible although he was possible there in securing some arrangements.

New Defendants. And he said, there is also the possibility that new defendants will be added to the conspiracy case.

TAXICAB DRIVER LICENSE PLANNED

Twin Falls taxicab drivers will be individually licensed under the terms of an ordinance given Tuesday night's meeting, and which is scheduled to receive its first official reading at next week's meeting.

HOYT URGES PLAN FOR ATTACK NEWS

WASHINGTON, Jan. 4 (AP)—Tammie Hoyt, with the aid of the office of war information, declared Monday that arrangements for the news of the attack on Europe "should be built into the battle plan."

Hoyt, holding an informal press conference immediately after turning over his GWT post to Victor W. Healy, Jr., managing editor of the New Orleans Times-Picayune, said he expected that the invasion strategy would include plans for aggressive and swift coverage of news from the front.

Marines trained.

The Marine Corps set up a "sprint pattern" of news and picture coverage at the front, and the landings in New Britain, he said.

"Unless the arrangements to provide the news of battle are built into the battle plan, the people are not going to get the story. That is proved, I think, at Tarawa, when I consider the several coverage in the history of warfare."

Healy, sworn in as head of OWI's domestic branch only twenty minutes before, said he considered Hoyt that the public should get an accurate, realistic picture of military operations as quickly as security will permit.

Wanted straight news.

"Palmer Hoyt and I both believe the American people have strong eyes and good ears," he said. "They can take the news straight without folding up."

"They are not color blind, either. If you try to color the news to achieve any purpose, they will reject it."

Returning to his position as publisher of the Morning Croonian in Portland, Hoyt said his six months in Washington had convinced him "more firmly than ever of the need for continuing the domestic branch of OWI as a vital war function."

GENEVA'S FIRST FURNACE OPENED

PROVO, Utah, Jan. 4 (AP)—A war construction project was reached last night when the first of three 1,200-hp blast furnaces at the \$100,000,000 Geneva steel plant was activated.

The furnace was "blown in" at ceremonies witnessed by War Relocation Authority officials and the U. S. Steel Corp. officials, who constructed and will operate the government-owned plant.

Ground was broken for the project, described as the defense plant corporation's largest western project, only 20 months ago. Two other blast furnaces are expected to be ready for operation within a few months for the production of pig iron.

Feet D. Nielsen, plant superintendent, said the first of line open hearth furnaces will be put into operation around Feb. 1. When complete, the plant will turn out iron and convert it into steel for use by the west coast ship building industry.
